




CLUB PRESIDENT RI YEAR 2024-25

Rtn Padmini Parameswaran was born in Chennai and brought up largely in North India. Her father, Mr. R. Natrajan, a qualified Russian trained Electrical Engineer from BIT Sindhri, spent most of his professional life working at the American Company Kaiser, then at TATA Steel in Jamshedpur and eventually with one of India's largest PSU —Bharat Heavy Electricals in Haridwar. Padmini went to school in Hyderabad and in Haridwar and for her degree and future qualifications to Delhi University. She has completed a BA and MA in English and then a Bachelor and Master of Education in later years because as an Army Wife she opted to take on a profession that could take her to different stations where her husband, Col. S. Parameswaran, was posted. Her last tenure as a Teacher was at Springdales School Dhaula Kuan.

In the year 1998, Padmini began her career with British Education when she took over as the Deputy Director at Middlesex University's (UK) Regional Office in India. She set up offices, under her own leadership as Regional Director South Asia, for Brighton International Business School, University of Central Lancashire, Northumbria University, University of East London and is currently employed at Teesside University where she is also the World Lead for all the Regional Offices across South Asia, China, South East Asia, West Africa, Middle East and North Africa. The universities have benefitted greatly over the years and have all surpassed the international student recruitment numbers and partnerships over the last two and half decades.

Padmini's experience in Rotary spans over a few decades. She was an Interactor at School and President of her Interact Club, she was a Rotaractor in college for a brief period of time and then a R'Ann at the Rotary Club of Delhi South East where her husband was a Member from 2008 and until 2022. Both, Padmini and Subra, became Major Donors in the RI Year 2013-14 when her husband, Col. S. Parameswaran was the President of Rotary Club of Delhi South East. She was pinned as a Rotarian in the RI Year 2017 by Rtn Dr Manju Mani and has been a proud Member of the Rotary Club of Delhi Central ever since. She and her Partner, Col Subra, have now attained Major Donor Level 2 in the RI Year 2021




PROFILE CLUB SECRETARY RI YEAR 2024-25

- 1. Rtn Col Pradeep Batra was born in Jaipur where his father had settled after being displaced from Pakistan. He left his home in service to the nation at an incredible young age of 10 years. He joined the Indian Army through Sainik School Chittorgarh, National Defence Academy (NDA) and Indian Military Academy (IMA). He was commissioned in the year 1980 in the elite Bihar Regiment (of Galwan fame) but was later selected to be transferred to the Military Intelligence.
- 2. He graduated from National Defence Academy, Khadakvasla and Indian Military Academy Dehradun. Later he completed M Sc (Military Sciences) from Defence Services Staff College, Wellington (1992), MBA in (HR & Finance), Post Graduate Diploma in Computer Applications, Diploma in Hospital Administration from Apollo group of Hospitals. He has also done courses in Media Communication, Defence Procurement and Corporate & Industrial Safety, Security, & Fire Protection Management System.



SANGHOSHTI - DISTRICT GRANTS MANAGEMENT, STEWARDSHIP AND TRF 2ND LEVEL SEMINAR & CSR INITIATIVES.

The event was organised by DGE Rtn Dr Mahesh Trikha and sponsored by Rotary Clubs of RCD South East, RCD Regency Next, RCD Humanity, RC Gurgaon Cosmopolitan and RC Faridabad Arth, was held on Sunday 9th June 2024 at PHD House, New Delhi.

The evebt was conducted seamlessly by District Secretary and MoC for the event Rtn Sanjeev Jawahar. The excitement was for getting the first Programs of Scale Grant of \$ 2 million from TRF --- it's the first in Asia and First given to a non-African country.

DGE Rtn Dr Mahesh Trikha extended a very warm and cordial welcome to all present and said Sanghoshti Seminar is a 2nd level TRF Seminar and will give everyone information about importance of the TRF.

Our own RRFC AKS PDG Rtn Dr N. Subramanian said India are the 2nd largest contributors to TRF and we are the largest beneficiary of getting Global Grants from TRF. He congratulated the District on being awarded the Programs of Scale of \$ 2 millions. He conveyed a special congratulations to IPDG Rtn Ashok Kantoor for getting substantial substantial CSR funds from a PSU, like Coal India for Literacy promotion.

He added that we can get funds from TRF for District Grants, Global Grants, Scale Grants, Disaster Grants etc. Rotary has also been giving Peace Scholarships. These scholarships have made a huge difference. Over 1800 trained and graduate Peace Scholars are working at different organisations in several countries. He added that

Benefits of TRF Grants are not only to the beneficiaries but it also helps in creating better image of Rotary. He said Contributions can be made to Annual Fund, Polio Plus Fund, Endowment Fund of TRF and also to CSR funds of RFI. He said we should aim at making our Clubs 100% EREY Clubs.

PDG Rtn Ashish Ajmera, EMGA, Zone 4 from Durat spoke about the different ways in which we cam donate to the Foundation.

PDG Rtn Sharat Jain, ARRFC said contributions to the Annual Fund of TRF is the most important source for getting DDF and Global Grants. What

was contributed by the District to TRF Annual Fund in the year 2021--22 will be available for the District in 2024-25.

PDG Rtn Sanjiv Rai Mehra, ARRFC spoke on Polio and said we have to.double our efforts in eradicating the disease.

PDG Rtn Deepak Talwar, DRFC speaking on Stewardship and Global Grants said Reporting is important. When a club gets a grant, they have to file a report about implementing the project through a progress report and a completion report. Global Grants are for a minimum value of \$30,000 and should be completed within 2 to 3 years. The project must be sustainable and should be under one of the 7 focus areas. The project must be need based, what the community wants.

Ms Reeti Bora Mondal from RISAO spoke on CSR funds and said no International partner is required in CSR funding. CSR grant fund should be of minimum value of US \$ 21,000. Community assessment is not mandatory for CSR funds. A Rotary Club can have maximum 5 CSR grant funds in a year. Stewardship of CSR funds is very important. Rotarians and DDF can also add their contributions to CSR funds. The project has to be implemented by the Rotary Club. CSR India Grant Fund A/c has to be a separate Bank account for operation of CSR.

IPDG Rtn Ashok Kantoor speaking on CSR Initiatives said the target of contributions to TRF in 2024-25 has been revised and changed to \$ 3 million from the previous goal of 2.2 million.

Every Club must have a separate Trust account. All CSR funds grant contributions to RFI are eligible for TRF recognitions.

After this a very meaningful Q & A session was held moderated by DGSC Rtn Dheeraj Bhutani, with eminent faculty of DG 2024-25 Rtn Dr. Mahesh Trikha, PDG Rtn Dr N Subramanian, PDG Rtn Sharat Jain from District 3012, PDG Rtn Sanjiv Rai Mehra, PDG Rtn Deepak Talwar, IPDG Rtn Ashok Kantoor, DGN Rtn Ravindra Gugnani and Ms Reeti Mondal from RISAO.
