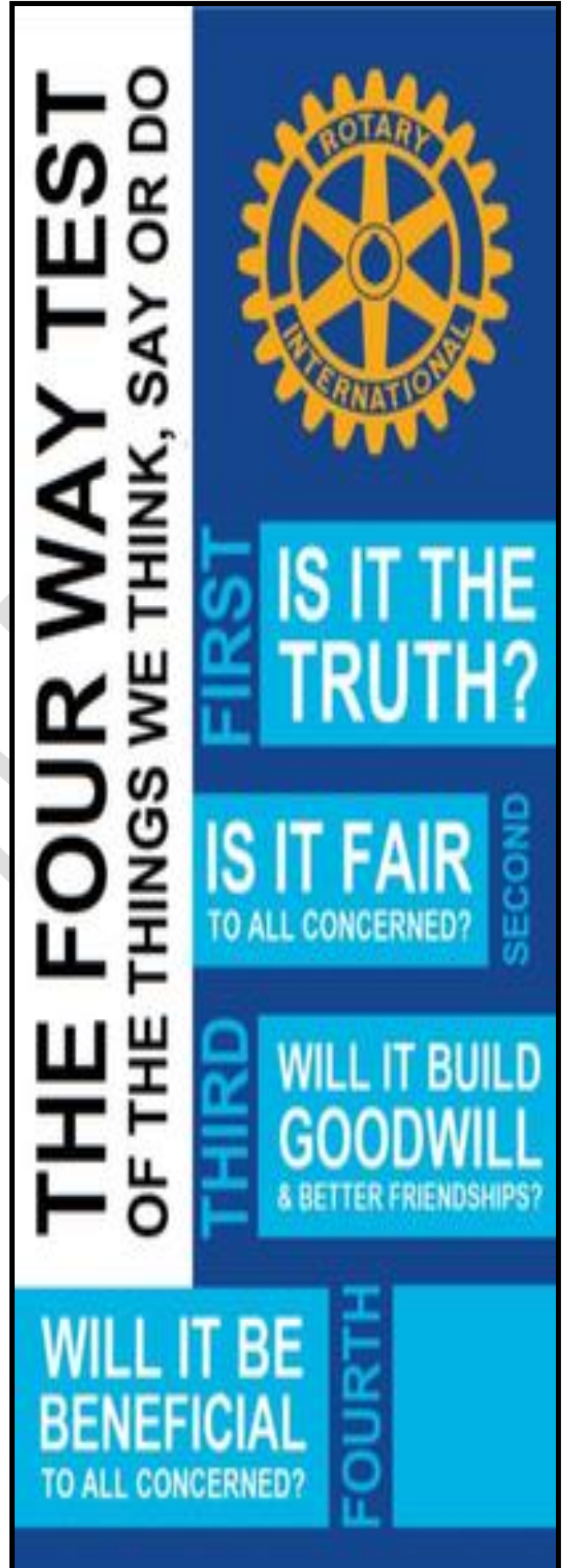

Be it as a Girl Guide in school years, and as a NCC cadet during College, she has participated in many social cause based projects, blood donation being one of them. Know the RI President Gordon R. McNally

Gordon R. McNally a member of the Rotary Club of South Queensferry, West Lothian, Scotland, is the President of Rotary International for 2023-24. McNally, a graduate of dental surgery at the University of Dundee, owned and operated his own dental practice in Edinburgh. He was the chair of the East of Scotland branch of the British Paedodontic Society and has held various academic positions. He has also served as a Presbytery elder, chair of Queensferry Parish Congregational Board, and commissioner to the church's general assembly.



A Rotary member since 1984, McNally has been president and vice president of Rotary International in Great Britain and Ireland. He has also served Rotary International as a director and as member or chair of several committees. He was advisor to the 2022 Houston Convention Committee and chair of the Operations Review Committee. McNally and his wife, Heather, are Major Donors and Benefactors of The Rotary Foundation. They are also members of the Bequest Society.

McNally lauded Rotary's ability to adapt technologically during the COVID-19 pandemic, saying the approach should continue and be combined with the best of our past practices as Rotary seeks to grow and increase engagement. "We have learned there is a willingness within communities to care for one another," he says, "and we must ensure that we encourage people who have recently embraced the concept of volunteering to join us to allow them to continue giving service."

McNally says "Membership is the lifeblood of our organization. I would encourage the use of the flexibility now available to establish new-style clubs that would appeal to a different demographic."

The best way to increase membership is engagement, according to McNally. To better support clubs, he says, Rotary International, regional leaders, and district teams all need to engage with them. Engagement through social media will reinforce Rotary's brand and showcase the opportunities that come with it. And, he says, engagement with governments, corporations, and other organizations will lead to meaningful partnerships." With better engagement, McNally says, "We will grow Rotary both by way of membership and in our ability to provide meaningful service."

McNally's presidential theme for 2023-24 is "Create Hope in the World" which he revealed during the Rotary International Assembly in Orlando, Florida, USA, on 9th January. He urged members to promote peace in troubled nations, help those affected by conflict, and maintain the momentum of initiatives begun by past leaders.

"The goal is to restore hope - to help the world heal from destructive conflicts and, in turn, to help us achieve lasting change for ourselves," McNally said at Rotary's annual training event for incoming district governors. He called for members to capture the world's attention and lead the way toward possibilities far beyond our current expectations. "This is how Rotary brings lasting change to the world," he added, "one restored or newly created hope at a time."

A significant way to bring hope to the world is to put a greater emphasis on peace. "Peace is the soil where hope takes root," McNally said.

Outgoing President Dr. Suresh Bhake's Address

I welcome all in this august gathering & great evening of Installation of new team of Rotary Club Nagpur Fort (2023-24). We are proud Fortians existing for last 23 years in Nagpur and shortly going to complete 25 years of existence with fruitful service to the humanity with all 7 areas of Rotary functioning. Let me tell you RCNF storey of the Rotary year 2022-23. To start with in the acceptance speech as President of RCNF, I had focused on theme



'Imagine Rotary' by Immediate past R. I. President (22-23) Jennifer John. In this area we have experimented with fellowship development by visiting Ashta (8) Ganesh of Vidarbha region having mythological, historical importance. They are the tourist places coming up in the region supported by Govt. in its development. The very reason of visiting was expose Rotarians to tourist places near about Nagpur and to appreciate Archeological and mythological value. BY visiting Fortians appreciated natural beauty and clean environment being out of city. In the process Fortians interacted with local village people, try to understand their needs & found out solutions with four way test approach. It has built strong fellowship amongst Fortians and acted as PR (Public Relation) activity.

To promote business after pandemic period we had formed Rotary International Fellowship Group called Rotary Means Business (RMB). The background behind promotion of this group is that Rotarians are leaders in their profession with high ethical values. So we should help each other in success to business by referring. In this area RCNF is the pioneer club in Nagpur City who had taken the lead. RMB Nagpur is a registered chapter now and this activity is also expanded to other clubs in Nagpur and 225 members were benefited. This was also an activity in true sence with "Imagine Rotary".

We had tried our best for bringing out Club RCNF back together after Pandemic period. We had conducted Regular Physical Meetings including BoDs. All 12 BoD meetings were hosted by the different Directors.

All 24 regular meetings including Installation, OCV, Charter Night & AGM were physical. The breakup of meetings - 14 meetings were held Maharashtra Rashtrashabha Hall, 4 meetings in Institute of engineers Hall, Installation of Jog Centre, OCV at Sai Sabhagruha, Charter Night at Strawberry Farm, out of the way one meeting of village Soit in Chandrapur district and one meeting was combine with RCNC for "Grand Garden Show".

As usual, during the year 2022-23, RCNF showed presence in Dist. Seminars & Dist. Conference. To begin with, President had attended PET/SET at Jalgaon, for inputs of Rotary. We were having our representation in TRF Seminar, Public Image & Community Services Seminar, Members Orientation Seminar & Vocational Services & Membership Seminar. Dist. Conference at Shegaon and **Grand Gorden Show** at Nagpur was also properly represented by RCNF.

"Prerana", overall development of children of slum dwellers at Antar Bharati Ashram, Khamla, was a life changing continued community service project of RCNF. This was a yearlong project, on every Saturday and target children were from class 1st to 9th standard. Number of Rotarians, their anns and

other outsiders were involved. There was sea change in confidence level of children and there was improvement in basic education of children.

RCNF had not lagged behind in Medical Community Service Project. We had selected Wadi, Near Nagpur on Amravati Road as our target area to serve the humanity by executing health camp for citizen of the area Eye Checkup camp for Students of the area and Truck Drivers & Cleaners residing by the area. Sarakshri Netralaya and Get-Well Hospital with local community were the partners for execution the medical project. In addition to above, Art of living and Madhav Netralaya were our partners in Eye Checkup camp at Kohari-Sawanga village about 80 kms from Nagpur near Katol, Dist. Nagpur. Similarly, Children Health Camp at Ashwini Mahavidyalaya, Bina Sangam was a successful medical project in partnership with Sarakshi Netralaya, Academic of Pediatrics, Vatsalya Child Welfare Laboratories,Alabama Foundation & Vicco Laboratories.

We have continued the legacy of RCNF by executing some of the project taken up earlier by my predecessors. Among the best was Physical Lecture Series on different topics of interest , either by our club members or outside renowned speakers, in the meetings to increase the interest of Rotarians in regular fortnightly meetings. Sometimes, we have moved to outside the meetings venue and joined hand with other organisations for this activity or called other organisations to deliver informative lecturers for the benefit of members. Likewise 24 lectures on different topics were relished by our members during the year 2022-23. This shows intellectual activity of our members.

To remain healthy, bodily and mind wise, we have undertaken walks for club health during fair reason, to promote morning walks for members and community. This was also fellowship and PR activity for Rotary Club. **Sneh-Jyoti** (felicitation of Heros of Society and express our gratitude towards their noble cause) was a brain child of our Past-President which was continued this year by felicitation of Police, Defence, Army personnels, social workers to boost up their moral to continue with and recognising them to be followed by others as role models to serve the society. In this project we had felicitated police personnel working in Bajaj Nagar Police Station, that too on Raksha Bandhan Day, Army personnel at Sitabuldi Fort on Republic Day, Renounced social workers Dr. Prakash Amte and Dr. Vikas Amte for their distinguished service to mankind.

We every year established a "Pyau" i.e. cold drinking water for street goers in summer season. That was established on West High Court Road, Civil Lines, Nagpur.

To, promote healthy game like Badminton, we go for Tournament every year. The tournament was held at Sawarkar Nagar Municipal Corporation Hall, and there was quite an enthusiasm of participants from different groups of players to exhibit their game. This was also an activity started by one of our past President and RCNF is known in this field from last 2 years. Every year regular activity for saving the Environmental, trees were planted at different locations in Nagpur.

One Rotaract Club & three Interact Clubs were installed by RCNF as planned for the year and participated in their activities. Some of the continued projects could not be taken up this year because of various reasons mainly, "Sakshani" - Corrective Orthopedic Surgeries of Children and "Cyclothon - our flagship project. The digital magazine of RCNF "Vision Fort" was bought out this year also with the improvement as multilingual. The frequency bringing out was changed to quarterly from Jan, 2023 onwards.

Keeping all this background in view, I am happy to announce that Rotary International Citation was earned by RCNF in this year 2022-23. R. I. has recognised RCNF for completing the goals as envisaged in the beginning of the year.

I would like to extend my sincere thanks to each and everyone of you. In future also I am available to RCNF for any kind of service. Once again accept my sincere thanks to each one of you.

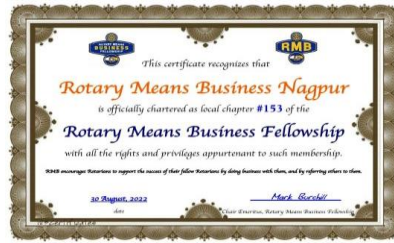

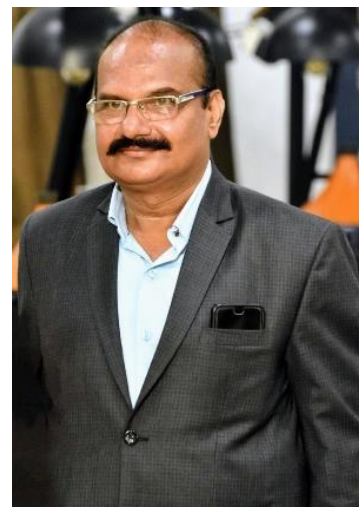

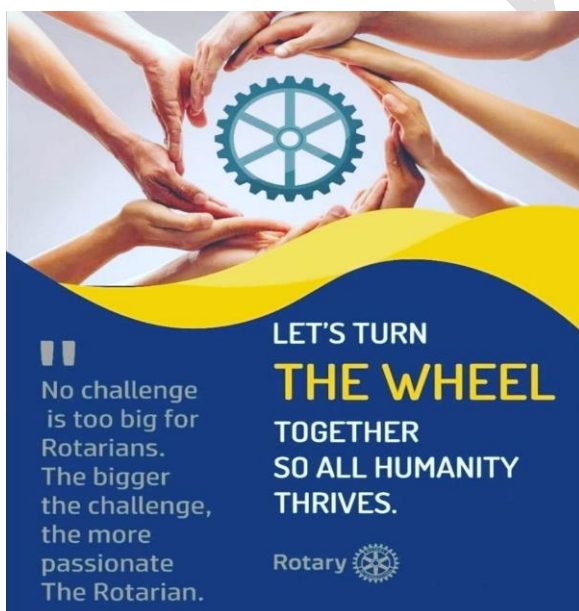
