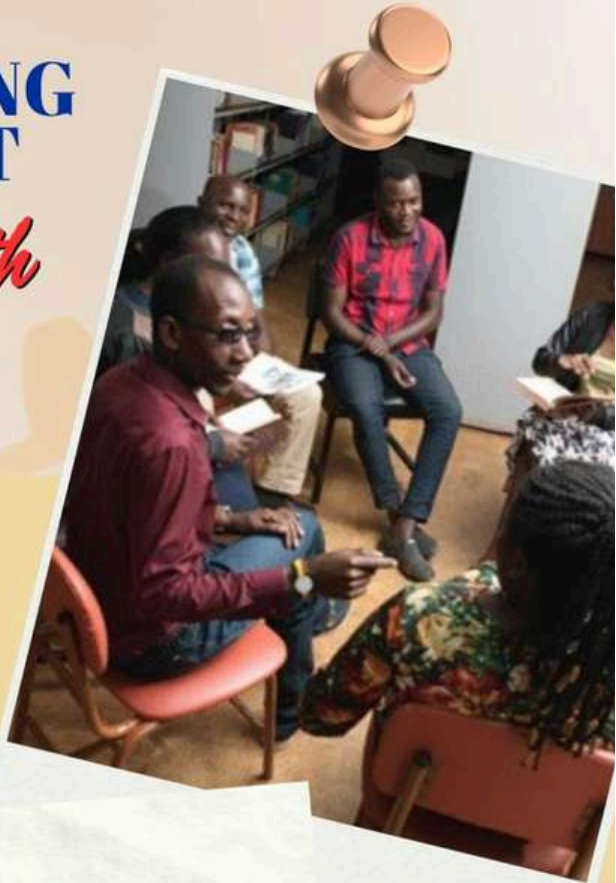

Koyna Wildlife Sanctuary

Nestled in the lush Western Ghats of Maharashtra, Koyna Wildlife Sanctuary is one of the state's most pristine and lesser-explored natural treasures. Spread across a vast expanse in Satara district, it forms an important part of the Sahyadri Tiger Reserve and is recognized as a UNESCO World Natural Heritage Site under the Western Ghats.

The sanctuary is blessed with dense evergreen forests, rolling hills, mist-covered valleys, and the serene backwaters of the Koyna Dam. The Shivsagar Lake, formed by the dam, adds to the breathtaking beauty of the landscape, creating a perfect blend of forest and water. During monsoon, the entire region transforms into a vibrant green paradise with flowing streams and hidden waterfalls.

Koyna is home to rich biodiversity. Wildlife enthusiasts may spot Indian gaurs, leopards, sloth bears, sambar deer, barking deer, and wild boars. Though tigers inhabit the region, sightings are rare, adding a sense of mystery to the forest. The sanctuary is also a haven for birdwatchers, with numerous species of hornbills, woodpeckers, and migratory birds found here.

Unlike commercial wildlife parks, Koyna offers a peaceful and raw forest experience. Eco-tourism activities include nature trails, guided safaris, and boating in the backwaters. The calm environment makes it ideal for nature lovers, photographers, and those seeking quiet rejuvenation away from crowded tourist destinations.

Koyna Wildlife Sanctuary is not just a protected forest—it is a living ecosystem that reflects the untouched beauty of Maharashtra's Western Ghats.

Fraudsters exploit trust, limited digital familiarity, and emotional sensitivity through scams such as OTP fraud, fake bank calls, KYC update scams, lottery schemes, investment traps, and impersonation of officials or relatives in distress.

Such incidents can result in severe financial loss, emotional trauma, and risk to retirement savings. Advocate Bafna will highlight why awareness is critical — prevention is better than recovery, early recognition prevents damage, digital literacy builds confidence, and timely reporting to the cybercrime helpline (1930 in India) improves recovery chances.
