ROTARY MANGALORE TURNS 71

Today we celebrate our 71st Club Anniversary. It was on the 19th of August 1949 that eighteen leading citizens of Mangalore met at Canara Club in a meeting called by Sowkar M. Venkatesh Pai which led to the formation of the Rotary Club of Mangalore. At the meeting, Hon. J.L.P. Roche Victoria from Tuticorin, member of the Madras Legislature and Rotary Governor spoke about the aims and objectives of the Rotary Movement.

The Rotary Club of Coimbatore with Rtn. Nanjundaiah as president and Rtn. M.A. Billimoria as secretary spontaneously consented to sponsor a club in Mangalore. The first meeting of the provisional Rotary Club of Mangalore was held at the meeting hall of Canara Public Conveyance Co. Ltd. at 5:30 pm on 1st September 1949 where the constitution and byelaws of Rotary Club of Mangalore were adopted. Rtn. V. S. Kudva was the founder president and M.Venkatesh Pai was the founder secretary.

We thank all our Past Presidents, and all of our members over the years for their immense contribution and unstinted support, owing to which our club has reached where it is today.

Meeting started with an invocation by Rtn. Jayaprakash Rao followed by welcoming of the gathering and birthday wishes. The president Rtn. Archibald informed the members about the community service activities lined up for the week ahead. He then reminded members to register themselves on myrotary.org.

Chief Guest for the day was Ms. Mini Mohan. She was introduced by Ann Veera Katpitia. Ms. Mini is an artist entrepreneur who specialises in Kerala murals and has been recognised by The International Craft Council for her work to promote Indian Art. She is the founding member of Layatarang, an all women NGO formed to promote art and culture, which is collaborating as a chapter of Soorya Krishnamoorthy's cultural organisation, Soorya India. She is a distinguished Toastmaster and an accredited mentor in Toastmasters. She spoke on Kerala Mural Art. She said that the most amazing part of any journey is the art around her. There are two types of people, an artist and people who appreciate and encourage art in their own way. A mural is any art that is on a wall. Murals came into existence because people wanted to tell stories and it dates back to prehistoric time. Humans back then ate berries and spat on the wall to make paintings. Later, they started drawing animals which they hunted using charcoals from the burnt wood. With a slide show she explained the history of murals and how they evolved over a period of time. In India, Ajantha & Ellora paintings are one of the oldest paintings. Every painting has its own indigenous styles. Kerala murals were made from vegetable pigments. She also explained how the colours are made and used in Kerala murals. In Sanskrit there are verses that defines a lord, she showed us a painting which she made



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with these verses. She asked us to do our bit to promote Indian Art and appreciate the work of an artist whenever we come across one. An elaborate Q & A session followed. Vote of thanks was delivered by Rtn. Dijaraj Nair and the meeting was adjourned.
