On July 15, 2025, Rotary Club of Dharmapuri Midtown gathered with school children and community members to celebrate Kamarajar's birth anniversary, honoring his timeless principles of education for all, social equity, and dedicated public service.

The Life & Legacy of a Legend

Kumaraswami Kamaraj was born on July 15, 1903 in Virudhunagar, Tamil Nadu. Despite losing his father at age six, young Kamaraj rose from humble beginnings to become one of India's greatest leaders. He left school at twelve to support his mother, yet his thirst for knowledge never diminished.

Journey to Leadership

Inspired by Mahatma Gandhi and the freedom struggle, Kamaraj became a full-time political worker at just 18 years old. He participated in major independence movements including the Salt Satyagraha and was imprisoned multiple times for his unwavering commitment to India's freedom. He served as Chief Minister of Madras (Tamil Nadu) from 1954-1963, a period that transformed the state forever.

Enduring Impact

Kamarajar passed away on October 2, 1975, but his contributions continue to shape Tamil Nadu's prosperity. He transformed the state from a food-deficit region to self-sufficiency in food production, making it one of India's most industrialized and urbanized states.

Education Pioneer

Revolutionized education with free schooling, free uniforms, and the innovative midday meal scheme.

Statesman

Became "Kingmaker of India," instrumental in bringing leaders to national prominence.

Social Reformer

Fought for equality, breaking caste barriers and ensuring education reached the poorest communities.

Man of Integrity

Known for simplicity, honesty, and genuine concern for the common person.

The Education Revolution

When Kamaraj took office in 1954, Tamil Nadu faced a crisis: 6,000 villages had no schools, and literacy stood at a mere 7%. He set out on an ambitious mission to bring education to every village, no matter how remote. His vision was simple: "No child should have to walk more than 3 miles to reach their school."

The Midday Meal Scheme: A Game Changer

Kamarajar introduced free midday meals to address malnutrition and encourage poor families to send children to school. This groundbreaking initiative resulted in school enrollment increase from dropout rates of 40% to 22%, nearly 100% enrollment for children aged 6-11, and greater impact on backward class and Muslim community students.

Kamarajar believed that education was the only weapon against caste discrimination. He rejected the hereditary education policy and ensured that every child, regardless of background, had access to quality schooling.


