10th April 2025: Anemia Mukt Abhiyaan at Aadhaar Trust

On 10th April 2025, a successful Anemia Testing Camp was organized at Aadhaar Trust under the Anemia Mukt Abhiyaan initiative. A total of 121 individuals benefited from this health drive, which aimed at creating awareness and early detection of anemia.

The hemoglobin testing was carried out under the expert guidance of Advisor PDG Dr. Bal Inamdar. Among the participants, 25 individuals were identified with low hemoglobin levels. To address this, they were provided with essential iron supplements along with proper dietary guidance and counseling to help improve their health.


