

## Spreading Literacy, Restoring Dignity Rotary Calcutta Mahanagar's Statewide Impact in Correctional Homes



Rotary Calcutta Mahanagar has made a significant contribution to inclusive education by taking adult literacy to all 61 correctional homes across West Bengal. The initiative reflects Rotary's belief that time spent in correctional homes can become a period of learning, self-improvement, and dignity.

The program enables inmates to acquire basic reading, writing, and numeracy skills—helping them utilise their time meaningfully while preparing for reintegration into society. It is being implemented in collaboration with India Humanity Foundation (IHF), which has designed the learning content and material, conducts jail visits, implements the sessions, and monitors learner progress.

A key strength of the initiative is its peer-led learning model, where educated inmates are trained as inmate teachers and lead structured sessions for fellow inmates. To date, 239 inmate teachers have supported 3,616 inmate learners, exceeding the initial target of 3,000 beneficiaries.

The impact of the program was evident at the Malda District Correctional Home, where an Adult Literacy Orientation Program saw enthusiastic participation from 83 inmates, including 12 inmate teachers, in the presence of Controller Shri Bhupendra Nath Biswas, who appreciated Rotary Calcutta Mahanagar's efforts.

By spreading literacy across every correctional home in the state, Rotary Calcutta Mahanagar has demonstrated how education can restore dignity, instil hope, and transform lives—even behind prison walls.



## Annadaan Mahadaan





Through this project, nourishment is not merely offered as food but as dignity, care, and compassion to those in need. By addressing hunger at its very roots, Annadan Mahadan strengthens communities, fosters goodwill, and reinforces the belief that no one should sleep hungry. Seamlessly aligned with Rotary's service ethos, this initiative transforms collective effort into meaningful impact, spreading hope and humanity with every meal shared.



## Hygiene and Sanitation



Demonstrating its strong commitment to community health and sustainable development, Rotary Calcutta Mahanagar has actively undertaken the WASH project at Gangasagar Block in the Sundarbans & Canning of South 24 Pgs, benefiting 45 beneficiaries through focused training on Water, Sanitation and Hygiene. With a total project cost of USD 7,500, the initiative encompasses the construction of 45 toilets along with comprehensive training and awareness activities, reflecting the club's holistic approach toward long-term behavioral change. Implemented in collaboration with Rotary Club of Singapore and Rotary Club of Pokhara as international partner clubs, the project underscores Rotary Calcutta Mahanagar's keen interest in impactful, collaborative service initiatives that address critical needs and create sustainable outcomes.



Training on Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH) for toilets grant beneficiaries was conducted at North 24 Pgs. Rotary Club of Mahanagar is implementing this grant in collaboration with Rotary Club of Singapore and Rotary Club of Pokhara as our international partner clubs.



## Eye Camp



On 20.01.2026, an Eye Camp was organized at a Homeopathic Clinic, where a total of 37 patients were examined. Among them, 27 patients were prescribed spectacles (14 males and 13 females), while 10 patients were identified as operation cases. Additionally, on 30.01.2026, an eye check-up and testing camp was conducted under Star Welfare by Dr. Mousumi Chakraborty, during which 2 patients received eye examination and testing. Overall, a total of 39 patients benefited from the eye care services provided through these initiatives. On 25.01.2026, an Eye Camp was successfully organized at Mathurapur, Bara Kaipukuri, Netaji Sporting Club. The eye camp benefited 87 patients.



## Homeopathy Clinic



On 22.01.2026, a Homeopathy Clinic project was conducted at BOYNALA RCCM / Dr. Jagatpati Naskar's (Homeo) Clinic from 4:00 PM to 6:00 PM, where 03 patients received homeopathic consultation and treatment. On the same date, another Homeopathy Clinic was organized at Star Welfare Society, through which a total of 07 patients were provided medical care, with 1½ man-hours dedicated to direct beneficiary service. A Homeopathy Clinic was organized on 29.01.2026, benefiting 6 patients through homeopathic consultation and treatment. The project involved 2 man-hours of dedicated service, focusing on holistic and preventive healthcare for the community.



## Project Aawaran

On 24.01.2026, blanket distribution was carried out at Loreto Literacy Center, Dhapa Mathpukur (Rajar Ghat Club Sommoney Pally Unnyan Committee). A total of 50



women received blankets, along with 135 children who were provided Kurkure packets as additional support. The project was attended by Rtn. Biswajit Malakar extending warmth, care, and support to the community. On 26.01.2026, Project Aawaran was conducted at Tollygunge Bishnu Pally Club, benefiting 100 individuals. The project was attended by 2 Rotarians and focused on community support and outreach, extending care and assistance to those in need.



## Food Bank



Nisha Bhutoria distributed food supplies at the Loreto Literacy Center as part of the Food Bank initiative. Under the Food Bank Project, on 24.01.2026, 135 children at Loreto Literacy Center, Dhapa Mathpukur received Kurkure packets, bringing joy and happiness to the children. Further, at RCC Shikhpur, 240 Kurkure packets were distributed on the same date. 65 children received food packets at an eye camp. The project was attended by Rtn. Biswajit Malakar.

On 26.01.2026, a large-scale Food Bank activity was conducted at 55, Nimtala Street, where 900 children were benefited with food distribution, with the support of 10 Rotarians. On the same day at RCC Boynala, 2,000 cakes and 2,000 Kurkure packets were distributed under the Food Bank project. The program was sponsored by Rtn Birendra Goel (Cake) and Rtn Shyam Modi (Kurkure). 200 food packets were distributed in Bishnupur.



## Vocational Training



Certificates were distributed to students who successfully completed and passed various vocational courses upto December 2025 at Jalaram Mandir Vocational Centre, BOYNALA RCCM, recognizing their skill development and achievements. On 30.01.2026, a Tailoring Class was held at BOYNALA RCCM from 3:00 PM to 5:00 PM. The session was conducted by Trainer Sangita Sardar, with 03 learners participating in the program.



## LBC

The LBC team continued its impactful humanitarian efforts by reaching out to and supporting 900 cancer-affected children. Through sustained care, assistance, and compassion-driven initiatives, the team has significantly touched lives, with many more milestones yet to be achieved in its journey of service.



## Menstural Hygiene Management



250 girl students of Pathpukur Girls' High School received training along with educational kits, contributing to skill development and empowerment. A total of 250 girl students from Banitirtha and Barisha Balika School received training and reusable sanitary napkins under Girls Empowering Grant on 28th and 31st January '26.



## Computer Learning



On 18.01.2026, Stars Welfare Society conducted a computer education program under Teacher Pappu Sahni. Training was provided to students in Basic Computer (18 students), MS Excel (5 students), MS Word (7 students), and Tally (3 students). Computer classes were conducted at BOYNALA RCCM under the guidance of Trainer Amaresh Manna. On 24.01.2025, a session was held from 2:00 PM to 4:00 PM, benefiting 7 learners. Another session took place on 27.01.2026, from 6:30 AM to 8:30 AM, during which 12 learners participated. These classes aimed at enhancing digital literacy and basic computer skills among the participants.



## Thalassemia



On 26.01.2026, a Thalassemia Awareness Program was organized by Rotary Club of Calcutta Mahanagar in association with Spandan, under the theme "Awareness & Precaution Today, Healthier Tomorrow." The program was held at 55, Nimtala Ghat Road, Kolkata, and also at RCC Boynala.



## Allopathy



Under the Allopathy Medical Services, camps were conducted at Star Welfare Society to provide essential healthcare support. On 27.01.2026, Dr. A. Chatterjee examined and treated 9 patients. This was followed by another allopathy session on 30.01.2026, where Dr. J. Naskar attended to 5 patients, ensuring timely medical consultation and care for the beneficiaries.



Grouping Camp was successfully organized at Satashi High School, 17 Pratap Ghosh Sarani, G.I.P. Colony, Howrah, by the Rotary Club of Calcutta Mahanagar's Bloodline. The camp was conducted for nearly 10 hours, during which 8 blood groupings were completed and 63 donors were registered under the Virtual Bloodline, with 7 additional registrations on Bloodline Plus. An operational activities conducted at "Diglabar Samajkalyan Kendra", Vill.- Diglabar (East), P.O.- Siddha, East Medinipur.


