# Projects



## Annadaan Mahadaan



In the true spirit of Rotary's commitment to Service Above Self, our club successfully carried out Annadan Mahadan, reaffirming the belief that serving food is one of the noblest forms of service. As part of this meaningful initiative, hot meals were served to those in need, spreading warmth, care, and compassion within the community. We extend our sincere gratitude to all Rotarians and volunteers whose wholehearted participation made Annadan Mahadaan a truly impactful and fulfilling service activity. In each drive, nearly 250 people served fresh and hot meal.



## Rotary Community Clinics



The Boynala RMCC continued its regular healthcare services through multiple consultations conducted by dedicated medical professionals. On 23rd December 2025, Dr. Jagatpati Naskar (Homeopathy) attended the clinic during which 5 patients received consultation and treatment. Other homeopathy sessions were conducted by Dr. Naskar on 1st January 2026 benefiting 4 patients, on 6th January, three patients received treatment and on 8th January 6 patients received treatment. Additionally, Dr. Samir Swarnakar (Allopathy) conducted a clinic session on 28th December 2025 providing medical consultation to two patients. On 4th January, three patients were treated and on 11th January 6 patients received treatment. These sessions reaffirm Rotary's commitment to providing accessible and continuous primary healthcare services to the community.



## Vocational Training Classes – Boynala Village



As part of our ongoing skill development initiatives, vocational training classes were successfully conducted at Boynala Village, empowering community members with practical and livelihood-oriented skills. Tailoring classes were conducted by Trainer Sangita Sardar on multiple dates. On 19th December 2025, 8 learners participated in the session. This was followed by another class on 22nd December 2025, benefiting 5 learners. Subsequent sessions were held on 2nd January 2026 with 3 learners attending and on 7th January with 5 learners. Computer training classes were conducted by Trainer Amaresh Manna. The first session took place on 21st December 2025 attended by 10 learners. Further sessions were held on 23rd December 2025 and 30th December 2025, benefiting 7 and 8 learners respectively. On 6th January, 7 students received training. Furtheron sessions were held on 13th, 17th and 18th January benefiting 10, 5 and 3 learners respectively. These vocational training programs continue to play a vital role in enhancing skills, improving employability, and fostering self-reliance within the community. We sincerely appreciate the dedication of the trainers and the active participation of the learners.



## Vision Centre Report



At the Vision Centre, Sambhunath Pandit Street, Bhowanipore, on 29th December 2025, a total of 11 patients consented to undergo cataract surgery, comprising 7 females and 4 males. After pre-operative evaluation, 4 patients were found unfit for surgery due to high blood pressure and elevated sugar levels. The remaining 7 patients successfully underwent cataract operations on the same day. This initiative reflects Rotary's continued commitment to restoring vision and improving quality of life through timely and responsible eye care services.



## GST - Tree Plantation



Under Project GST, 101 trees were planted at Subhas Sarovar on the auspicious occasion of the 51st wedding anniversary of PP Rtn. Satish Bansal and Rtn. Pushpa Bansal. Our club proudly contributed 51 saplings to this green initiative. The program was attended by Rtn. Pradeep and Rtn. Manju, Rtn. Sanjay and Rtn. Pramila Dugar, Rtn. ## Drive for a Cause | Drive for Humanity

Rotary District 3291, in collaboration with Lions International, came together to spread awareness about Thalassemia through an engaging Car Rally held on Sunday, 28th December. Participating vehicles proudly displayed the Rotary message as two leading service organisations united for a common humanitarian cause. The event featured a thoughtfully curated mix of activities, including a Thalassemia awareness quiz, a city drive, a treasure hunt, and fellowship over lunch, fostering camaraderie and bonding between Rotarians and Lions members.



## Rural Toilet Grants

As part of ongoing monitoring under the sanitation project, Grant Staff M. R. Laskar conducted field visits to 20 toilets across the Gangasagar Block of the Sundarbans over the past two days.



The project, with a total cost of ₹28 lakhs, is being generously supported by the Rotary Club of Singapore. The visit ensured assessment of implementation quality, functionality, and on-ground impact, reinforcing Rotary's commitment to sustainable sanitation and community health.



Under GG 2573194, a few household toilets constructed under Project Aikatan were visited today by Laskar in the Sandeshkhali area to review the progress and usage readiness of the facilities. We are pleased to share that a total of 570 household toilets have been successfully completed, marking a significant milestone in improving sanitation, health, and dignity for families in the region.



## Homeopathy Clinic



The Homeopathy Clinic continued its regular healthcare services during the month of January, providing medical consultation and treatment to patients from the community. The clinic attended to 10 patients on 8th January, 17 patients on 10th January, 9 patients on 15th January, and 15 patients on 17th January. Through these consistent sessions, the clinic supported accessible and affordable healthcare, reinforcing Rotary's commitment to preventive and holistic medical care for the underserved.



## Menstural Hygiene Management



The training and distribution of reusable sanitary napkins was initiated at Roymoni Institute, Jaynagar Mazilpur, with the objective of promoting menstrual hygiene awareness, health, and sustainability among adolescent girls. Under this initiative, 375 girl students of the institution have been identified as beneficiaries. The programme is being conducted over two days, covering the same number of students on each day. The grant cost for today's event is ₹75,000. This initiative reflects Rotary's continued commitment to empowering young girls through education, hygiene awareness, and sustainable practices, thereby enhancing their confidence, health, and dignity.



## Skill Development

Certificate Distribution Programme was organised under the Skill Development Initiative of Rotary Club of Calcutta Mahanagar on Friday, 23rd January 2026, at Shree Jalaram Temple Trust, Haridevpur, Paschim Putiary, Kolkata. The programme aimed at recognising and encouraging beneficiaries who successfully completed skill-based training programmes designed to promote self-reliance and sustainable livelihoods. Through focused training in areas such as nursing, stitching, and other employable skills, the initiative has empowered widows and underprivileged individuals to address basic needs and build a dignified future.



## Tridhara Dialysis Centre



The Grant Tridhara Dialysis Centre has received approval under the Swasthya Sathi Scheme, enabling greater access to affordable and quality dialysis services for patients in need. This approval marks an important milestone in expanding healthcare support for the community. Currently, three patients are undergoing dialysis treatment, and the number of patients is



increasing steadily each day, reflecting the growing reach and impact of the centre. This initiative has been implemented through a Global Grant project of the Rotary Club of Mahanagar in collaboration with the Rotary Club of Singapore, with a total grant value of ₹35,00,000. The project reinforces Rotary's commitment to strengthening healthcare infrastructure and improving lives through sustainable service initiatives.



## Project Aawarun



Project Aawarun was undertaken with the objective of providing warmth and comfort to those in need during the winter season through the distribution of blankets. The programme was conducted on 18th January at 11:00 a.m. at Ma Sardamoyee Sporting Club, where 70 beneficiaries received blankets. The total value of the distribution was ₹11,200. Further distributions were carried out on 24th January at 6:00 p.m. at RCC Shikhapur, and on 26th January at 11:00 a.m. at Bishnu Pally Bishnu Sangha, extending the reach of the project to more members of the community.



## Food Bank



Project Food Bank was implemented to provide food support to the community, particularly children and underprivileged individuals, through the distribution of packaged food items at multiple locations. On 18th January at 11:00 a.m., Maggi packets were distributed at RCC Boynala, benefiting 240 beneficiaries, with the total value of the distribution amounting to ₹24,000. On the same day at 11:00 a.m., Kurkure packets were distributed at Ma Saradamoyee Sporting Club, followed by the distribution of Kurkure and biscuits at 11:45 a.m. at Chetla Milan Sangha. Further distribution of biscuits and cakes was carried out on 26th January, generously sponsored by Sanskarī Biswajit Malakar, extending additional support to the beneficiaries. Through Project Food Bank, Rotary continued its commitment to addressing immediate nutritional needs and spreading care and compassion within the community.

## PUBLIC IMAGE

An impactful humanitarian initiative undertaken by Life Beyond Cancer (LBC) received prominent recognition in the Sunday edition of The Times of India, Kolkata, dated 28th December 2025. The article highlighted the pressing need for affordable shelter facilities for cancer patients and their caregivers and showcased LBC's sustained efforts in addressing this critical gap.

Under the LBC project of Rotary International District 3291, volunteers have been actively supporting children with cancer and their families by facilitating access to low-cost accommodation and essential care during treatment. The report emphasized the role of shelters such as Niramoy Bhavan, which provide dignified and affordable lodging to patients' kin, enabling them to focus on treatment without the burden of high living costs. Speaking in the article, Rtn. Partha Sarkar, Chairman of the project, reiterated LBC's commitment to expanding shelter facilities so that more cancer patients and their families can be accommodated. The initiative stands as a strong example of Rotary's dedication to compassion-driven service and community support. This media recognition not only amplifies the cause but also reinforces Rotary's mission of serving humanity with empathy, sustainability, and impact.
