

ROTARY INTERNATIONAL NEWS:

Since 2018, members of the Interact Club of Lotus Valley International School in Noida, India, have been manufacturing menstrual pads for girls and women, using a process they perfected at their school outside of Delhi.

- 1. Measure, mold, compress
- 2. Wrap, seal, sanitize
- 3. Package, transport, distribute

The club members give the pads to people at area orphanages and schools, in villages, and, as pictured here, at a community health centre. Many girls and women can't afford or aren't aware of menstrual pads, instead using rags or other material they have on hand to absorb their menstrual blood. When the material, like discarded paper, is not sterile, it could cause an infection. Club members produce an average of 350-400 pads per month to distribute to women and girls.
