

Fort Competition at Regency Estate: Celebrating Culture and Community

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




District Governor Nominee Designate Rtn Chandrahas Shetty

1. Background and Rotary Journey

I joined the Rotary Club of Thane North End, then part of RI District 3140, in July 1995, invited by my friend Vilas Prabhulkar. I was drawn to Rotary by its emphasis on fellowship and the opportunity to meet members from diverse professional backgrounds like bankers, CEOs, restaurateurs, builders, and more. Service, though vital, often felt like a byproduct of these meaningful interactions. My background as a "salesman turned businessman" quickly helped me integrate into the club, leading me to become involved in impactful projects such as the Pankhanda village adoption, Polio Vaccination drives, and tree plantation initiatives, etc.,

My journey in Rotary progressed rapidly. I became a Secretary in 1998–1999 and then President in 1999–2000, under PDG Rajkumar Bagadia. I was later privileged to work with several distinguished PDGs, including Kumar Kewalramani, Gulam Vahanavaty, Nitin Mangaldas, Rahul Timbadia, Dr. Bharat Pandya, Dr. Ulhas Kolhatkar, and Raju Subramaniam, contributing to various avenues of service as District Chair. After District 3140 split into 3141 and 3142, I continued my work with PDGs like Dr. Ashes Ganguly, Dr. Mohan Chandavarkar, Dr. Sandeep Kadam, Dr. Mayuresh Warke, and Kailash Jethani, as well as DG Dinesh Mehta in roles such as AT, AG, AC, DS, and DAFSC. I am honoured to have been elected as DGND and look forward to leading the district in the future.











2. Professional Insights

My career began with a supplier of analytical instruments, providing imported equipment for quality control and research applications in various industries, including pharmaceuticals, chemicals, food, and environmental sciences. These instruments enhance product quality, reduce costs, lower pollution, and support sustainable innovation. Working with multinational corporations and interacting with esteemed scientists has been instrumental in my professional and personal growth.

3. Memorable Experiences

While Rotary offers countless memorable projects, some stand out vividly. One is a mega medical camp organized by PP Dr. Govind Patkar in 1997 at the village of Ovala, attended by over 600 villagers. Managing the crowd and directing them to various health check-up sections was a challenging yet rewarding task.

Another lasting memory is from the annual Pulse Polio drives, which I participated in since 1995. These drives involved not only administering vaccines but also conducting surveillance visits with government officials to ensure every child was reached. Engaging with young children, encouraging them to open their mouths, and vaccinating them was a significant experience, especially in a time when polio was still prevalent in India.

As Avenue Chair, I also led a remarkable project in 2002-03: the adoption of railway stations by Rotary clubs in District 3140. Clubs provided benches, clocks, electronic indicators, waste bins, and water coolers across Central and Western Railway stations, enhancing public amenities for daily commuters. This project, blending community service and public relations, remains one of my unforgettable achievements.

More recently, I have focused on administrative roles at the district level, supporting newly formed clubs as AG, creating an e-directory and publishing e-GML during the "Smile" year as DS, and raising funds for TRF. These activities continue to be fulfilling.





4. Challenges and Solutions

Rotary is a dynamic, action-oriented organization, and working alongside diverse leaders can sometimes lead to differences in opinion, creating strain. I believe the solution lies in listening to all suggestions and building consensus around the best ideas. Engaging members in activities aligned with their interests also helps reduce friction, as everyone has a role to play. While these principles are not always easy to apply, they are essential to fostering harmony and productivity.

5. Community Impact

I've had the privilege of contributing to many impactful community initiatives through Rotary. For example, we previously ran an adult literacy program for parents of children from economically disadvantaged backgrounds. Over a year and a half ago, one of the parents came to thank us, sharing how the program had benefited her and her family. While not all projects are continued year after year, the lasting impact of such efforts is deeply gratifying.

6. Family and Rotary

My family has been consistently supportive of my Rotary journey. My wife, Bharti, joined Rotary a few years back, and my daughter was also a Rotaractor for a couple of years before her studies required more focus. They frequently assist with my district responsibilities, making this journey a shared endeavour.









7. Vision for the Future

I am thrilled to be elected DGND, as it gives me the chance to pursue my vision of deepening engagement Rotary within clubs. Currently, only about 20of actively 30% members participate in club activities. My goal is to inspire more members to be involved, fostering a more engaged and vibrant Rotary community.

8. Personal Insights

In my free time, I enjoy traveling, singing, and watching movies and documentaries, all of which help me relax and stay rejuvenated.
