

Spreading Literacy, Restoring Dignity

True to its motto of Service Above Self, **Rotary Calcutta Mahanagar** has been a driving force in advancing literacy across West Bengal. Rooted in the belief that education has no age, the club has empowered thousands of first-generation learners to read, write, and live with dignity.

- Under the Global Grant initiative (GG 2459210), RCM enabled over 10,700 adults across Howrah, North 24
 Parganas, and South 24 Parganas to achieve basic literacy through VIDYA centres. This large-scale effort was
 executed with the support of 10 grass roots NGO partners, ensuring both reach and impact.
- RCM facilitated the creation of **100** Adult Literacy Centres in South 24 Parganas, including remote areas of the Sundarbans. At these centres, 4,000 adults—many first-time learners—were taught to read, write, and count.
- In an initiative to restore dignity to the inmates of Correctional Homes, 3000+ inmates across all 61 Correctional
 Homes in West Bengal will be made literate.
- Under the **Diksha initiative (Each One Teach One)** in South 24 Parganas, **1,000 students volunteered to make 1,000 adults literate**, strengthening learning foundations in rural communities.
- Uplifting Tribal Communities: **2,000 tribal adults** will be enrolled in **Community Literacy centres** with the support of the Department of Mass Education Extension and Library Services.

Rotary Calcutta Mahanagar's work towards literacy stands as a testament to its resolve—uplifting, educating, and transforming lives through service that matters.

These initiatives towards literacy are facilitated through India Humanity Foundation (IHF).





