SAKSHAM DIVYANG - DO KADAM AUR

Rotary Club of Delhi Central and Rotary Delhi Central Charitable Trust celebrated the Annual Event 'Saksham Divyang -- Do Kadam Aur' on 24 November 2024 at Munjal Auditorium in Gkl.

The event was held to create more awareness about the Projects that Rotary Club of Delhi Central's Members undertake through RDCCT and to raise fubds through benevolent Donors and organisations. The projects supported by the Charitable Trust are: New Generation Artificial Limbs for the underprivileged disabled, free heart Surgeries performed by Padmashree Rtn Dr Ganesh Mani on children afflicted with Congenital Heart Disease, Polio Reparative Surgeries that help Polio afflicted Patients to walk again --performed by Dr Matthew Varghese at St Stephen's Hospital, providing Cochlear Implants to the underprivileged hearing impaired, Nutritious Food Packages for TB Patients and families every month, Running a free of cost Homeopathy Clinic in the underprivileged communities, supporting our water conservation and skill development projects.

The Chief Guest at the event was Padmashree Shri Muralikant Rajaram Petkar, whose inspirational life was essayed by Actor Kartik Aryan in the movie 'Chandu Champion' and Guest of Honour were DG Rtn Dr Mahesh P. Trikha and First Lady Rtn Sujata Trikha. It was an incredible evening with magical performances by the Drummers Circle, soul stirring songs rendered beautifully by a girl with Special Needs, Benzy and outstanding performances and choreography by Wheelchair and Hearing Impaired Dancers — a part of 'We Are One'. The Auditorium that can hold 400 people

was packed to capacity, the high tea was delicious and the Club had also invited 50 children from Prajna Foundation to participate in the event. The MOC for the evening was PP Rtn Vineet Bhagat who compared the entire show in his signature style. The event also started with two videos on Rotary Divyang Kendra playing in a loop until the customary national anthem; the videos were a result of the creative skills of PP Rtn Mohit Luthra and Anurag Srivastav.
