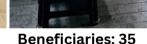


THERMAL BREAST SCREENING CAMP

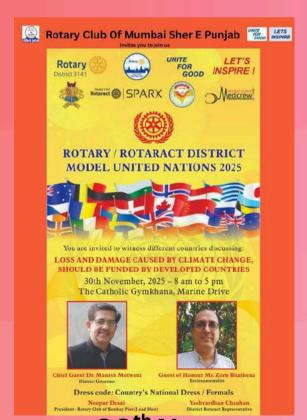

AASHAYEIN Vaastu Corner

VASTU FOR WATER TANKS

1. Overhead Water Tank (on terrace / roof)

Best direction: South-West (SW)

This direction gives stability and supports the house with strong positive energy.

Avoid:

- X North-East (NE) causes financial and health issues
- X South-East (SE) may lead to stress or fire-related imbalance
- X North-West (NW) can create instability or frequent repairs

Height Tip:

Overhead tank should be heavier and placed higher than the rest of the roof for good Vastu balance.

2. Underground Water Tank / Borewell

Best direction: North-East (NE)

This is the zone of water and purity in Vastu, believed to bring prosperity and peace.

Also acceptable:

- ✓ North
- ✓ East

Avoid:

South-West, South, or South-East – may cause financial and personal difficulties.

Quick Summary

Overhead tank: South-West Underground tank: North-East Avoid mixing the two zones.

Flavours of Fellowship

SPANEER SAMOSA□

Ingredients

For Filling
200 g paneer (crumbled)
1 onion (chopped)
1 tsp red chilli powder
½ tsp turmeric
½ tsp garam masala
Salt to taste
1 tbsp oil

For Samosa
Ready-made samosa pattis
or
2 cups maida + water (if making dough)
Oil for frying



Method

1. Make the Paneer Filling

Heat 1 tbsp oil in a pan.

Add onion and fry for 1 minute.

Add paneer, chilli powder, turmeric, garam masala, and salt.

Mix well and cook for 2–3 minutes.

Turn off gas and let it cool.

2. Fill the Samosa
Take one samosa patti.
Fold it into a cone shape.
Fill 1–2 spoonfuls of paneer stuffing inside.
Seal the edges with a little water.

3. Fry

Heat oil on medium flame.

Fry samosas till golden and crispy.

Remove and place on tissue paper.

Ready!

Serve hot with ketchup or green chutney.

Paneer samosas are actually a modern twist to the traditional samosa.

Many say paneer samosas were first created by accident, when leftover paneer bhurji was stuffed into samosa pattis to avoid wastage—and the experiment became a hit!

Today, paneer samosas are especially popular in Mumbai tea stalls and bakeries, loved by children for their soft, mildly spiced filling. And here's the best part—compared to many fried snacks, paneer samosas are slightly healthier because paneer is rich in protein and calcium.

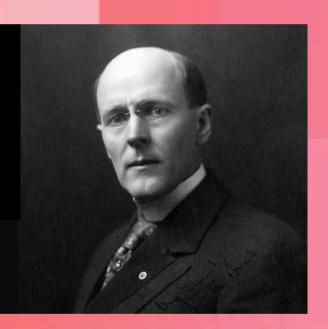
