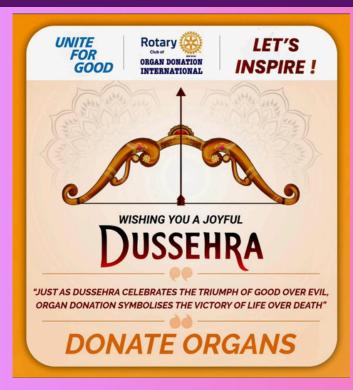


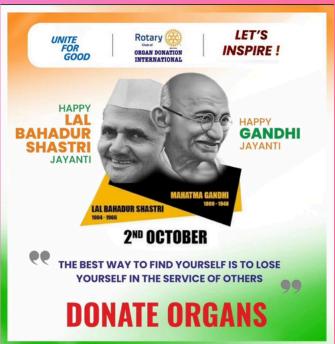

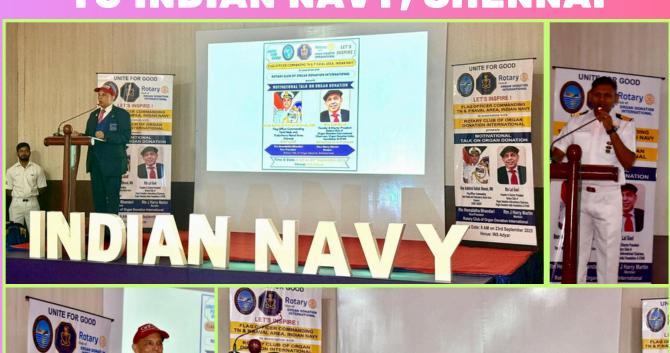
Rotarian Goel also noted Tamil Nadu's pioneering role in India's organ transplantation history, stating that the country's first organ transplant procedure took place in the state.

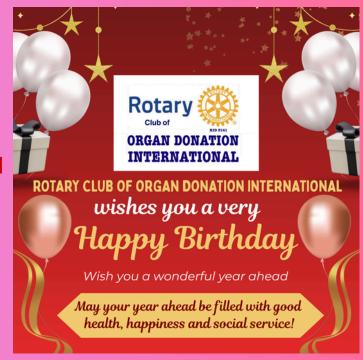

HEALTHY FOOD -HEALTHY ORGANS

Healthy Instant Pickle Recipe

- Rtn Ruby Agarwal

Fresh Ingredients:

- 2 tablespoons freshly grated ginger
- 2 tablespoons freshly grated mango ginger (amba haldi)
- 2 tablespoons freshly grated turmeric root
- 4 tablespoons freshly squeezed lemon juice (adjust to taste)

Spices:

- 1 teaspoon methi (fenugreek) seeds, lightly crushed
- 6-8 black peppercorns, coarsely crushed
- 4-5 whole cloves
- 1/4 teaspoon hing (asafoetida)
- 1/4 teaspoon cinnamon powder
- 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg powder
- Salt to taste (adjust for preservation)

Instructions

- 1. Prepare the ginger mixture: In a clean, dry glass bowl, combine the freshly grated ginger, mango ginger, and turmeric root.
- 2. Add spices: Mix in the crushed methi seeds, black peppercorns, cloves, hing, cinnamon, nutmeg, and mace. Stir well to distribute evenly.
- 3. Season: Add salt to taste, keeping in mind that adequate salt helps preserve the pickle.
- 4. Add lemon juice: Pour in the freshly squeezed lemon juice and mix thoroughly until all ingredients are well combined.
- 5. Rest: Let the mixture sit for at least 24 hours in the refrigerator to allow flavours to meld.

Storage & Serving

- Storage: Transfer to a clean, sterilised glass jar with an airtight lid. Store in the refrigerator for up to 2-3 weeks.
- Serving: Enjoy 1-2 teaspoons daily with meals as a digestive aid and flavour enhancer.
- Optional sun-drying: After the 24-hour soaking period, spread on a clean cloth in direct sunlight for 2-3 days to intensify flavours and extend shelf life.

Health Benefits: This pickle is rich in antioxidants, aids digestion, and has antiinflammatory properties from the fresh turmeric and ginger.
