Rtn. Mahesh Kokate, Director - Community Service I



Mr. Mayank Gandhi



ayank Gandhi was an international urban planner who turned into a social activist. He has worked on many reforms including the Maharashtra RTI and many other laws. In 2011, along with Anna Hazare and Kejriwal, he started India against Corruption (IAC) movement and later on became part of the National Executive of the AAP party. But in 2016, he quit politics completely and started his own NGO, Global Vikas Trust (GVT) to work in some of the worst areas of India for farmer welfare.

Since then, GVT has been instrumental in multiplying farmer annual incomes from Rs. 38,600 to over Rs. 3,90,000 per acre (a

ten times increase as per TISS assessment report). With his model of changing cropping pattern, he has been successful in removing over 30000 farmer families from the poverty trap in over 4700+ villages of Maharashtra and MP. This has been achieved by planting over 6.05+ crore fruit trees, training and supporting farmers to increase their incomes.

A new, state-of-the-art Krishikul farmer training centre has been constructed to train farmers from all over the country to multiply their incomes by four to ten times.

Driven by the belief that "India Can Wait No More!" Mayank Gandhi continues to inspire change at the grassroots level.

Dr. Ramesh Bhat is a distinguished academician and institutional leader with over four decades of experience in teaching, research, consulting, and governance. Currently the Vice-Chancellor of NMIMS and Provost-Management Education, he previously served as Dean of the School of Business Management at NMIMS. A former Professor at IIM Ahmedabad for over two decades, Dr. Bhat has also held faculty appointments at leading institutions including ISB Hyderabad and the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.

His research spans corporate finance, health finance, and public policy, and he has consulted extensively for organizations such as WHO, USAID, ADB, and the Government of India.
