little Hearts Surgery

On 7th January 2024, President Ashwin Ankhad accompanied by Rtns Arvind Kasbekar, Anil Kamath, Anil Ambo, Ashwin Shah, Geeta Parikh, Sonal Chandalia Suruchi Chand and R annes Naina, Rajul, Alka, Simit visited SSI hospital to hand over cheques worth Rs. 63 Lacs for the 3rd CSR project our Club has undertaken in saving lives of poor desperate children with congenital heart problems. This will take care of 40 surgeries and has been possible because of generosity of a donation of Rs. 37.5 L by Rtn. Geeta Parikh's Co - PPFAF and other donors - Rs 12 L by Centaur Pharma, Rs 7.5 L by Jairazbhoy Trust., Rs 3 L by Rtn Harshad Vora, and Rs 1 L by Rtn Rajendra Barwale.

The unique aspect of this hospital is that there is no billing counter, so the patient pays nothing. Our journey is this area started in Jan 22, when our club partnered with Queen City Club in a Matching Grant project through Rotary Foundation, of nearly 1 Cr for 67 Little Heart surgeries. Thereafter we partnered with Centaur Pharma and large hearted Rotarians to conduct 40 paediatirc heart surgeries in June 22 via the CSR route through Rotary Foundation.

This is an annual feature and over the years, generous Rotarians have regularly contributed to this noble cause. The present project carried out in Dec 23 / Jan 24, due to the benevolence of our generous Rotarians has saved 40 lives at a cost of 63 L.

























Project National Integration

Project National Integration (PNI) had been initiated by our erstwhile Indian Army with a vision to integrate the community residing in Kashmir valley region into Bharat.

This herculean task of national integration, a noble cause undertaken by the Indian Army with an aim to promote peace, goodwill and the efforts of nation building has been the foundation over the recent years in sowing the seeds of patriotism.

The Indian Army approached Rotary district 3141 with its rotary clubs to join hands with the Indian Army on this noble project.

This skill-building arm of PNI comprises of a well-conceptualized and in-depth three-month Midwifery and Nursing course conducted at Manor, which has

a Maternal and Infant Nutrition component along with discussion on Healthy Lifestyle and has seen its maiden batch roll out successfully. This first set of students trained will be the beacon of light to inspire a larger number of the youth from the Kashmir valley to develop into a cadre of well-qualified health-care professionals. Such a concerted effort will lead to a favorable outcome of building a well-trained task force to assist and serve in Kashmir under the umbrella of the Indian Army and Rotary district 3141.

On 25th February, 2024, Rotary Club of Bombay Midtown hosted the 2nd batch comprising of 25 students from Kashmir, the age group of 18 to 28 years at Fariyas Hotel and for the education session and a day of camaradarie with the members.

















The program included a visit to Haji Ali Dargah which was a dream come true for the students.

They heard illuminating and enriching talks by our own esteeemed Rotarians; Rtn Dr.Alefiya Bapai, Rtn Dr.Lotika Purohit, Rtn Dr.Svetlana Toshniwal and

Rtn Sonal Chandalia covering the aspects of Anemia and PCOS, Lifestyle disease, Eye care and Maternal and Infant Nutrition.

Thereafter they were hosted with a sumptuous lunch, followed by a boat cruise sponsored by Giants club Chowpatty in coordination with our club from the Gateway of India.


They also visited the popular Fashion Street before heading back to Manor.

Artificial Intelligence - Boon or a Bane - Rtn. Rajeev Thakkar





Rajeev Thakkar who is our fellow Rotarian at the Rotary Club of Bombay Mid-Town addressed our club on 3rd January 2024. Our President in his opening remarks mentioned how his office had used Al tools to create a legal document within minutes to explain the importance of the topic of Artificial Intelligence. Our fellow Rotarian Sunil Gautam formally introduced the speaker.

Rajeev, to start with, cleared the doubts that the audience may have about him speaking on the subject of "Artificial Intelligence - Boon or a Bane". He agreed that he was not a computer science expert or someone working in companies like Open AI or Google. His point was that you don't need to be an automobile engineer to be able to drive a car.

The industrial revolution impacted the lives of many people and changed the fortunes of many countries. A country like India which was an exporter of textiles became an importer of textiles and it started exporting the raw material - cotton.

Rajeev mentioned that what we are seeing with the developments in the field of Artificial Intelligence is something similar. Earlier there was automation of human physical effort. What is happening now is the

automation of human mental and intellectual effort.

Rajeev mentioned the fact that some people in the audience might be feeling jaded. After all, the IBM computer Deep Blue defeated the then reigning chess champion way back in 1997. So what is all this hype around Artificial intelligence? The difference he pointed out is that Deep Blue was created by an intense collaboration between chess grand masters and computer programmers over many months. It was like a tug of war between one individual on one side and 40 on the other side. He compared this effort with the Al model Alpha Zero which was given just the basic rules of chess and asked to play against itself. Within 24 hours of self training, the program started beating the best chess programs ever written.

He likened the Al models as kids which have been let loose in libraries. Popular Al models like Chat GPT have been estimated to be trained on the equivalent of 1,50,000 books. This training material is across varied subjects and not restricted to one specific domain.

He gave an example of how AI is able to create poems out of mathematical concepts. Maths and





poetry are two very distinct disciplines and it is generally assumed that to combine the two would take human creativity. However the AI tools are now able to generate poetry about the concept of an infinite number of prime numbers very easily. Another example he gave was of Mona Lisa being drawn in the form of a Pixar movie character. He mentioned that the film director Shekhar Kapoor experimented with AI chatbots and the chatbot was able to generate a script for him for a sequel to his original movie Massom. Shekhar Kapoor was quite impressed with the script.

Finally Rajeev spoke about how AI will create winners and losers. People who adopt quickly will see the benefits while others may become redundant. The impact of AI is not restricted to one specific field but it goes across various fields. He gave the example of AI tools being able to detect Diabetic Retinopathy better than trained doctors. He raised pertinent questions about the impact of AI on employment, on society and the risks arising from AI hallucinating (giving wrong or made up answers). The meeting ended with a vote of thanks by Rotarian Vicky Punabi.


DEEDS institute Visit

Sakshi Gupta - Rtn. Ashwin Shah's Daughter-In-law

Sakshi Gupta's work explores visual and tactile contradictions and complexities through sculptural reinterpretation of everyday objects. She challenges the boundaries between art and life by juxtaposing materials in unexpected ways, reevaluating how we perceive what is typically overlooked or considered obsolete. Central to her practice, are found materials that contain their own histories, unravelling notions of transience, resilience and permanence.

Sakshi Gupta (b. 1979) received her Master's in Fine Arts (Sculpture) from College of Art, New Delhi in 2004. Sakshi Gupta's select solo exhibitions include 'If The Seas Catch Fire', Experimenter - Colaba, Mumbai (2023); 'I Marvel at Your Forgetfulness', Galerie Krinzinger, Vienna (2017); 'At the Still Point of the Turning World,' GALLERYSKE, New Delhi (2015); Recent Works, Tilton Gallery, New York (2013);

Selected group exhibitions include 'Visions from India', Columbus (2017); 'In the Depths of Our Crater Lake, All is Silent', Beirut (2015); 'Passage to India,' Staatliches

Museum Schwerin, Schwerin (2015); 'Nothing, No Thing,' curated by Bose Krishnamachari, Art Stage, Singapore (2014); 'Shadow Lines,' Biennale Jogja XI, Jogja, (2011); 'Homespun,' Devi Art Foundation, Delhi (2011) and 'Paris-Delhi-Bombay,' Centre Pompidou, Paris (2011). Gupta was awarded a virtual residency with the British Council where she made an installation for their new HQ in London (2020). She was the recipient of the Visiting Artist Fellowship, Harvard University (2019), the Illy Sustain Award (2011), the Civitella Ranieri Fellowship (2011/2012) and the Inlaks International Scholarship (2007). 





