

Members of the club had the privilege of attending the district-sponsored cultural extravaganza, the musical dance production 'The Legend of Nawaab Jaan – The Poetry of Mirza Ghalib'. Conceptualised and masterfully directed by the acclaimed classical dancer Ms. Manjari Chaturvedi, the performance offered a spellbinding artistic experience.

Held at the prestigious Manekshaw Centre, Delhi Cantonment, the evening brought together the rich heritage of classical dance, live music, and evocative Urdu poetry. Support to Divyang November 3

RCDC continued its commitment to serving people with disabilities by organizing a series of dedicated welfare and support activities throughout the month. As part of this initiative, the club provided essential mobility equipment, prosthetic and orthopedic services, physiotherapy sessions, and nutritional support for TB patients under the Nikshay Mitra Programme. These efforts were undertaken to improve the quality of life, mobility, and overall well-being of individuals who are among the most vulnerable in the community.

A total of 61 Nikshay Mitra food packets were distributed to TB patients to help support their nutritional needs during recovery. Additionally, 32 beneficiaries received free prosthetic and orthopedic services, enabling them to regain mobility and independence. The club also provided mobility aids to 15 individuals, ensuring they had the necessary support for daily movement. Furthermore, 34 patients benefited from free physiotherapy sessions aimed at rehabilitation and pain management. To extend healthcare access even further, a free homeopathy check-up van was deployed across several residential areas and nearby slums, offering doorstep medical consultation to underserved populations. These combined initiatives reflect RCDC's holistic and compassionate approach to community welfare.



Anti-Drug Workshop November 4

An impactful and highly educational 'Anti-Drug Awareness' workshop was organised by Rtn C. Raghunath at DTEA School, Lodhi Estate, as part of Rotary's ongoing commitment to promoting youth welfare and preventive education. The session was thoughtfully conducted by enthusiastic DPSRU Rotaractors, working under the expert guidance of Dr. Harvinder Popli, whose leadership ensured a well-structured and engaging program for the students.

Esteemed resource persons Afrina Sultana, Abhishek Singh, Harsh Jha, Mehak Disha, and Ashhad Nabi from Delhi Pharmaceutical Sciences and Research University (DPSRU) shared their expertise, highlighting the detrimental effects of drug abuse and promoting a healthy lifestyle. Through engaging sessions and discussions, students gained valuable insights into the consequences of drug abuse and were encouraged to become ambassadors of change in their communities. The workshop aimed to raise awareness about the ill effects of drug abuse and promote a healthy lifestyle among students. The session was thoughtfully divided into three parts: 1. Awareness Session 2. Interactive Activity 3. Pledge Ceremony. The workshop was conducted by the Rotary Club of Delhi Central. Rtn. C. Ragunath, Director of Vocational Services, initiated and coordinated the program, sending dedicated volunteers to lead the sessions.

The workshop addressed the growing concern of substance abuse among young people, focusing on the psychological, social, and health-related consequences of drug addiction. Through interactive discussions, real-life examples, and visual presentations, students were made aware of how drug dependency affects not only individuals but also families, communities, and society at large.




Recognition for Foundation Giving

Eye Check-Up Camp at Tihar Jail
