# **AASHAYEIN Vaastu Corner**

#### **FALSE CEILING**

A Vastu-compliant false ceiling design should be symmetrical, use light colors, and maintain a uniform height of approximately 10 feet. Avoid irregular shapes, sloping designs and hanging mirrors or artwork on the ceiling.

A simple, clean design with ambient lighting is recommended.

In Vaastu, it is advisable to keep the false ceiling high enough so the room doesn't feel heavy or cramped, ideally with a total height of 9 ft or more. Very low false ceilings should be avoided directly over the bed, study table, or dining table, as they create a sense of heaviness and are considered inauspicious.

For directions, the North, East, and North-East (Ishanya) zones should have a simple, higher and lighter ceiling, avoiding heavy, thick drops, massive beams or bulky AC units in the NE corner.

Heavier designs such as thicker panels and wooden elements are better placed in the South, West and South-West zones and if there is any slope in the ceiling, it is preferable to keep it higher towards the North/East and slightly lower towards the South/West.

### 🐸 TOMATO SOUP 😋



#### Ingredients (Serves 3-4)

- Tomatoes 6 medium (about 600–700 g), roughly chopped
- Onion 1 medium, chopped
- Garlic 3-4 cloves, chopped
- Carrot 1 small, chopped (optional, for sweetness)
- Butter or oil 1 tbsp
- Water or vegetable stock 2 to 21/2 cups
- Salt to taste
- Black pepper ½-1 tsp (freshly ground if possible)
- Sugar ½-1 tsp (optional, to balance acidity)
- Fresh cream 2–3 tbsp (optional, for richness)
- Fresh coriander or basil leaves for garnish

#### Method

- Sauté the base in a pan, heat butter/oil.
- Add chopped onion and garlic; sauté till soft and slightly translucent.
- Add chopped carrot (if using) and cook for 2-3 minutes.
- Cook the tomatoes
- Add chopped tomatoes and a pinch of salt.
- Cook on medium heat for 5–7 minutes till tomatoes turn soft and mushy.
   Simmer
- Add 2-2½ cups water/stock, mix well.
- Cover and simmer for about 10-15 minutes.
- Switch off the gas and let it cool slightly.
   Blend
- Use a hand blender directly in the pan, or transfer to a mixer and blend until smooth.
- Strain the soup through a sieve for a silky texture (optional but nice).
- · Season & finish
- Return the strained soup to the pan.
- Add salt, black pepper, and sugar (if needed).
- Bring to a gentle boil; adjust consistency with a little water if it's too thick.
- Stir in fresh cream at the end (don't boil too much after adding cream).

  Serve
- Garnish with coriander/basil and a swirl of cream or a small cube of butter.
- Serve hot with toasted bread, croutons, or grilled cheese sandwich


