

Want to be the Best? - Practice the Four-Way Test (By Rtn. Jotinder Singh Ahluwalia)

Background: Herbert Taylor created the Four-Way Test in 1932, during the Great Depression to save his struggling company, Club Aluminium Products. By applying the principles of the test, he fostered a culture of honesty, fairness, goodwill, and mutual benefit, ultimately leading his company to prosperity. This Test was adopted by Rotary in 1943 by Paul Harris, the Founder of Rotary International. The Four-Way Test has been translated into more than a hundred languages and has established itself, as the most widely printed and quoted statements of ethics, across the world.

<u>The Test:</u> The Four-Way Test consists of four questions that we ask ourselves in everything we think, say, or do: Let's explore why these questions are so significant and how they can shape our personal and professional lives:

1) Is it the TRUTH? - क्या यह सत्य है?

In a world where misinformation is rampant, seeking the truth is more important than ever. Being truthful builds trust and credibility, both essential in leadership and personal relationships. Truth forms the foundation of integrity and ethical behavior.

<u>Indian context:</u> The essence of this test is summarised in "Satyameva Jayate" meaning "Truth alone triumphs", which is a part of the age-old scripture "Mundaka Upanishad" and is also inscribed on one side of all Indian currency. Mahatma Gandhi, our father of nation, also practised and preached the principle of "Truth is God".

2) Is it FAIR to all concerned? - क्या यह सभी संबंधित लोगों के लिए न्यायसंगत है?

Fairness fosters respect and equality. When we ensure that our actions are fair, we create environments where everyone feels valued and respected. This question encourages us to consider the impact of our actions on others, promoting justice and equity. Some of the sub-questions to check if we are being fair are:

a) Are we playing by the rules? (Legal, Statutory, Society norms etc) b) Do we think how our actions will affect others? c) Do we actively listen to stakeholders with an open mind? d) Do we indulge in blame-game for our own mistakes? e) Do we take advantage of other people? f) Do we practice favouritism?

<u>Indian context</u>: Within our political ecosystem, terms most frequently used by political parties include - "Parivaarvaad", "Bhai-Bhatija vaad" etc. While exercising our electoral polling right, we may apply this rule to have greater clarity on identifying the most-fair party. In corporate sector, the companies that are known for being fair, earn the trust of their stakeholders, resulting in greater growth, profits and performance excellence.

3) Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS? - क्या इससे सद्भावना और बेहतर मित्रता का निर्माण होगा?

Goodwill and strong friendships are the bedrock of a harmonious society. By striving to build positive relationships, we create networks of support and collaboration. This principle reminds us to act with kindness, fostering connections that uplift and inspire.

<u>Indian context</u>: Today, we all are witnessing the enviable economic growth of India, Our Honourable PM - Narendra Modi ji, advocates the concept of becoming "VISHWA MITRA" and has friendly relationships with most of the countries of the world, despite the world being split into multiple factions. This policy has earned him the reputation of becoming the most popular political figure in the world.

4) Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned? - क्या यह सभी संबंधित लोगों के लिए लाभकारी होगा?

This final question urges us to think beyond ourselves (Service above Self) and consider the broader impact of our actions. Decisions that benefit everyone lead to sustainable success and collective well-being. This mindset helps us contribute positively to our communities and the world at large.

<u>Indian context</u>: Historically, the companies that earned the most profit, were termed as most successful. The modern concept of Business Excellence negates this. Today, the company, that serves its stakeholders (customers, employees, society, suppliers, Government, partners etc) and provided them with the highest benefits and value-adds, end up being on the highest pedestal of Business Excellence. The concept of "Sabka Saath - Sabka Vikaas -Sabka Vishwas" summarises the understanding of this rule.

Conclusion: The Four-Way Test is more than just a set of questions; **it's a way of life.** By incorporating these principles into our daily routines, we cultivate a habit of **ethical decision-making and leadership**, that helps us navigate challenges with integrity and compassion. These principles can be integrated into both professional and personal lives. As Rotarians, embracing the 4-Way Test will not only guide us to success but also ensure that our achievements are built on a foundation of trust, fairness, goodwill, and mutual benefit.
