4th August 2025: Anemia Mukt Bharat Abhiyan at Shri Vivekanand High School, Manekpur Sarai, Umargam, Gujarat

Under the "Anemia-Free India" (Anemia Mukt Bharat Abhiyan) initiative, a comprehensive health project was conducted on 4th August 2025 at 10:00 a.m. at Shri Vivekanand High School, Manekpur, benefitting 239 girls.

During the camp, hemoglobin (Hb) levels of all beneficiaries were tested, and appropriate medication was provided based on individual results. Considering the large turnout, two camps were organized simultaneously to ensure smooth operations. Qualified technicians conducted the testing, and each participant received personal guidance on maintaining healthy hemoglobin levels.

The team also created awareness about anemia prevention, emphasizing the importance of a balanced diet, iron-rich foods, and proper nutritional care.

Members of the Rotary Club of Mumbai West Coast interacted with the School Principal and staff, sharing insights into various community service activities undertaken by the club.

Perhaps the loveliest aspect of my journey has been Rotary. Joining Rotary has provided me with a new identity—a way to take my service from the courtroom and translate it into society at large. Rotary has shown me that service is not only an act, but a way of life. It has provided me with a lifetime of friendships, chances to learn from great leaders, and most importantly, the satisfaction of giving back to society. Larry A. Lunsford, a member of the Rotary Club of Kansas City-Plaza, Missouri, USA, is the selection of the nominating committee to become Rotary International's president for 2027-28. He will officially become the president-nominee on 15 September if no other candidates challenge him.

Lunsford attended Truman State University in Kirksville, Missouri, on an academic scholarship, earning bachelor's and master's degrees in accounting. He first encountered Rotary when he received a Rotary Foundation Ambassadorial Scholarship to spend the 1981-82 academic year at the University of Newcastle in Australia.

A certified public accountant, Lunsford spent seven years working for Ernst & Young before joining a family-owned business, Bernstein-Rein Advertising, in 1990. He is currently executive vice president and chief financial officer for the Bernstein group of companies. He has held positions on the boards of the Kansas City Spirit Festival and the Variety Club as well as serving as director of a local bank and treasurer of the Epilepsy Foundation for the Heart of America. He has also served on Truman State University's alumni and foundation boards and received the university's Distinguished Service Award.
