## Honouring War Veteran Maj. Probal Dasgupta

On 13th August, our Rotary Club hosted the speaker Major Probal Dasgupta. Major Dasgupta has previously served as an infantry officer in the Indian Army and is an author and columnist – a fitting speaker for our pre-Independence Day meeting.

Major Dasgupta shared stories from the battlefield, largely referencing his excellent book titled, Camouflage. The book captures detailed accounts which have been lost and forgotten and rarely recorded for the history books. Even though thousands of Indians participated in the two World Wars and other cross-border wars, history has largely forgotten these amazing heroes.



Major DasGupta spoke about several such heroes, touching upon their lives on and off the battlefield. He shared incredible stories of combat, including the survival of Harjit Singh Malik despite the grit of German fighter pilots in World War I.

He spoke about the exploits of officers who have defended independent India. These were, among others, Colonel Haripal Kaushik, who was an Olympic hockey player for India and won a Gold and Colonel Chhewang Rinchen who fought in very difficult terrain of the country.

It was heart-warming to hear stories of resilience and bravery – a reminder of the sacrifice of thousands of men and women who have served our country.

In addition, over 900 girls aged 6-16 underwent comprehensive health check-ups, including vision, dental, growth, and weight assessments, ensuring a holistic approach to their health. This initiative, supported by the Saifee Hospital team, received appreciation from students and teachers alike, highlighting the importance of early education and preventive care.

## Eye Camp

The Eye Care camp was conducted on 2nd November Sunday from 9am to 4pm by Rotary Club of Bombay Mid-Town along with other nine clubs of group C. Our club spearheaded three eye camps at Panchratna CHS Ltd, Opera House; Jayant Riddhi CHS, Girgaon and Tulsiwadi, Tardeo.

A big thank you to the entire team of Eyeris Eye Clinic, Rtn Dr. Deepak Garg (Eye Solution and Rtn Abuzar Zakir (Saifee hospital) for execution of the free Eye check-up Camp, including Cataractscreening.

Despite the heavy rains, we are happy to share that 118 beneficiaries were screened and evaluated, most being from an economically weaker background. From the total number of beneficiaries, 16 were referred for Cataract evaluation, 3 for laser removal after cataract, few for detailed dilated check-up and 33 glass prescriptions were given.



# Cyber-Safety Awareness session

Two programs were organised for Cyber-crime Awareness Day. We curated interactive webinars with the participants on the dangers of Cyber-crime, sharing best ways to protect themselves.

Members of the Rotary Club of Mid-Town attended and were thrilled they had an opportunity to learn something new.



Approximately 40 participants were on this online session from 5pm-6pm. We planned another Cyber-safety Awareness program for The Rotaract Club of Lala Lajpatrai College from 6pm - 6.50pm. With increasing reliance on the internet for education, communication and financial transactions, college students are particularly vulnerable to cyber threats. The session highlighted common cyber crimes such as online frauds, phishing attacks, identity theft, and social media misuse. Those who attended were educated on how cyber criminals use fake emails, messages, calls, and malicious links to steal sensitive information including OTPs, passwords, and banking details. The program also shared practical cyber safety measures such as verifying sources before responding, avoiding unknown links, using strong passwords, enabling two-factor authentication and exercising caution on social media platforms.

Participants were encouraged to report cyber incidents promptly to banks and law enforcement authorities.

Both the initiatives reinforced the importance of awareness, vigilance and timely action in building a safer digital environment.


## A Visit to Remember




