
Eventful Beginning Of A Vibrant Rotary Year

If we are to truly change the world with The Magic of Rotary, it's up to all of us to foster a sense of belonging in our clubs. But every club should take its own path to get there, and the Action Plan can help you find your way. What does that look like?

Take for instance the Rotary Club of Beveren-Waas in Belgium. It was chartered in 1974 but has evolved with the times, developing both a strategic plan and a membership plan. To find new members, the club analyzes the city's professions to help focus its search, and all new members are quickly assigned tasks and roles.

The club also mixes up meeting times, alternating between evening and afternoon sessions, making them accessible for all members.

Sometimes, circumstances force clubs to make changes. But as people of action, we know that behind every obstacle is an opportunity.

The Rotary Club of Holyoke in Massachusetts was forced from its meeting place because of rising costs after the COVID-19 pandemic, but members took this setback and turned it into a strength. The club started meeting in a library community room that was available for no charge and catering lunch from a nearby deli. Lunch costs \$10 per person but it's optional, so no one has to spend money to attend a meeting. What a great way to work toward being "fair to all concerned."

Since making this change, the Holyoke club has gained 13 members. I suspect part of its membership growth is due to the club's sense of inclusivity — the first step toward belonging.

If you ask members what they expect from the club experience, you might find that your club doesn't meet expectations. Think of this as an opportunity to reshape your club in exciting ways, as alternative club models are making a positive impact.

For example, a Rotary Fellowship called Beers Rotarians Enjoy Worldwide, or BREW, has worked closely with the Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene Rotary Action Group for the past eight years to assist with clean water projects. In that time, BREW has funneled 25 percent of its dues to those initiatives.

BREW is one of many examples of members pursuing belonging to improve the world.

I can't stress enough the importance of belonging. Clubs become simply irresistible when all members feel that they are exactly where they need to be. To me, belonging is the spark that ignites The Magic of Rotary.

As you receive feedback from club members and the community you serve, I urge you to pursue that spark. The Action Plan can help you find the path to success, and if you light your way with the spirit of belonging, that path will lead to a bright future for your club, your community, and the world.

Birth of a New Club

Rotary links 1.4 million members to form an organization of international scope. It started with the vision of one man — Paul Harris. The Chicago attorney formed the Rotary Club of Chicago on 23 February 1905, so professionals with diverse backgrounds could exchange ideas, form meaningful, lifelong friendships, and give back to their communities.

Almost 120 years later there are 46000+ clubs across more than 220 countries. In India we have more than 3000 Rotary clubs. And in our Dist.3141 there are 119 clubs, with new clubs being formed each year adding to the worldwide membership strength of this grand old & yet young in spirit organization, Rotary International.

Traditionally Rotary clubs are locality based, formed within a geographical limit. In the Rotary year 2017-18 Dist. 3141 took an initiative to deviate from the norm. The idea of a theme based Rotary club in Mumbai was an outcome of a Dist. event, Kala Sangam. Kala Sangam, an art fair of visual arts in various forms was a first of its kind District event held in October 2017, under the leadership of then DG, Rtn Praful Sharma. The event was headed by Rtn. Rajendra Unnikrishnan & curated by art curator Neeta Pathare. The participation was open to Rotarians & non-Rotarians.

A Rotary club of artists Kalakars with membership pan Mumbai. As a first step forward, a day was fixed for an interest meeting with interested persons. Each one reached out to other artist friends inviting them to the meeting. There was a good attendance at the first interest meeting held at Mantra, Powai. Stalwarts & seasoned Rotarians from the District spoke about Rotary, its history, mission & opportunities it provides for friendship, service & growth. As mentioned, this was a pioneering effort towards expanding Rotary footprint beyond the geographical terrain into (also) theme based clubs.









There are some specific requirements for starting a new Rotary club. One strong recommendation is having a sponsor club. The support of a designated sponsor club increases the success rate of new clubs by as much as 10 percent. RCB Powai was approached by the District team to be the sponsor club for this new theme based club, RC Mumbai Kalakars, during the Dist. Membership seminar of then incoming DG Rtn. Shashi Sharma. Miracle President Rtn. Hanuman Tripathi who was then the PE instantaneously agreed to the proposal. And thus, began journey of adding another feather & first against the name of RCB Powai. Yours truly was requested by the District to take on the mantle of the mentor of this new club and hand hold the club for 3 years.

The mandatory requisite to form a new club is 20 confirmed members. After 2 interest meetings we had a confirmed list of almost 30 prospective members. They were from varied art backgrounds & even professions, from doctors to educators & corporates. The list included professional & hobby painters, singers, dancers, poets, musicians, designers and others.

Membership forms of 25 confirmed members & dues with an application letter for the charter of this new club were sent to Rotary International. Rotary Club of Mumbai Kalakars (RCMK) received its charter on 1st October 2018 with . Rtn. Neeta Pathare as the Charter President & Rtn. Poonam Kakodkar as Charter Secretary of the club.

The club today is almost 6 years old; using art as a platform to serve the community across all the avenues of Rotary. They have luminaries from different art fields as their honorary members Shankar Mahadevan, Shantanu Moitra, Brinda Miller, Vikrant Shitole etc. RCMK has its own unique identity and presence in Dist. 3141 and has also been mentioned by Past RI President Shekhar Mehta in his address at different forums.

RCMK has carved a niche for itself in our District and keeps growing & doing good and different work, always using their foundation, art, to serve & impact lives around.

Members & membership in Rotary truly reflects what Paul Harris expressed in his last message"The club grew by leaps and bounds, and representatives of different nationalities, religions, and political faiths came in. Complete tolerance prevailed. Our peace and tranquility soon burst their bounds, however. We ceased to be content with isolationism and began Community Service, built upon the rock of fellowship and goodwill, and that foundation and goodwill, and that foundation has never been shaken." DISTRICT FOCUS AREA - LEARN

LEARN - Imparting Life Skills

In this issue of Powai Tarang, the spotlight is on LEARN, one among the twelve Focus Areas identified by Vibrant Year DG Rtn. Chetan Desai. LEARN is a project where the main theme is of imparting Life Skills Training to adolescent children using Drama, through the Rotary Network. The program is the brainchild of the very well-known Actor Swaroop (Sampat) Rawal, now Dr. Swaroop Rawal, who has done her doctorate in this subject. The program aims to train teachers from schools who in turn will act as Master Trainers for training other teachers in their school and community. Each training module the Master Trainer goes through comprises a total of 6 sessions with two sessions being held every month followed by one refresher session. At the district level, Rtn. Leena Shah from Bombay Sea Face is the District Coordinator leading the effort. Rotarian Nalini Raghavan from our Club is the Co-Chair central for this very important focus area.











DISTRICT FOCUS AREA - LEARN

The first batch of 43 will be completing their session in the first week of August and will be recognized by our DG. Rtn Nalini Raghavan and Rtn. Vidya Balkhande have also been attending these sessions and will be certified trainers very shortly. They will be reaching out to underprivileged schools in and around Powai to conduct such workshops and also more teachers, if possible. LEARN offers an innovative and comprehensive framework for fostering student wellness.

LEARN through Drama equips adolescents with adaptive behaviors necessary for navigating life's challenges effectively. Among several positive feedback received from teachers from schools who have been trained, a small extract "The reflection exercise made me realize how important it is to take time to think about our feelings and experiences. I appreciate how the workshop creates a safe space for adolescents to share their thoughts and feelings without fear of judgment". The program is designed to cater to adolescents from all sections of society.

In a telecon with Rtn. Leena Shah, who is passionate about this cause, I came to understand that the plan is to train a 100 Master Trainer in the course of the Vibrant Year. The expenses for the program are fully borne by Rotary and different clubs come forward to support the same by way of co-sponsoring the sessions. The program is free for enrolled teachers and they also get a workbook to help them implement their learnings. Further, Nalini and Vidya have already started applying their learning in small ways at Asha NGO and Green Lawns Schools. Both are personally excited about the whole initiative and raring to go under the guidance of President Susan Tripathi.

Empowering Farmers through Sustainable Income Generation: A Collaborative Effort



As part of Aurionpro's CSR initiative, Aurocares, we partnered with the Rotary Club of Powai to organize a tree plantation activity on August 6th, 023. The initiative targeted farmers in Sonshiv village, Wada block, district Palghar, aiming to address the significant challenges they face, such as unpredictable weather, water scarcity, and market fluctuations. By introducing fruit cultivation, we sought to provide these farmers with sustainable income sources and diversify their livelihoods.

The partnership with the Rotary Club of Powai was crucial to the project's success. Their 12 members, along with 22 volunteers from Aurocares, were actively involved in the planting and distribution of 2500 saplings among 50 identified needy farmers. The saplings included a diverse range of fruit-bearing trees, providing the farmers with a variety of crops to cultivate.

The Diganta Swaraj Foundation played a pivotal role in this initiative, selecting the farmers based on their socio-economic status and land availability. They also conducted comprehensive training sessions to educate the farmers on modern agricultural practices and the proper care of the saplings. This training ensured that the farmers could effectively manage the new crops and maximize their yields.

This initiative is a testament to the power of collaboration and commitment to creating lasting, positive change in our communities. Together, we are planting the seeds for a greener, more prosperous future.









Janmashtami has been my most favourite festival all my life. The sweet memories of this festival when I was growing up have etched in my mind. My parents celebrated it in a grand way. My mother used to start preparations two weeks prior to the festival. She used to make all powders at home to make various preparations. Two days before the actual festival she would start making different kinds of sweets and savouries. There used to be at least 20 item made for Krishna. No one was allowed to taste anything till they were offered to God on the day of his birth. The festival is always celebrated at night because Krishna was born at midnight.

On the day of festival, while our mother was busy making stuff in the kitchen, my elder siblings and myself would start making a beautiful mandap to install baby Krishna. We used to have a small table kept upside down to make a mandap. We would tie banana stems with leaves to the four legs of the table. Tie many garlands of Jasmine and Chrysanthemum all around. We would tie all the fruits, laddus and chaklis prepared at home on the top. By 9 the dinner also would be ready. All of us would be dressed in our special attire reserved for the festivals. Our father would take bath and start the pooja. This is the only time we had seen our father doing an elaborate pooja chanting all the shlokas from memory. We would all wait impatiently for the pooja to get over as the aroma of all the Prasad prepared by mother used to be so tempting. Another memory in my mind is the way our mother used to distribute all the laddus and other preparations in separate boxes for each one of us. We used to keep our boxes hidden from the others for the fear of them getting stolen. The next day was celebrated as Krishna aarti. Our neighbours and extended family members visited our home for Prasad. I have continued to celebrate Janmashtami till now. But I am yet get the same feeling, same heady aromas, same taste that I had experienced as a child.















Folktale – Gasagase Paayasa



Gasagase means poppy seeds(khus khus). Paayasa means kheer. This poppy seeds kheer is typically from Karnataka. We make it on all festivals and on special occasions. My mother used to make it on our birthdays without fail. So, this is my most favourite kheer.

Before sharing the recipe, I would like to share a story of Gasagase paayasa. Once there was a monkey. She was invited by her friend on a festival where she tasted Gasagase paayasa for the first time. She liked it very much and learnt how to prepare. She went to the market and bought all the ingredients and made delicious paayasa in a big vessel. The aroma of the paayasa was so tempting that she took a spoonful of boiling paayasa and put in her mouth. Oh...myshe burnt her tongue badly!! Poor monkey got so upset and threw the whole lot of paayasa into a nearby pond! After some time, she saw a small bit of paayasa was stuck to the spoon. She was tempted to taste it again. She just loved the taste and repented for throwing the whole lot into the pond. And you won't believe what she did next! She went to the pond and drank the whole lot of water! Poor monkey had a bloated tummy for many many days!!










SANSKRITI- Art, Culture, Heritage

Recipe Gasagase Paayasa





- 1. Jaggery...2 cups
- 2. Poppy seeds...2 tablespoons
- 3. Rice...2 tablespoons
- 4. Fresh coconut gratings...2 cups
- 5. Half spoon cardamom powder
- 6. Cashew nuts...about 10
- 7. Raisins....about 20
- 8. Pure ghee...1 tablespoon



- 1. Wash and soak poppy seeds and rice for 15 minutes. Put them in a mixer and grind to fine paste.
- 2. Add coconut gratings to the above and grind to a smooth paste by adding water.
- 3. In a vessel with thick bottom add jaggery and water enough to immerse it. Boil this till jaggery is fully melted. (You can filter this to remove if there is any undesired particles present in jaggery.)
- 4. Add the smooth paste of coconut, poppy seeds, and rice to the above and bring it to boil. Keep stirring the mixture. Let it boil for 4 minutes before turning off the burner. If the kheer is too thick you can add water. (Optional: You can add milk to get the desired thickness, but only after you stop boiling it.)
- 5. Heat ghee in a ladle, add cashew nuts and raisins. Let them turn golden brown. Add this to your paayasa. Sprinkle cardamom powder over it and keep it covered. Serve it at the end of your meal in bowls. Make sure it is cooled down before you serve!!
