The Magic of Rotary is belonging, a feeling that appears when you least expect it.

Earlier this year, I was in Slovakia serving as a president's representative during a sixweek trip through Europe. When I wrote to Katarina Cechova, governor of District 2240 at the time, I mentioned that my grandmother Veronica Zilka grew up in a small village in the area before settling in the U.S.

It wasn't long before Cechova tracked down my grandmother's village, Jakubova Vol'a. She even organized a visit for me, where I received an unforgettable Slovakian welcome.

When I entered the community center of Jakubova Vol'a, a small crowd of people dressed in traditional Slovakian clothing greeted me. They sang with beautiful and powerful Central European voices that reminded me of my grandmother.

A lot of families play cards or games when they get together. When I was young, my father would pick up his accordion and lead my family in song. My grandmother would sing along with her impressive voice.

When I walked into the community center and heard traditional music from my childhood — when I saw a woman play the accordion the way my dad played — I suddenly felt like a little girl sitting at my grandmother's house in Monessen, Pennsylvania. I burst into tears of joy at the memories.

But the magic didn't stop there. District Governor Cechova really outdid herself. A local genealogist worked with a videographer to make a short film about my grandmother. We watched the video together in the community center. When the video ended, I turned around and saw a man standing in the back of the room. I quickly learned that this stranger, Frantisek Zilka, was my second cousin. His grandmother and mine had been sisters. I felt like I had been struck by lightning.

I visited my newfound cousin's home, which happens to be the home where my grandmother was born. There, he shared old photographs I had never seen of my dad, my uncle, and my grandmother. Since then, I can't stop thinking about my family of Rotary. When I refer to you as my family, I'm not just being kind. I really think of everyone in Rotary as my family. But I never would have imagined that my Rotary family would introduce me to long-lost personal family. Sitting and listening to traditional Slovakian music from my childhood filled me with joy and a profound sense of belonging. I am so grateful to District Governor Cechova and everyone who helped create that magical experience.

As members of Rotary, we have a unique opportunity to share the same magic with each other and with the world. I encourage you to consider how you can help spread that magic and ensure other members of your club — other members of our Rotary family — feel like they truly belong.


Dear RCNV family,






#### Regular Meeting - IYE Presentation - 16th August 2024

### Vocational Training at Parekh Jewellers - 23rd August 2024



## HEALTHY DIET TIPS

Eating a healthy , well balanced diet is one of the most important things you can do to protect your health. In fact , 80% of premature heart disease and stroke can be prevented through your life choices and habits , such as eating a healthy diet and being physically active.

#### SIMPLE TIPS TO STAY HEALTHY

**Stay Hydrated** – Drinking water at short intervals will leave you feeling full , preventing you from overeating.

**Portion Control** — Portion control can help you keep a check on the intake of extra calories. Take smaller portions on the plate and avoid refilling it again.

**Focus on Food Rich in Dietary Fibre-** Fibre leaves you feeling full without causing you gain weight. Eg.-Vegetables, salads, fruits, dal, whole grains etc.

Eat Before You Head Out - Eat something like a fruit or a small meal before going to a party.

**Avoid Fasting the Whole Day before Going to the Party** — Fasting the whole day doesn't help to control theintake,instead would make you overeat.

**Start Your Meal with a Liquid Beverage** – Liquid beverages like soup , buttermilk , lemon water etc. helps to reduce the appetite. Avoid sugar-laden beverages like soft drinks etc.

**Start Eating with a Protein Option** – Protein helps in better satiety. Eg.- Paneer tikka , grilled chicken , sprouts , dal , curd , buttermilk etc.

Opt for Roasted Snacks Instead of Deep Fried Ones — Have roasted snacks like Chana , Makhana , Roasted Ragi Chips , Roasted Jower Puffs , Barley Puffs etc. Avoid fried snacks like besan sev ,mathri , namkeen , chakli etc. Opt for Milk Based Desserts Over Deep Fried Ones - In case having dessert Opt. for rasogulla , kheer , custard ( in small portion ) instead of deep fried one like gulab jamun , jalebi etc.

**Regular Exercise / Walk -** Minimum 30 mins of walk / exercise could help you maintain your weight.

Last but not the least, consistency with which you make healthy choices throughout the year decides the fate of your overall good health.





## THE ABC's OF ROTARY

#### **GROUP STUDY EXCHANGE**

One of the most popular and rewarding programs of The Rotary Foundation is the Group Study Exchange. Since the first exchange between districts in California and Japan in 1965, the program has provided educational experiences for more than 20,000 young business and professional men and women who have served on about 4,600 teams. The GSE program pairs Rotary districts to send and receive study teams. In the past 25 years, over \$40 million has been allocated by The Rotary Foundation for Group Study Exchange grants.

#### PAUL HARRIS FELLOWS

Undoubtedly the most important step to promote voluntary giving to The Rotary Foundation occurred in 1957, when the idea of Paul Harris Fellow recognition was first proposed. Although the concept of making \$1,000 gifts to the Foundation was slow in developing, by the early 1970s the program began to gain popularity. The distinctive Paul Harris Fellow medallion, lapel pin and attractive certificate have become highly respected symbols of a substantial financial commitment to The Rotary Foundation by Rotarians and friends around the world.

#### SPECIAL ROTARY OBSERVANCES

☐ January is Rotary Awareness Month. This is a time to expand knowledge of Rotary and its activities among our membership and throughout the community.

☐ February is designated as World Understanding Month. This month was chosen because it includes the birthday of Rotary International, February 23. During the month, Rotary clubs are urged to present programs which promote international understanding and goodwill, as well as launch World Community Service projects in other parts of the world.

☐World Rotaract Week is the week in which March 13 falls. It's a time when Rotary clubs and districts highlight Rotaract by joining in projects with their Rotaract clubs.

□ April is set aside as Magazine Month. Throughout the month, clubs arrange programs and activities which promote the reading and use of THE ROTARIAN magazine and the official regional magazines of Rotary.

Dune is Fellowships Month, a time to increase interest and membership in one of the dozens of Rotary Fellowships and celebrate the ideal of service through common hobbies and professions.

□uly is Literacy Month, a time for clubs to develop their own literacy projects, as well as raise awareness of Rotarians' efforts worldwide to eradicate illiteracy. □August is Membership and Extension Month, a time to focus on Rotary's continuing need for growth, to seek new members and form new clubs.

September is Youth Activities Month. Rotary clubs of the world give special emphasis to the many Rotarysponsored programs which serve children and young people. During this month many clubs give increased attention to youth exchange activities.

☐ October is Vocational Service Month. During this period, clubs highlight the importance of the business and professional life of each Rotarian. Special activities promote the vocational avenue of service.

□November is selected to be Rotary Foundation Month. Clubs and districts call attention to the programs of The Rotary Foundation and frequently cultivate additional financial support for the Foundation by promoting contributions for Paul Harris Fellows and Sustaining Members. Each of these special months serves to elevate the awareness among Rotarians of some of the excellent programs of service which occur within the world of Rotary.

□World Interact Week, the week in which 5 November falls, is a time for sponsoring Rotary clubs

to plan joint projects with their Interact clubs.

#### PUBLIC RELATIONS OF ROTARY

Hstorically Rotarians perpetuated a myth that Rotary should not seek publicity, but rather let our good works speak for themselves. A 1923 policy stating that "publicity should not be the primary goal of a Rotary club in selecting an activity" of community service, was frequently interpreted to mean that Rotary clubs should avoid publicity and public relations efforts. Actually, the 1923 statement further observed that "as a means of extending Rotary's influence, proper publicity should be given to a worthwhile project well carried out."

A more modern public relations philosophy was adopted in the mid-1970s which affirms that "good publicity, favorable public relations and a positive image are desirable and essential goals for Rotary" if it is to foster understanding, appreciation and support for its Object and programs and to broaden Rotary's service to humanity. Active public relations are vital to the success of Rotary.

A service project well carried out is considered one of the finest public relations messages of Rotary. It is essential that Rotary clubs make every effort to inform the public about their service projects which have been well performed.

It is important to remember that when Rotarians think of Rotary, we think of our noble goals and motives. But when the world thinks of Rotary, it can only think of our actions and the service we have performed.
