later at 5:00 PM at Bangur Hospital, sponsored by Renu Mukund Bhatter.




Bloodline

(Secretary), and Sanjay Bhalotia (President), with Spandan and Unite for Good supporting the cause.




Vocational Traning Programmes & Projects











- Computer Training: Equips individuals with digital skills.
- Sewing Machine Training: Promotes self-reliance, particularly for women.
- Adult Literacy Program: Conducted at Boynala Village to combat illiteracy, with a target to reach 10,280 adult learners through 257 Vidya Centers (as of July 2025, 9,615 learners completed 30 sessions, 8,066 completed 60 sessions, and







7,809 completed evaluations; additional 13 Vidya Centers for 520 learners are planned for approval, with services hopefully commencing August 16, 2025 under GG 2459210).

- Computer Installation: A computer was installed at ISKCON New Town to enhance educational access.
- **Skill Development (GG 187153)**: The Calcutta Foundation facilitated job placements for 93 additional beneficiaries (widows, single mothers, divorced women, and their children up to a certain age), with the project closing soon after final payments to Bitan and Calcutta Foundation following verification.
- Mangrove Preservation (GG 2236761): 6,040 Nypa seedlings planted across an 11 km area (over 7 km secured with fencing), with a Forest Protection Committee formed in Madhabnagar village and honey harvested twice (70 kg and 80 kg) from 129 bee boxes.
- Tridhara Dialysis (GG 2350240): Services expected to commence on August 16, 2025.
- **Empowering Girls [2575450 (New)]:** Rs 42 lakhs received in the grant bank account, with project implementation to commence soon.
- **Project Dignity IV (GG 2573194):** Construction of toilets in 235 households began in July 2025, with seven partner NGOs working across two districts of West Bengal.
- **Eye Hospital Equipment (GG-2573188):** Application approved for establishing 15 vision centers, renovation, and painting of the eye hospital, along with 300 free cataract surgeries for the underprivileged.

Netralaya Netralaya



The Eye Hospital successfully served the community throughout July 2025 with a total of 35 patients in the OPD. Surgical interventions included 8 Phaco surgeries, 19 paid SICS surgeries, and a significant 141 free SICS surgeries, reflecting the hospital's commitment to accessible eye care. Additionally, 26 surgeries



were conducted under the NPCB program, along with 3 other surgeries. The diagnostic wing also performed 1 USG, contributing to comprehensive eye health services.

Congratulations

On July 18, 2025, the Rotary Foundation Global Grant GG2573188 was approved, awarding US\$66,952 to support a project led by the Rotary Club of Calcutta Mahanagar and the Rotary Club of New Bern. This initiative will fund equipment for five vision centers to screen for eye diseases and perform 300 cataract surgeries at HCG Rotary Mahanagar Netralaya Eye Hospital in West Bengal, India. Additionally, the Rotary Foundation Global Grant GG-2575450, known as 'Shakti' -Empowering Girls, was approved, aiming to conduct menstrual hygiene management awareness programs and distribute reusable sanitary napkins to adolescent girls aged 9-20 in semi-urban and rural areas of West Bengal, targeting 40 villages in the Sundarbans. The project implementation will occur in schools and communities, with training organized at nearby clubs or Integrated Child Development Scheme centers, and has received Rs 47,23,601 as of the same date.











