From the President's Desk

Dear Rotarians, Partners and Friends
As I assimilate my thoughts in words of the activities since
I got installed as President, I can't believe that 6 months
of the Vibrant year are over! Time flies and how!!



Every avenue of Rotary - Service, Vocational & Fellowship, we have done well so far. While in project activities we continued with our hallmark project activities at Vivekananda Netralaya, Muni Sewa Ashram & the SRCC Hospital, we started some new projects as well. The year began with RCBN pledging to carry out 40+ pediatric cardiac surgeries at the Satya Sai Sanjeevani Hospital at Kharghar, a project which we inaugurated with the star cricket Shri Sunil Gavaskar and the humble Chairman Shri Shriniwas. Our AKS member and PP Suresh Gandhi was the prime donor for this CSR project.

In the field of community service (medical), we took up another new project – establishment of an Amnion Bank at the National Burns Center at Airoli, a joint project with the Rotary Club of Deonar. This bank will run parallel to our Skin Bank. The doctors at NBC under the guidance of Dr. Sunil Keswani are coordinating with Gynecologists from Navi Mumbai and Amnion donations have already started coming. I would like to thank PP Dr. Satya Agarwala, Rtn. Mehul Shah & Rtn. Hitesh Sharma for taking a lead in this project.

At Charter Day, we announced the setting up of a Retina Bank at the PNR Society at Bhavnagar. I am pleased to announce that under the CSR grant, the commitments have already been collected and the project is underway. Prime Mover for this project is PP Suresh Gandhi . We had planned to visit Bhavnagar but unfortunately our flight got canceled at the last minute. However, we plan to visit PNR Society soon.

We have been part of the District Blood Donation Drive project and every month at different railway stations, RCBNs banner is proudly displayed amongst other Rotary clubs of our district in the noble endeavor. We had a Mega dental camp at the National Girls High School where over 800 girls were screened for dental issues and oral hygiene instructions were given to all the students. 49 of the girls were taken to the D Y Patil Dental College & Hospital in Navi Mumbai for treatment of root canals and extractions of teeth. This was part of the District Dental Awareness project. Heartfelt gratitude to PP Hemendra Shah & PP Rukhsana Khan for managing and coordinating this project with invaluable support from VP Hemangini Desai. We have had grants to Vivekananda Netralaya of more than Rs. 10crore till date. The global grant for US \$194,934 has been cleared and the project has begun. This would be potentially our last project as Vivekananda Netralaya is becoming self sufficient.

We are continuing with the Bone Marrow & Oncology surgeries at the SRCC Hospital and as promised at Charter Day, we will start a new Global Grant by the end of January for Pediatric Oncology Surgery at the SRCC Hospital. Our Prime Mover is AKS members and PP Dr. Rajendra and Dr. Sonal Agarwal who have committed \$30,000 for this project. Total project cost will be over Rs. 1 crore. Soon next month, we shall be having two eye camps, Cataract & Squint correction – at Malegaon & Deolali in February.





We intend to carry out dental camps at our other Interact Schools and a dental and eye camp at the Worli Welfare Centre for BDD Chawl residents.

We plan to implement our commitment for the water projects in Palghar area as part of Integrated Rural Village Development Project, Prime Mover PP Suresh Gandhi with generous contributions from Rtn Gautam Gandhi and PP Dr. Rajendra & Dr. Sonal Agarwal. Our solar lamp project too is being actively pursued by Rtn AshoknDoshi & Rtn. Shirish Tare, A project worth Rs.20 lakhs of which Rs.15 lakhs have been committed by Dr. Rajendra and Dr. Sonal Agarwal

Jeevan Dhara, a project started last year is being continued this year, an initiative to help the students of the cheetah camp at Mankhurd and Govandi. This project was envisioned by Rtn A. K. Viswanathan and is being led by Rtn. Bharti Shah.

Vocational Service-this year we are focusing on reviving the Vocational service within the club. Under the Chairmanship of of the trio of PP Dr. Habil Khorakiwala, PDG Vijay Jalan, PP Vijay Lazarus & Rtn C I Gandhi, we had a champagne breakfast and round table meeting with members and spouses talking about themselves and their professions, followed by a presentation of what the Vocational Committee plans to do in the year - from talks to symposiums highlighting the ethics and essence of Rotary. We also had one cluster meeting of the Gabbar group over breakfast discussing different vocational avenues and ideas. Our newest find, Rtn Dr Vidya Mukund, too is actively involved planning this area of service and I have just been told that they have one more fun event planned in February.

Fellowship - well what can I say! The Fellowship
Committee team has kept us all on our toes in the last six
months. Installation in July, a superb Charter Day event
in August, a get together brunch in October, Venue courtesy
Sarla & Suresh Mittal, a trip to magical Mahableshwar in
November and the year ended with the Maskatis hosting us
at their lawns over asumptuous dinner and great music in a
Jingle n Mingle get together in December!
Thank you Dr Quresh & Sajeda for the lovely, lively evening.







Kudos to Fellowship Committee chair Dr. Anuradha Shah, Co chair Bhupendra Mehta and advisor PP Vijay Lazarus for meticulous planning and execution. None of this would've been possible without the steadfast support of all our cluster group chairs and Co chairs and cluster leader Rtn. Kamal Lakhotia. I shall let the pictures speak for the all the fun and joy that we shared in these events.

Coming up soon after OCV will be a one day picnic to Alibaug, courtesy the Khorakiwalas. PP Dr. Habil & PP Nafisa Khorakiwala are leaving no stone unturned as they host us on the 19th of January for a day filled with games, music, kite flying and full dhamal a la RCBN style! So gear up and get ready guys Our club has been blessed with members who take up responsibility and follow it up to the T! VP Hemangini Desai's name is synonymous with our Interact Schools & the Worli Welfare Centre. From distribution of advanced e learning kits at National Girls High School to organizing their installation , from being a part of the dental camp that we conducted to starting a new project – Maitri Sanskar, a value based education program at 4 of our 5 interact schools, she truly is a one woman army.

This year we started another value based initiative for slum children of the worli slums. We joined hands with Khel Khel Mein to set up a center at the Casa Vita Montessori School at Worli, where children of all ages from worli slums come and learn about the important moral values of life. Through art, craft, skits, field trips, we can see the children bloom and become better individuals. We had the opportunity of celebrating Diwali with them and it truly was a joyous event for the ones that attended just seeing how enthusiastic the children were, their enthusiasm rubbing off over our festive spirit as well.





If there is one constant in our club, it's our weekly meetings. Where other clubs struggle to find a good speaker every fortnightly, our Program Committee lead by PP Nafisa Khorakiwala, Co chair Rtn Yash Kale and all the members, effortlessly have found gems of speaker every Saturday, making every meeting unique! 

A Decade of Service: My Rotary Journey Joining Rotary around a decade ago has been one of the most transformative experiences of my life. Becoming Part of Something Bigger

I joined RCBN in 2013. This is the year when, my loving wife, Bhavna become President of Inner Wheel Club of Bombay North. She persuaded me to become member of RCBN. I still vividly remember the day I first attended a Rotary meeting. I was drawn to the warmth of the members and the shared commitment to improving our community. I really enjoyed listening to speakers from different walks of life which helped me understanding different perspective. What started as a simple curiosity quickly grew into a deep sense of belonging. Initial two to three years where difficult as it took long time for me to develop relationship with other members. This was the record not only at RCBN but also at our District level. These are multi year projects and therefore execution is over a number of years. Seeing first-hand how our collective efforts improved the lives of so many, reinforced my belief in the

power of teamwork and service. It was during these moments that I truly understood Rotary's motto, "Service Above Self."

Leading with Purpose as President
Serving as president of RCBN was both a great honour
and a tremendous responsibility. During my
tenure, I had the opportunity to lead a team of dedicated
members who were united by a common
goal: to make a lasting impact in our community.
As our past has been commendable in all areas, be
it Fellowship, Projects, TRF, Vocation etc., we decided to
have our theme for 2019-2020: to Consolidate our present
activities, ensure Consistency and enable their Sustainability.
I believe, we achieved what we set out to do.

End of 2019-2020 and whole of 2020-2021 has been a very difficult period for all of us due to COVID 19. In spite of that we took up the challenge and decided not to hinder our activities; however, we had to modify significantly how we operate. We adapted ourselves to New Normal. This also led us to come out with our theme for 2020-2021 which is Beyond Horizons to establish relationship with partners, Leaders of Leaders to develop young leaders, and Virtual Vibrancy to make our club technological savvy.


Of course, leadership came with its challenges.


