Our Club has adopted Dharavi Schools to support the 602 students of 10th grade in their exam preparation. Through district help we have tiedup with one mobile application platform which can support the 10th students in their preparation for exams. Mobile application were made available to 602 students of above school free of cost. This mobile application has Q&A, preparation sheets of all subjects for the 10th exam in both English and Marathi. This is made with help of professional teachers & educators. The Idea is that these students can learn and prepare themselves while school is on leaves. They get their answers available with them whenever they need instead of waiting for schools to open and teachers available.

Each Mobile app download costing Rs. 1500/- plus GST however the same were made available to us @65/- only through district effort. Total value of the Project is worth 1065540/- . Special thanks to our Rotarian Dr. Nagendra Sardespande for supporting the entire project.
