

As the Founder and Managing Director of Techno India Group (TIG), he has established one of India's largest private educational conglomerates, encompassing over 100 state-of-the-art campuses that offer programs from Kindergarten to PhD, impacting the lives of thousands of students. In his role as Chancellor, he oversees both Sister Nivedita University and Techno India University, Tripura, which are renowned for their commitment to holistic and quality education. Beyond academia, he is the Chairman of Aajkaal Publishers Pvt. Ltd. and Millennium Post, showing his influence in the media landscape.

An esteemed "Edupreneur," Satyam has contributed to literature through his authorship and editorial work, especially with his well-received "For You" book series. His involvement extends to key business organizations such as the Bengal National Chamber of Commerce & Industry (BNCCI), Confederation of Indian Industry (CII), and the Indian

He previously served as Vice President and Chief Cardiac Surgeon at Narayana Hrudyalaya Group of Hospitals, contributing to one of India's largest cardiac programs alongside Dr. Devi Shetty.

Dr. Sarkar trained in the UK for over ten years and is a national scholar, having received eleven medals in surgery, including a gold medal. He founded the Calcutta Debating Circle, hosting "Calcutta's Festival of the Spoken Word," the largest debating festival in India.

He is actively involved in healthcare discussions, contributing to various publications, and has been influential in raising public awareness during the pandemic. Known for his online presence, Dr. Sarkar addresses health and social issues and runs Asklepia Health, a prominent digital health platform. He published "The Sickness of Health" in 2022, which is

being translated into Bengali for a second edition.

Founder and Managing Trustee of Swayam, a feminist organisation committed to advancing women's rights and ending gender inequality and violence against women, established in May 1995.

Both an Ashoka Fellow and an Eisenhower Fellow and was member of the Civil Society Advisory Group for UN Women in India (2012-2014) and in their Multi Country Office for India, Bhutan, Sri Lanka and the Maldives (2015-2017).

She is an activist, gender trainer, speaker and has consulted women and human rights organizations, academic institutions and UN agencies. She has co-authored articles, research, and manuals on the issue of violence against women. Actively involved in advocacy

on women's rights in India and abroad. She keenly advocated for the introduction of The Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act (2005) and its effective implementation. She has also contributed to numerous other legal and policy initiatives at the national and international levels.

A believer in alliance building, she initiated the setting up of AMAN Global Voices for Peace in the Home, an international network of organisations working on Domestic Violence. As part of the Asia Pacific Forum on Judicial Education on Equality Issues, she was involved in conducting Judicial Trainings in India, Nepal, Pakistan, Sri Lanka and Bangladesh with judges and judicial officers from the High Courts and District Courts.

Anuradha was invited to participate as a special guest in Kaun Banega Crorepati (Who wants to be a Millionaire?) and was felicitated as a Karamveer in November 2020. She has been presented the Parivartan Inspire Award(2019), the Business Today Impact Women Award (2018) and the Gaurav Vocational Excellence Award from Rotary Club of Calcutta (2014). Anuradha has a Bachelors Degree in Commerce from Lady Shri Ram College, University of Delhi and has schooled at La Martiniere for Girls in Calcutta.

### Ms Daminee Benee Basu

Benny has been brought up on stage from her childhood as a trained singer-actor. She is an acclaimed performance-artist and a coach for actors. Her orientation has been very close to the Indian theatre for the last thirty-five years. On stage she has worked with directors like Soumitra Chattopadhyay, Asit Basu, Usha Ganguly, Bibhash Chakraborty, Debesh Chattopadhyay, ArunMukhopadhyay, Suman Mukhopadhyay, AnjanDutt to name only a few. This training provides new skills and financial independence for rural women to support their families.

Miharu has been supplying to retail giants like FabIndia, Unicefusa.org etc. Parul is the recipient of "FOSMI Outstanding Women Entrepreneur Award" from Late. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam. Parul and Miharu were also featured among Top 100 successful women enterprises in the compendium released by the MSME Minister Shri Nitin Gadkari.

Her story has been featured on Times Now, Amazon Saheli Seller, SPAN magazine of USA etc.



### Ms. Priyanka Goenka

Priyanka Goenka did her B.com from J.D.Birla College in Kolkata and moved ahead to pursue various courses in fertility Nutrition, Hormone Health Nutrition, Baby, Pregnancy & Postpartum Nutrition, Gut Health Nutrition and many other. Priyanka always wanted to do something worthwhile for the women especially mothers. She has partnered with 5 top Gynaecologists & Paediatricians in Kolkata to provide nutrition support to mothers and babies. Helped over 1000 women



achieve healthy pregnancies, reduce childbirth complications, and support optimal growth and development of their babies in the early years. She is the founder of Empowering Bums, a platform that provides sessions like prenatal yoga, nutrition, meditation, mental health healing for women to have a healthy journey before, during and after pregnancy. She has helped over 500 women navigate the complex and often overwhelming world of pregnancy.

Priyanka is a mother who turned into a food developer not only for her little one but for several others with her brand @hungrybumsindia, a Food For Tot that provides a nutritional, healthy and preservative free alternative to commercial baby food. Expanded sales to more than 35+ Indian cities in less than 5 years.



### Ms. Anwesha Banerjee

Anwesha Banerjee, is a qualified girl having done her Post Graduate Diploma in Journalism and also a course in Masters in Business Law.

A skilled professional with 13 years of experience in editorial roles, Anwesha is currently working as an Assistant Editor at Ei Samay, a Times Group publication from Kolkata, with a strong background in writing and editing news stories, columns, and features. In a long career so far, She has held many prestigious positions in her professional field.



To her credit, Anwesha has published more than 200 stories/post edits/ features on the issues of Human Trafficking, Gender Justice and Child Rights.

Anwesha had personal experiences with sexual harassment and molestation and that has heightened her compassion for trafficking survivors, predominantly underage victims sold for sexual exploitation. This empathy compelled her to write extensively on their behalf, advocating for justice and a better life.

What is remarkable about Anwesha as a women is that she had exposed a girl trafficking racket by personally conducting a interview of lady trafficker. The news-report on the said interview has been produced in the court as evidence and Anwesha appeared as a witness. Her early career stories on the issue of women and child trafficking helped various wings of the police force in tracking down traffickers and succeeded in nudging governments towards formulating survivor-friendly policies.



Healing Little Hearts: Children under Five years of age with congenital heart disease from financially challenged families are unable to afford the cost of surgeries. This initiative not only cures the child but also provides post-surgery care, allowing them to return to a normal life. Our partnered Hospitals include Narayana Superspeciality Hospital and R.N. Tagore Institute of Cardiac Sciences



• Bloodline: For over 15 years, Rotary Club of Calcutta Mahanagar has been running its Virtual Blood Bank. We have a large database of voluntary blood donors, taking advantage of technology, we have developed the Bloodline plus mobile App. This service is like "Uber" for blood. As you read this, you should download the Bloodline plus App because you never know when you may need blood for a near and dear person



• Mahanagar Netralaya: Our eye hospital, Hari Charan Garg Rotary MahanagarNetralaya is equipped with state-of-the-art machinery and staffed with a dedicated team. Our facilities include advanced equipment such as microscopes, refractometers, micro-surgery tools, and ancillary devices essential for both diagnostics and surgeries. Regular eye check-up camps are also conducted by us in remote villages and towns.



 LIFE beyond Cancer-Paediatric: Under this project children suffering from Cancer are provided with the best of medical facilities so that the little children are cured without incurring any cost. The children are treated at SKKM Hospital, NRS Medical College & Hospital Saroj Gupta Cancer Institute and Tata Medical Centre. It's a joint initiative carried out with Rotary club of Calcutta Jadavpur.



• Mahanagar Food Bank: This remarkable project is dedicated to distributing processed food to the underprivileged populations in Kolkata, Howrah, and Hooghly districts of West Bengal. The club has garnered generous support from various corporations like Britannia, Nestle, ITC, HUL, Mondelez (Cadbury), Sodexo, Protiviti and KFC to achieve significant milestones.



 Project Mangrove: This project integrates distributing Nypa seeds, bee boxes, and materials for waste management to preserve mangroves and improve local livelihoods. Project Mangrove, funded by a Global Grant, aims to provide alternative livelihoods while preserving mangroves in the Sundarbans, India.



• **GST** - **Grow and Save Trees:** To combat global warming, our club launched the GST initiative, distributing large number of plants and organizing tree plantations in various areas in and around Kolkata. We also handed over fruit grafted trees from time to time to farmers at a very subsidized cost. Additionally, we are issuing gift cards for tree planting to celebrate birthdays and anniversaries, making these occasions environmentally meaningful



• Rotary Vivekananda School: Our club along with Rotary Club of Calcutta Metro South runs Rotary Vivekananda School in Kultali, serve around more than 400 students. Along with the books, uniform, shoes, mid-day meals given to the students, various other upgrades like Inaugration of children's play area, launch of elearning facility with televisions are also some activities which are under process in the school.



Shelter Kits: During any natural calamities, a family is deprived of basic amenities and equipments, a shelter kit comes to their rescue. It is the most valuable possession, perhaps the only one, for the family displaced by disaster at the time of their need. One single kit helps the making of makeshift tents, clothing, cooking and eating, sanitation and storage and has brought immediate relief to distraught families. We have always 100 shelter kits readily available with us which can be sent to disaster areas when needed.



• **Udaan:** At Project Udaan, we give wings to children to fly and achieve their ambitions. This project supports education of more than 150 children from needy families every year. Till date we have given scholarships to more than 1800 students and the cost of the scholarship per student is Rs.10,000/- per annum.



Mission," has embarked upon one of the most comprehensive programs on Total Literacy and Quality Education. 6. Nayaput MMJB School 7. SaptagramSarweshwar High School and more 15 schools are underway.

"SURAKSHA" - Cervical Cancer Vaccination: The completion of the first phase of the "SURAKSHA" program, organized by RotaryMahanagar in collaboration with the Cancer Foundation of India, marks a significant milestone in our efforts to provide cervical cancer vaccination to girls aged 9-14. This initiative reflects our commitment to public health and underscores the importance of preventive measures in combating cervical cancer which effects hundreds and thousands of women each year. We plan to vaccinate more girls this year.



**Menstural Hygiene Management:** This is the project through which we want and have improved the Menstrual Health Management of young girls. The onset of menstruation, a significant milestone in a girl's life can be a source of anxiety and confusion, especially when faced with inadequate support and resources. The emotional toil of managing menstruation with dignity under these circumstances, leads to a girl underperforming in school andmissing out on attending school. The statistics shows that period, poverty, lack of support and resources leads to a 20% drop in girls attending school. When we visit school and provide them with sanitary product, we also educate them about hygiene and nutrition.



We provide top-notch computer education and training at Shikharpur Sukanta Smriti Computer Centre, empowering individuals with the skills they need to succeed in today's digital world.

Samman: At our center in Jalaram Trust Vocational Society, Behala, we have 12 sewing machines and 5 computers to empower underprivileged individuals. In addition, we offer comprehensive beautician classes to foster self-sufficiency in women. Our dedicated teachers ensure the highest quality instruction in computer, beautician, and sewing classes so that women can be self-sufficient and thrive on themselves.



- Project Dignity Rural Toilets: In response to Prime Minister Narendra Modi's Swachh Bharat Abhiyaan effort, Project Dignity has built over 5,000 toilets in rural West Bengal, helping over 20,000 villagers. The purpose of this project is to enhance living conditions and restore dignity.
- Adult Literacy: Education and adult literacy are fundamental to personal and societal growth. By empowering females with literacy skills, we open doors to better opportunities, improved quality of life, and stronger communities. Our efforts in this area are crucial, and together, we are making a real difference.
