RDK HOMEOPATHY CAMPS

The Homeopathy Camps are running seamlessly and the number of patients is also increasing by the day; it doesn't mean that there are more people falling ill, it's just that our camps have become well known in the areas where they are held and there are many patients who visit again for long term treatment.

1 February : Homeopathy Camp was held in Tahirpur and 50 patients visited for treatment out of which 8 were those who came for the second time.

6 February : A camp was held at Lahirpur where 41 patients visited and 6 were repeat.

11 February: A camp was held at Lehri Colony at which 48 patients were administered medicines and 6 were repeat patients.

13 February : Camp was held at Vishwas Nagar Colony 30 new patients visited our of which 15 visited for the second time.

18 February: A camp was held at Lehri Colony where 28 patients were treated for minor ailments and 6 out of these were repeat patients.

20 February: Yet another successful camp at Tahirpur where 50 patients were given treatment and free medicines and 6 out of them visited for the second time.

We are grateful to Dr Jyoti, Khushi Tyagi and the entire team of Homeopathy for their invaluable service. They have seen more than 2000 patients in a little over 5 months of consistent efforts
