L.E.A.R.N. PROJECT MAKING MAGIC WITH ROTARY CLUB DISTRICT 3141

L.E.A.R.N. Project was a HIT at DISTRICT 3141: Kudos to Rtn Leena Shah from our Club.



The Rotary Club District 3141 recently conducted an impactful program titled "LEARN: Life Skills Education for Adolescents through Rotary Network.

Forty teachers received specialized training to implement life skills education in their classrooms, with the program reaching 450 teachers and 2,000 children in its first phase. This initiative was carried out under the leadership of DG Rotarian Chetan Desai and administered by Rotarian Leena Shah.

This intensive six-day program, led by Master Trainer Dr. Swaroop Sampat Rawal, extended over three months, targeting marginalized schools and children. The program emphasized the critical need for mental health resources for children and adolescents in India. According to UNICEF data, approximately 29 million of the 447 million Indian children and adolescents suffer from some form of psychiatric illness at any given time. This program recognized the urgency of addressing these issues and provided teachers with the tools to support students' mental, emotional, social, and mental well-being. The notes were provided to teachers as a book-"Life Skill Education through Drama" ensuring that the knowledge and techniques shared during the training would continue to benefit students long after the program's conclusion.

Life skills education, as outlined in the program, includes essential competencies such as understanding and managing emotions, effective communication, self-awareness, empathy, decision-making, problem solving, critical thinking, and creative thinking. These skills are crucial for promoting healthy child and adolescent development and preventing mental health disorders.

The focus of the program, encapsulated in the slogan "A Counsellor in Each Classroom," highlights the belief that life skills education can empower teachers to act as counsellors, providing crucial mental health support to their students. Through this initiative, Rotary Club District 3141, under the guidance of DG Chetan Desai and the administration of Leena Shah, has taken significant steps toward improving the mental health and well-being of children in marginalized communities, equipping them with the skills necessary to navigate the challenges of everyday life.
