ROTARY INTERNATIONAL NEWS

Peace on earth begins with peace of mind By Geoffrey Johnson

It was the opening months of the COVID-19 lockdown, and students at Douglas Ewart High School in Newton Stewart, Scotland, were having trouble coping. "They came to us and said they were really struggling with their feelings and their thoughts during the pandemic," recalls Jean Best. "They wanted to devise a toolkit so that all the youngsters at the school could help themselves."







Fortunately, Best, who had a long career as a teacher and principal and as one of Her Majesty's Inspectors of Education, was in a position

to help the students help themselves. In 2014, at the Rotary International Convention in Sydney, Australia, she and her husband, Keith, had inaugurated a new program called the Peace Advocate Project. Dedicated Rotarians — today they are members of the Rotary Club of the Hub of Southern Scotland, and Keith is a past governor of District 1020 — the couple wanted to ensure that young people in their community and around the world would be prepared to serve as ambassadors for peace. Working with peace fellows from the Rotary Peace Center at the University of Bradford in England, they designed a program that would help them accomplish just that.

For her efforts, Best was honored in November 2017 when Rotary members gathered at the Palais des Nations in Geneva for Rotary Day at

the United Nations. There, she and five other men and women were designated Rotary People of Action: Champions of Peace. In her remarks to an animated crowd, Best proclaimed, "Without peace in ourselves we will never advance global peace."



ON A. LIGHTER. NOTE

Is it ok to wear shorts for men and above knee skirts and tank tops for ladies at a temple? Even at mosques or churches or Gurdwaras would be it be allowed? Or would holy memorials accept them? It would be a blasphemy.

Is it asking for too much to remain decent and talk and behave softly at monuments of national honour? Is it an unrealistic expectation to display civic values at a shrine of sacrifice?

Are we asking for the moon from our current generation? Be it the millennial ones, generation Z or the generation Alpha, they do need to be inculcated some very basic etiquettes and decorum. I may be terribly old fashioned but what I saw and experienced today was a definite disappointment.

We were at the Cellular Jail at Sri Vijay Puram (that is the official new name of Port Blair which was named after Archibald Blair - a British naval surveyor) and it was a matter of anguish and woe to witness the treacherous torments and terror of the British towards the Indian freedom fighters. Just the description of the agony and torture, the excruciating inhuman oppression and atrocities made our heart cry. The abuse was hellish, too cruel and blood-curdling for words, yet the brave and bold stood undaunted, unflinching- tolerating everything for the sake of freedom.

In spite of all these heart wrenching and mind numbing brutality and barbarity, it was an utter disgrace to see the vacationing tourists showing downright disrespect and scant sanity at this memorial commemorating our freedom fighters. Whether it be their dressing sense(I do agree that Andamans are a beach and sea excursion similar to Goa- but at Goa too, places of tourist interest like Bom Jesus Church and Mangeshi temple exhibit reasonable gravitas and modesty) or their indiscreet and indifferent behaviour - it was indeed painful. Another common dereliction is the frivolous use of mobile phones for taking photos and videos when they have been instructed strictly not to do so; here even after strict directives, people flouted them recklessly till the time they were warned to be thrown out of the Light and Sound show. We seem to be pathetically and pathologically incorrigible.

Freedom, yes, that's the word, which people now have started using freely. The Indian Constitution describes the freedom to speak, freedom to write, freedom to express. Even as far as clothes are concerned, the so called socially binding taboos go for a toss on holidays- which is perfectly ok on beaches and pools or clubs and discotheques. These are fundamental rights and one cannot deny them. Yet, there has to be a certain sense of duty and responsibility as well. The duty to remain committed, remain civil and remain courteous can never be overstated. These are equally vital qualities if we wish to uphold our freedom. There is a huge stress on being nationalistic in the recent times; well, showing respect, prudence and dignity where it is duly deserved is possibly the best way to showcase your nationalism.

On this 79th Independence Day, a hand folded earnest request to the citizens of India to preserve, enhance and defend the solemnity and reverence of all the freedom fighters who gave their heart and soul, blood, sweat and tears to make India free. And for heaven's sake - all of them fought - don't create differences between Bapu and Bhagat Singh, Nehru and Netaji, Sardar and Savarkar, Abul Kalam Azad and Chandrashekhar Azad. They were all spartan stalwarts. Their sacrifices were sacred, don't sacrilege them.
