## TEACHER TO TEACHER!

Ten years after my retirement, I was happy to be back to my natural habitat – the classroom! Only this time, I was addressing not a class of students, but of teachers of Thakur Public School, in a teacher-

training session entitled “Grammar can be Fun”. The presentation was inspired by my grandchildren, who could not see the point of the grammar class, when they already knew how to speak English correctly! Our educational system still engages in the outmoded practice of teaching and assessing grammatical uses in isolated sentences, thanks to Wren and Martin, who should long ago have

been flung into the dustbin of history. Effective grammar teaching requires contextualization. It can serve as a skill development in communication only when students are encouraged to question relevance and urged to deploy in creative and innovative situations. Grammatical functions also need to be applied to the spoken language, where voice modulations and body language deepen their impact.

I give below an example of mechanical learning:

Active Voice: The cat killed the rat.

Passive Voice: The rat was killed by the cat.

Did we ever as students ask, “But ma’am, why do I have to learn to say, ‘the rat was killed by the cat’ when I can always say, ‘the cat killed the rat’”?

This was one of the issues addressed in the presentation.

### Active and Passive Voice

- Ram kicked the ball.
- The ball was kicked by Ram.



### My first recommendation:

The teacher should see herself, not just as a giver of knowledge, but also as a performing artist.

## NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK?

**InspireIndia:** A Youth-Led Campaign from Mumbai That has been Picking Up Considerable

**Momentum:** InspireIndia is a political literacy campaign that relies on the active participation of the youth. The group brands itself as not just an ordinary campaign but a community that spreads political literacy and then mobilises the youth into direct impact. Currently operational in Mumbai, Bengaluru, Pune, and Thane, they intend to be fully functional in six cities with teams in Delhi and Kolkata by the end of 2024.

The modern political landscape has found itself disconnected from the youth. Now, more than ever, they need access to unbiased information to draw their opinions and knowledge on how to contribute to solving pressing issues and disparities in the country. Despite possessing sufficient resources, the youth lack clarity on how to navigate themselves in this landscape. InspireIndia aims to fix this by providing a forum for the youth to have open discourse and dialogue on

the country's pressing issues and take joint action based on the deliberated solutions to take action backed by informed decisions.

In their pursuit of spreading political literacy, InspireIndia executes multiple impactful projects ranging from student journalism, podcasts, interviews, workshops, summits and on-ground direct impact projects. These initiatives are designed to create a national forum for the youth of this country to collaborate on joint causes and foster the feeling of community, thereby fostering a sense of progress and change.

In just three months, InspireIndia has gained considerable support across India, spread literacy, and consequently impacted lives considerably. When asked about their plans for 2024, co-founders Siddhant More and Dheer Kulkarni stated they plan on adopting a village, expanding to a team of 200 volunteers, and impacting 5000 lives by the end of the year.
