Rtn Dr. Vatsal Mehta, as the lead doctor during the mega medical check-up camp on Sept 20, 2024, at the Government Polytechnic for Girls, documented key findings from the health screenings. His insights will be invaluable in understanding the specific health needs of the young women in attendance, helping to shape and improve future health initiatives for their well-being within the community.

MEDICAL CAMP: FINDINGS

A comprehensive health screening was conducted, at the Government Girls Polytechnic College in Ahmedabad, focusing on hemoglobin levels among female students. This assessment revealed a substantial prevalence of anemia, necessitating immediate nutritional and medical interventions by students, parents, and the college administration to improve the health outcomes of the student population.

The distribution of hemoglobin levels among the students is as follows:

Severely Low (7–8 g/dL): 7.7%
Moderately Low (8–10 g/dL): 32.1%
Mildly Low (10–12 g/dL): 54.2%
Healthy (Greater than 12 g/dL): 6.0%

The data indicate that 39.8% of the students exhibit hemoglobin levels below 10 g/dL, a range often associated with clinical anemia. A minority, 6%, fall within the optimal range with hemoglobin levels exceeding 12 g/dL, underscoring a widespread issue with low hemoglobin levels among the cohort. This finding signals an urgent requirement for enhanced nutritional awareness, dietary improvements, and potential supplementation.

Additional assessments included screening for fatty liver. The results showed no major concerns; however:

Confirmed Fatty Liver Cases: 2 students

Borderline Fatty Liver Cases: Approximately 8–10 students require dietary modifications and ongoing monitoring to prevent progression to clinical fatty liver disease.

Recommendations: I am offering complimentary follow-up consultations for the 2 students with confirmed fatty liver cases to ensure appropriate dietary and lifestyle adjustments. Furthermore, students with borderline findings should be advised on preventive measures, particularly around dietary modifications to mitigate risks.

Conclusion: The findings from this health check-up highlight a pressing need for collaborative health promotion efforts among students, parents, and the college administration.
