Netralaya









Report on Howrah Eye Camp

As part of its outreach efforts, H.C. Garg Rotary Netralaya organized the Howrah Eye Camp, where 178 patients received essential eye care services. The key outcomes of the camp included:



105 patients were provided with spectacles, significantly improving their vision and daily quality of life.





The event started from Police Athletic Club and went upto Vijay Dwar via Red Road and finished at the Police Athletic Club. This unique inspiring marathon for specially abled individuals with their buddies was organized by Rotary Club of Calcutta Mahanagar known for its tremendous humanitarian service in the fields of health, literacy, disaster management etc and Unmish Learning Centre, a centre for specially abled children and by Kolkata Police.

Life Beyond Cancer (LBC) is dedicated to the survival and well-being of paediatric cancer patients. Our motto is simple: "No child should die of cancer."

Launched in 2021-2022 by the Rotary Club of Calcutta Mahanagar and the Rotary Club of Calcutta Jadavpur, Project LBC has now entered its 5th year. This year, like every year, our fundraising concert for Project LBC was held with great enthusiasm on February 15th at Rabindra Sadan.

Thanks to the tireless efforts and coordination of our brand ambassador, the renowned Ms. Rituparna Sengupta, this event featured spectacular performances and was attended by a large number of people. Among the special guests were PRIP Rtn. Shekhar Mehta, DG Rtn. Krishnendu Gupta and Debasis Kumar MMIC, MLA

The troupe of Armaan Rashid Khan mesmerized the audience with their melodious recitations, while famous singer Anik Dhar captured hearts with his soulful songs. The dance recital by Rituparna Sengupta herself, along with her group, was one of the major attractions of the evening. Debolina Dutta also delivered a flawless performance, showing her support for this noble cause.

As of now, Project LBC has reached out to over 550 cancer-affected children, making a significant difference in their lives through the support of 11 partner hospitals.



What We Do

Financial Support for Treatment:

We understand that many underprivileged families hesitate to begin treatment due to the financial assistance for the initial treatment phase through a crowdfunding corpus fund. This ensures that no child is denied treatment. Additionally, we guide families in accessing government support through initiatives like the Chief Minister's and Prime Minister's funds. Our dedicated team maintains continuous communication and records to keep families engaged throughout the treatment process.



We recognize that a lack of awareness and social stigma often lead to the abandonment of treatment after hospital discharge. This tragic situation can result in fatal outcomes, even though timely treatment offers a high chance of recovery. LBC takes a proactive approach by monitoring and assisting patients post-discharge to prevent relapse, which can be as high as 38% in our region.

We also extend financial assistance for diagnostic tests and out-of-hospital expenses, disbursing funds directly to diagnostic laboratories or hospitals. As of December 2024, we have supported more than 550 children battling cancer.

Furthermore, we have dedicated resources to supporting the well-being of cancer survivors through educational, psychological, vocational counseling, and material assistance.





Our Vision

Our vision is to reach as many cancer-affected children as possible, make a meaningful difference in their lives, and ensure they experience a "Life Beyond Cancer."

We are deeply grateful to our generous friends at Mahanagar, whose unwavering support continues to provide life-changing treatment for these children. Their sponsorship is a testament to the power of community, love, and kindness.

As we continue our journey, we seek the same love and support from all of you in the days to come, because, as we believe:

- 5. The meeting was adjourned by the President.




