Rotary Club of Bombay Queen City Donation of equipment for Tissue Culture & Gene Manipulation facility Sponsored by INOX Air Products Pvt Ltd. Project Report

One out of hundred children are born every year with congenital heart disease (CHD). This is the commonest birth defect and leading cause of child mortality in India. As per current birth rate, over 2.4 lakh children are born every year with CHD. It is imperative to reduce the incidence of this mammoth problem which cannot be done unless we know the causes of CHD. CHD is understood to be multifactorial and there are very less studies for Indian population. Sri Sathya Sai Sanjeevani Research Foundation have established world's largest Biobank for CHD. The centre in Navi Mumbai is pursuing Genomic Studies for past 3 years. The proposed expansion into tissue culture and advanced PCR techniques aims to complement and extend the findings from genomic analyses. The lab will focus on in vitro functional studies of candidate genes implicated in CHD, using cell lines such as human cardiac progenitor cells, fibroblast culture and more for transfection and functional validation experiments. These additions will significantly enhance their ability to bridge the gap between genetic variants and functional outcomes in cardiac development.

The objective of the project was to establish **Tissue culture and Gene Manipulation lab** at Sri Sathya Sai Sanjeevani Research Foundation . The lab is established and all equipment have been installed. The equipment installed and the lab accessories received are as follows : Refrigerated Centrifuge with Rotors, Inverted Microscope with fluorescence, Incubator Shaker Orbitor, Multimode Microplate Reader, Vaccum Pump with filtration assembly, Micropipette, LN2 containers, Digital 3D Shakers, Hot Plate Magnetic Stirrer, Universal Water Bath, Multichannel Pipettes, Refrigerator, Power packs, Gel chambers, Western Blotting unit, CO2 Incubator & CO2 cylinder, Advance Computer for computational biology, Hot Air Oven, Biosafety Cabinet, Pipette Aid, Picofuge, PCR machine, Air-conditioner & Lab Chairs. The establishment of a tissue culture & gene manipulation facility will enhance the functional research capabilities of the current genomics lab. It will allow for the execution of complex experiments necessary to validate genetic discoveries and to model mechanism at cellular level. Additionally, tissue culture is critical for implementing advanced techniques like RNA interference, which are increasingly being used to model CHD-associated gene defects. Without such a facility, the lab is limited to observational and association-based studies without the ability to mechanistically verify findings, thus hampering the translational potential of ongoing research. Over 1000 tests will be carried out annually.

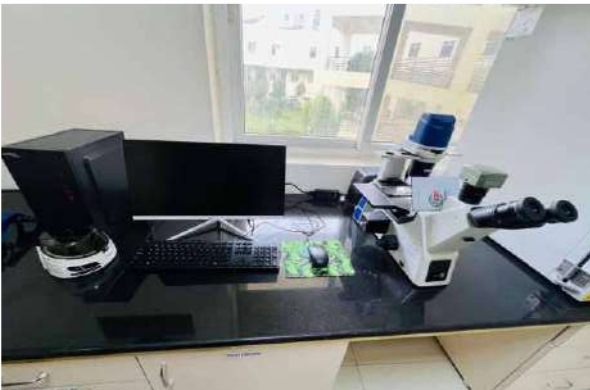

1. Invite friends, colleagues, or neighbours to participate in one of your club's projects.
2. Keep a supply of the Start with Rotary postcards and wallet cards, and give them to potential members.
3. Encourage prospective members who live outside your geographic area to visit the RI Web site, view membership videos, and complete a prospective member form.
4. Ask your district membership chair to contact qualified candidates who have come to the district's attention through an online referral.
5. Talk with potential members about Rotary's humanitarian work
6. Invite professional women in your community to one of your club meetings. Initiate projects that focus on women's issues, and invite prominent women in the community to participate, speak, or lead.
7. Maintain contact with all local alumni of Rotary's educational and service programs, and organize events for them. Work with qualified candidates to help them join your club.
8. Advertise special programs or projects on social networking sites such as Facebook, LinkedIn, or Twitter and invite visitors to your club meetings and events. Learn about RI's official social networking pages.
9. Sponsor an open house (or an open meeting with a special guest) that caters to a demographic group or classification that isn't represented in the club.
10. Maintain a Web site for your club so that interested individuals can easily find out who you are, what you do, and what inspires you.

The problem was putting together Turkish and Italian young people, because they looked at one another as very different. The first day was tense; it was clear that they didn't like each other. But after a few days, they began to discover that they had the same tastes and the same dreams.

When the last day came, they sang John Lennon's "Imagine" together and performed a skit they'd written about the cultural differences between their countries. It was one of the most beautiful things I can remember.
