

Adopted Village – Boynala



As part of our sustained commitment to community development, the Rotary Club of Calcutta Mahanagar has adopted Boynala – a tribal village near Kolkata with a vision of holistic upliftment and long-term empowerment. In furtherance of this initiative, a Vocational Training Centre, Computer Training and an Adult Literacy Centre have been successfully established in the village. These centers aim to equip residents with practical skills, promote self-reliance, and provide basic education opportunities to adults who were previously deprived of formal learning. Through structured training programs and literacy sessions, the initiative seeks to create pathways for improved livelihoods and enhanced quality of life. We also opened a community clinic where Allopathy, Homeopathy, Ear & Eye doctors and dentist visit regularly. Along with check-ups, we also provide medicines free of cost.



Eye Camp

Project Vrishti

Project Sparsh



We successfully conducted Project Sparsh – Mother & Child Care at Boynala, benefiting 70 women and children through focused healthcare awareness about nutrition.



Vocational Training



Over a period of six months, the Vocational Training Centre conducted 70 session training beautician and tailoring courses, with an average participation of 40 students per session. The programme contributed meaningfully to skill development, improved employability, and long-term empowerment of the beneficiaries.



GST-Grow and Save Trees



During the six-month period, the project focused on growing and sustaining 20 fruit-bearing trees, contributing to long-term ecological balance and community nutrition.



Global Grants

Utilisation of Global Grants & Services Delivered

- **Rural Toilet Project**

Global Grant funds supported the construction of 500 toilets, moving towards a target of 650, improving sanitation, hygiene, and dignity in rural communities.

- **Adult Literacy Program**

Grant assistance enabled 10,855 adult learners to receive basic education, empowering individuals with literacy skills essential for self-reliance and social inclusion.

- **Tridhara Dialysis Centre**

Global Grant funding supports the smooth functioning of the dialysis centre, ensuring regular and affordable dialysis for patients with chronic kidney disease.

- **Dialysis at Mayor's Clinic**

Nearly 2,500 patients have received dialysis treatment through grant-supported infrastructure, consumables, and medical services.

- **Project Mangrove**

Under this environmental initiative, 6,047 Nipa (mangrove) plants were planted, and 250 bee boxes were distributed to 25 beneficiaries, supporting ecological restoration and sustainable livelihoods.

- **Skill Development Program**

Out of 1,380 individuals trained, 73% have been successfully placed, demonstrating effective utilisation of grants towards employability and income generation.



- **Netralaya (Eye Care Services)**

Global Grant funding facilitated 550 eye surgeries and treatment of 200 OPD patients, restoring vision and improving quality of life. Each grant creates a chain of impact—from funding to service, from service to empowerment, and from empowerment to community transformation.



Health Care

As part of Rotary Mahanagar's commitment to inclusive healthcare, our club supported the GRIRR Centre, Howrah by providing essential physiotherapy equipment, enabling consistent and quality rehabilitation services. As reflected in the monthly GRIRR newsletters, 1,983 physiotherapy sessions for children and 68 sessions for adults were conducted under this Rotary-supported initiative. These sessions have contributed significantly to improved mobility, early intervention outcomes, and overall development, reinforcing Rotary's role in creating sustainable impact and hope for children and adults with special needs.




