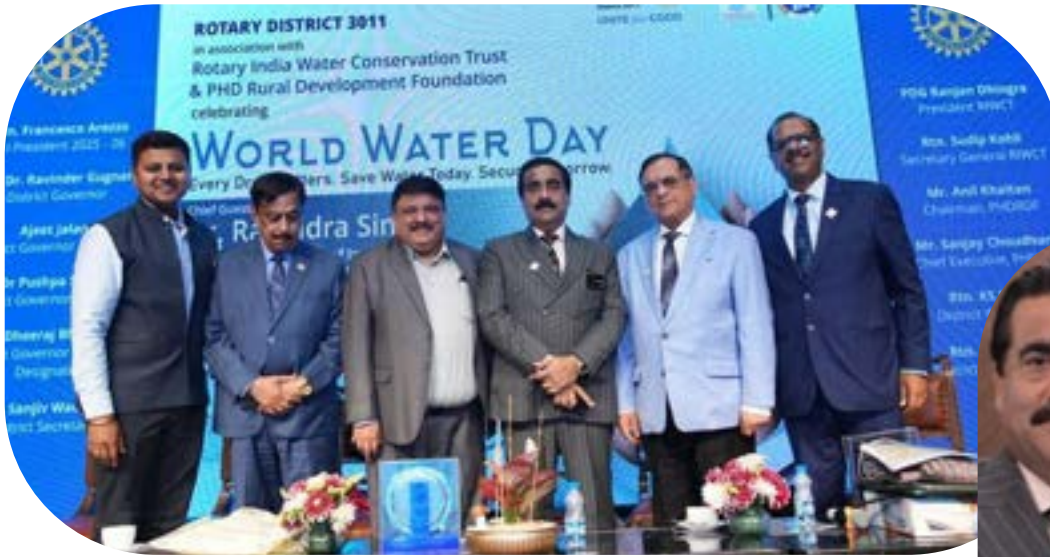

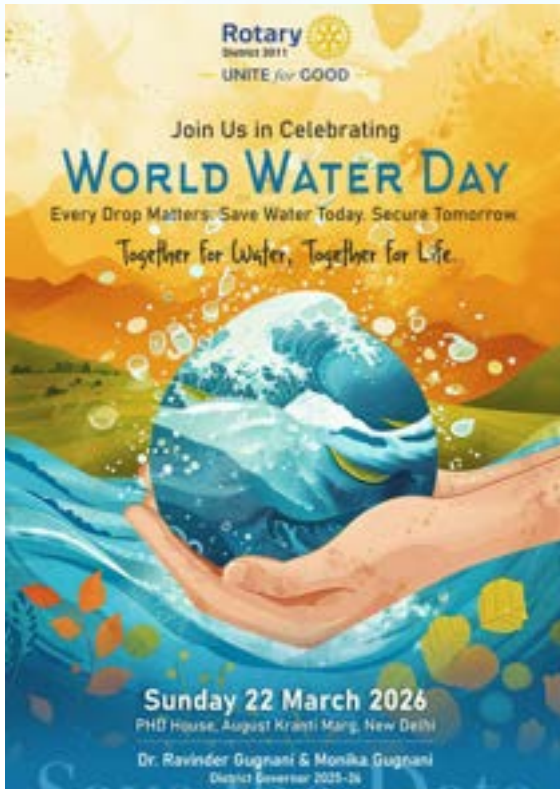

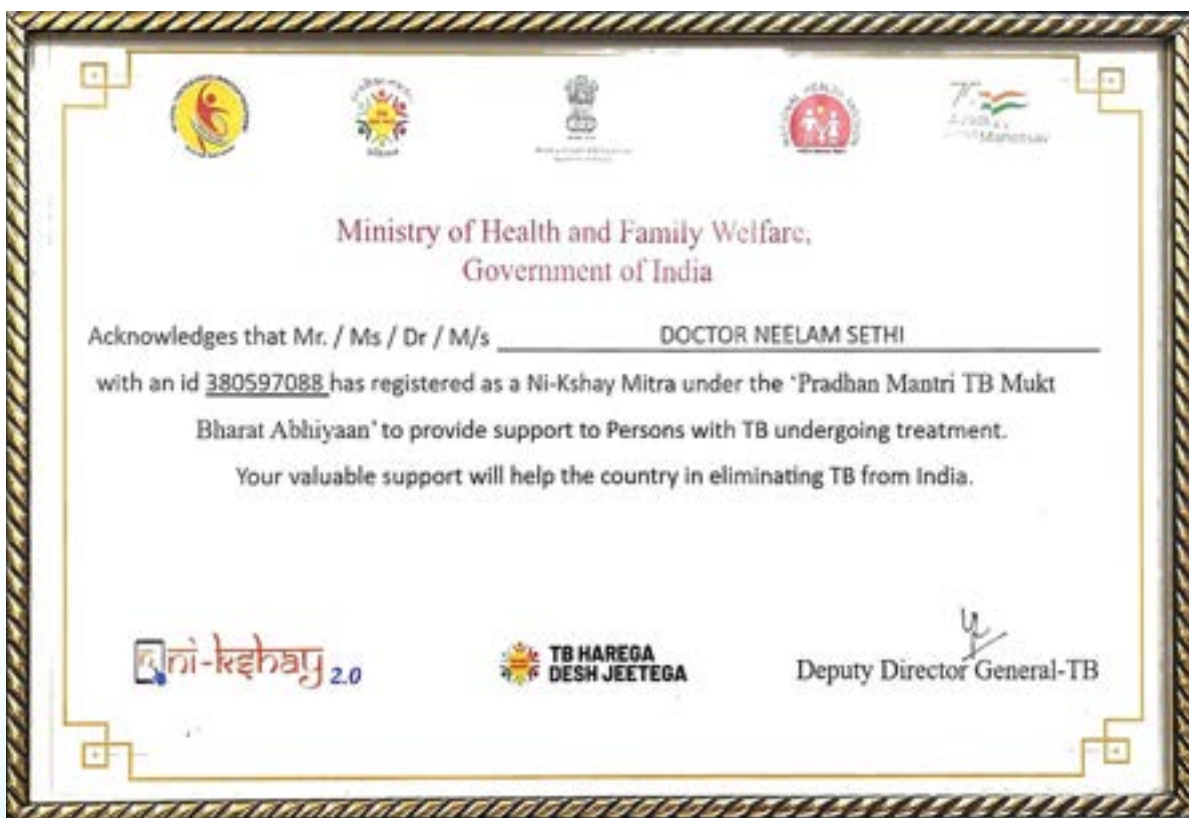


25 March 2026 – National Recognition: Inspiring Excellence

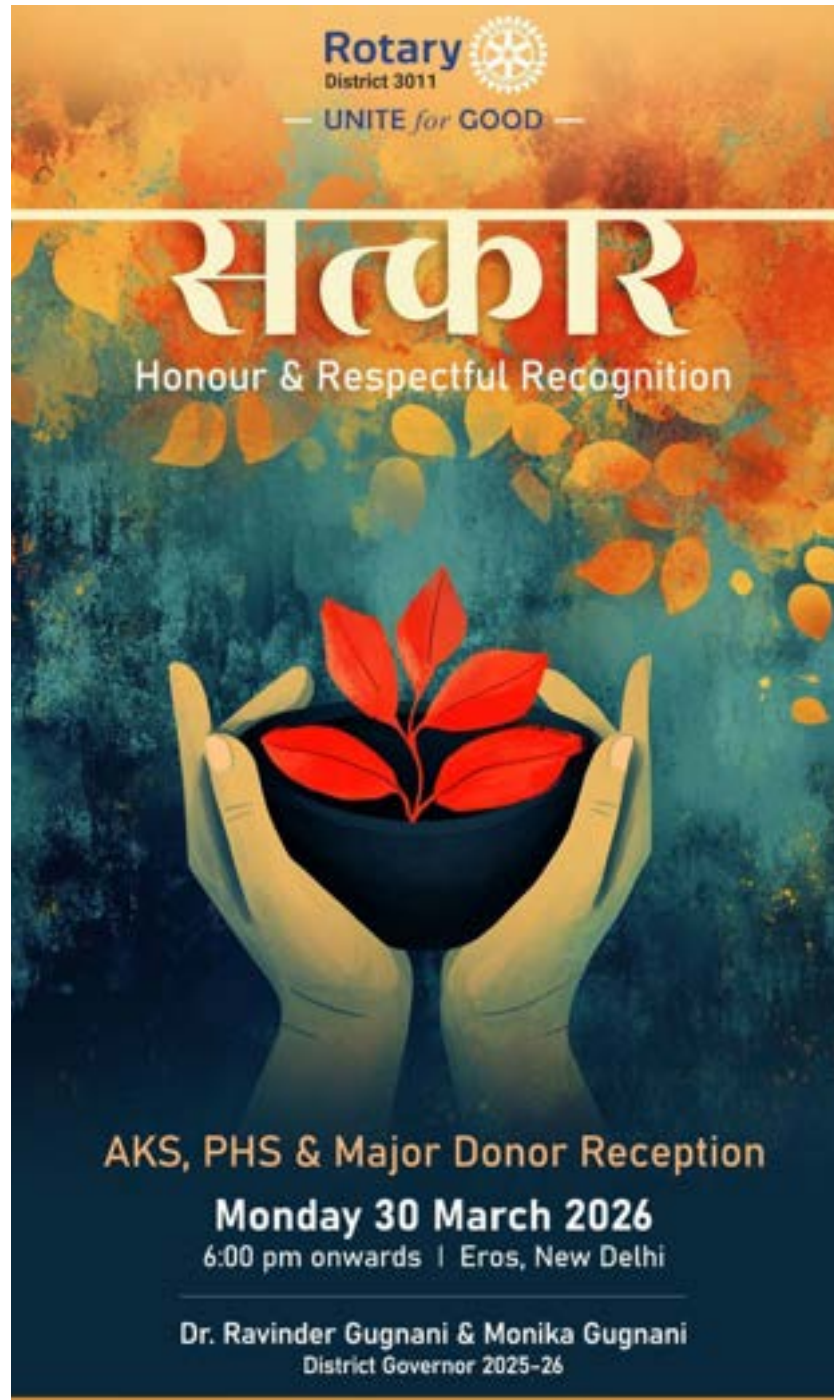
