

Trail Blazing Women Making A Mark In Rotary

Tracing the path of women in the annals of the Rotary world.

Trailblazing Women: Shaping the Future of Rotary Tracing the path of women in the annals of the Rotary world.

1950

A Rotary Club of India proposes an enactment to delete the word 'Male' from Standard Rotary Club Constitution in 1950 Rotary Convention.

1964

Rotary Club of Ceylon proposes to admit women in to Rotary and an enactment is taken up in agenda in Council of Legislation. In all 3 proposals were withdrawn.

1972

In 1972 Council of Legislation ,a United State Rotary Club proposes admitting women to Rotary.

1977

3 separate proposals to admit women into Rotary was put up in 1977 Council of Legislation.

A Brazilian club proposes to admit women as Honorary members.

The Rotary Club of Duarte, California, USA admits women as members, in violation of the RI Constitution. Owing to this violation the Club was terminated but later reinstated in the year 1986.

1980

The RI Board of Directors and Rotary Clubs in India, Sweden, Switzerland and the United States proposes

an enactment to remove from the RI and Club Constitution and by-laws all references to members as 'Male persons'.

1983-86

Lawsuit was filed by Duante Club in California Superior Court but rules in favour of Rotary International. The case ends up in US Supreme court.

1987

On 4th May US Supreme court ruled that qualified women be admitted in Rotary clubs of USA.

Rotary Club of Marin Sunrise California (formally Lakspur Landing) is chartered on 28th May and it becomes 1st club to have women as Charter members.

Sylvia Whitlock of RC Duarte, California becomes 1st female Rotary Club President.

1988

Canada becomes the next to admit women members.

1989

In 1989 Council on Legislation, after all legalities doors were open for women to be members in Rotary Club around the world.

1990

'The Rotarian' runs a feature on women in Rotary.

199

In July, 8 women becomes District Governors named Mimi Atman, Gilda, Janet ,Reba, Virginia, Donna, Anne and Olive.

1997

PDG Gilda Chirafisi became the first woman to serve as President of a Rotary club twice.

1998

PDG Virginia B. Nordby became the first woman delegate to the Council on Legislation in New Delhi, India.

2005



Carolyn Jones-1st woman appointed as Trustee of the Rotary Foundation.

2008

Catherine Riveau-1st woman elected to Rotary International Board of Directors.

2012

Elizabeth Demaray-1st Rotary International Treasurer.

2013

Anne Mathews-1st women RI Vice President.

2019

Brenda Marie Cressey-1st women to serve as Vice Chair of the Rotary Foundation. In April-June 2019 she served as the Chair of the Foundation, the first woman appointed to the role.

2022

Jennifer Jones-1st female President of Rotary International.

2024

Stephanie Urchik- President of Rotary International. India centric and our District milestones

Dr Sita Bhateja was the first woman in India to join the Rotary Club of Bangalore in 1989.

1st female District Governor of Dist. 3140-Lata Subraidu. 1st female President of Rotary Club of Borivli-Mona Gyani. 2nd female President of Rotary Club of Borivli-Ruma Desai. Incoming female President of Rotary Club of Borivli-Ketal Tapiawala.

The proposed modification to Section 2, incorporating member suggestions, was put to a vote, and approved. Following this, PP Manish encouraged President Harish to establish the Vibrant Year Pooled Endowment Fund.

In response to the encouragement, President Harish accepted the challenge and announced the creation of a \$25,000 Pooled Endowment Fund, with contributions from the Vibrant Board of Directors and members. PP Hemant Mehta pledged a contribution of \$1,000, and the Vibrant Board of Directors confirmed their support for the fund.

President Harish expressed his gratitude to PP Manish for his substantial contribution to encouraging the club's support for The Rotary Foundation (TRF).

Additionally, President Harish announced that Rtn Hetal Pathak would be the President Nominee Designated for the Rotary year 2027-2028.
