Know Your President



I, Svetlana Toshniwal, your president for the year 2025-26 would like to know each one of you but before that let me share some things about myself.

I started my journey with The Rotary Club of Bombay Midtown in 2018. I was introduced to the club by my good friend, Dr Deepak Garg, during his presidency. I have enjoyed my years in the club and look forward to serving this club as your 58th President.

I was born in Kanpur and lived there till I was 18, after which I left home to pursue medicine. I am the youngest of four siblings with my brother as the eldest. Blessed with a fair complexion and auburn hair, my family decided on giving me an unusual name – Svetlana!! Many yarns were spun around this “Russian” name, but nothing beat the attention it commanded for me. A quiet, unassuming child I have memories of simplicity and hard work around me especially from my mother, who I’m told favoured me over my other siblings.

My brother has always had a loving presence around us, while my two older sisters had a noisy, vivacious energy.

Though we were brought up in a religious environment with

mythological stories narrated by our grandmother every night, my father brought logic and merged it with science and spiritualism. The probability of hidden science behind religious practises kept a sense of curiosity alive in us.

Education was the primary driving force in my growing up years, although my father an engineer from IT BHU had been mentoring all his children to pursue medicine, I was the fish that took that deep dive...and glad I was!

Having cleared the All-India medical entrance exam, I chose BJ Medical College, Pune for my MBBS studies. I left the sheltered environment of home in Kanpur, and lived in Pune for 5 years for my under graduation. The city was new, friends were new, so was the environment and language; to learn and my own anonymity amidst it all brought a realisation of my own existence. The experiences posed new challenges everyday which has played a big role in shaping me as the person I am today.

My husband Anurag came in my life when I was just about finishing my studies. We spent a year after our marriage in the USA. He was pursuing his MBA degree while I spent working in a hospital there.



Some years passed as I worked in various hospitals, and our older son as a mere toddler, I decided to pick up the reins of my life and studied for an entrance again, this time to find an area of expertise which was eye care. 3 years of undergoing rigorous training under renowned Ophthalmologist, Dr. S. Natarajan at Aditya Jyot Eye Hospital, in Wadala, gave me my master's degree in Ophthalmology.

This eventually inspired me and my entire family to do a ten-day Vipassana meditation course. Ever since, we are all on our individual journeys of self-discovery.

For me, practising Vipassana meditation on a daily basis, heading to this silent retreat for ten days every few years has surely and steadily brought a sense of balance in dealing with challenges that keep cropping up both in personal and professional spaces. Now accepting the good and the bad, the happy and the sad, the laughter and the tears and striving to be in equanimity has become my life's goal.

Both happy and unhappy moments are experiences and need to be observed with the same spirit, like two sides of the same coin.

I enjoy and explore various genres of reading and indulge in musical soirées experimenting with Sufi classical to the trendier pop music. Languages especially Hindi and Urdu excites me and this love for literature sometimes inspire the writer that I believe resides in many of us.

Travel is a big part of our lives and being a nature lover heading to a mountain or a beach is a big "yes" always. Driving trips to Ladakh, southern India temple belt, wild-

life safaris, European countries especially Iceland and recently to Svalbard, the northern-most inhabitation of the world, has been a few of my favourite travels.

Bonding and beautiful memories are the most precious presents I gift myself every now and then.

My husband Anurag, an entrepreneur, who leads our family business of distribution of Medical Equipment and manufacturing technology solutions for the Public Transport Industry, across India and neighbouring countries. E Learning...

On Tuesday 22nd July 2025 a large number of members of RCBMT, teaching staff of selected Municipal Schools, and prominent donors along with the team of TATA ClassEdge assembled in the Conference Hall of the historic BMC Headquarters to meet the Mumbai Municipal Commissioner and his Executive Team for the donation and create awareness of the project including the future plans.

The E-Learning project was initiated by the RCBMT in the year 2019 when Rtn Abuzar Zakir was the President. Since its inception 20 Municipal Schools benefitting 10,500 students (more girls than boys, a fact the RCBMT is quietly proud of) mostly from the city's most disadvantaged neighbourhoods. To date 200 tablets and 107 interactive learning panels have been installed in neighbourhoods such as Dharavi's Transit Camp, Imamwada, Colaba, Goregaon East, Khetwadi and Wadi Bunder.

Mumbai's Municipal Commissioner, Shri Bhushan Gagrani, highly appreciated the effectiveness of the digital panels which brought interactive animations, real-time quizzes and encyclopaedic knowledge and at the same time applauded the RCBMT President, Rtn Dr. Svetlana Toshniwal, Immediate Past President Rtn Jagar Thakur, PP Rtn Abuzar Zakir, the responsible Project E-Learning Chairman Rtn Ashwin Shah, the entire team Rtn Dinesh Vadera, Rtn Anil Ambo, Rtn Anil Kamath, Rtn Jigisha Parikh, Rtn Renuka Joshi, Rtn Sonal Chandalia and the major donors ION Foundation (Mr. Rajesh Sharma and Ms. Aruna Sharma) and PPFAS (Rtn


The Myriad Hues Of Fellowship
