"EYE DONATION: MYTHS & FACTS" BY DR. NEETI SINGLA: 05-SEP-23

A very informative address cum an exhaustive presentation on "Eye Donation – Myths & facts" was given by the chief guest Dr. Neeti Singla, SPO National Program for control of Blindness & Visually impaired. Various old & folklore myths & superstitions connected with donation of eyes were informed & clarified by the Guest Speaker. Eyes never die. We need to create an awareness & spread of eye donation to give vision to the blind. Members from the audience pledged to donate their eyes. A highly informative & interesting question & answer session followed. Same had to be curtailed due to time constraints.

2. Eye Donation fortnight is celebrated every year in our country from 25 Aug. to 8 Sep. There are 1.1 million people in the country who are blind due to corneal diseases. 32000 are added every year said the Guest Speaker. Hence, we need one lakh per year to reduce this corneal blindness. So, eye donation is imperative to fill this shortfall. Thus the awareness campaign is important. There are t. I of 11 eyes banks in Punjab with only 3 being in govt. sector. Even people with diabetes. & cataract operations can donate their eyes.

ROTARY MOTTOES

The first motto of Rotary International, "He Profits Most Who Serves Best," was approved at the second Rotary Convention, held in Portland, Oregon, in August 1911. The phrase was first stated by a Chicago Rotarian, Art Sheldon, who made a speech in 1910 which included the remark, "He profits most who serves his fellows best." At about the same time, Ben Collins, president of the Rotary Club of Minneapolis, Minnesota, commented that the proper way to organize a Rotary club was through the principle his club had adopted-"Service, Not Self." These two slogans, slightly modified, were formally approved to be the official mottoes of Rotary at the 1950 Convention in Detroit-"He Profits Most Who Serves Best" and "Service Above Self." The 1989 Council on Legislation established "Service Above Self" as the principal motto of Rotary, since it best explains the philosophy of unselfish volunteer service.

Rotary is a global network of 1.4 million neighbors, friends, leaders, and problem-solvers who see a world where people unite and take action to create lasting change – across the globe, in our communities, and in ourselves.

Solving real problems takes real commitment and vision. For more than 110 years, Rotary's people of action have used their passion, energy, and intelligence to take action on sustainable projects. From literacy and peace to water and health, we are always working to better our world, and we stay committed to the end.
