



ensuring that no student is left behind due to socioeconomic factors. This comprehensive approach has contributed to Finland's high literacy rates and overall educational success.



## 11th to 17th August 2024

### A Mesmerizing Experience!

A total of 130 Rotarians with their families from Rotary District 3141 registered for this memorable trip, including 21 members from the Rotary Club of Borivli.

## Sunday, 11th August 2024:

The excitement was palpable as we boarded the Indigo flight to Srinagar, our minds filled with images of lush green mountains, flowing rivers, and the breathtaking beauty of Kashmir—truly a heaven on Earth. Upon arrival, we were warmly greeted at the airport by Arika Tours and Travels. We then travelled to Pahalgam in comfortably arranged 10-16 seaters Urbanias. Despite a brief security check and some rain, the journey was smooth.

Mumbaikars, it seems, carry the rain with them wherever they go! We checked into the Royal Hilton Hotel, surrounded by stunning landscapes—flowing rivers, lush green lands, and a visible presence of military bunkers ensuring our safety. The panoramic views were simply breathtaking.

We spent two days in Pahalgam before heading to Srinagar, again traveling in our decked-out Urbanias, with devotional Shivji songs accompanying us. On the way, we visited apple orchards and learned about the Zamindar Saffron heritage.

#### Srinagar Visit: 13th to 17th August 2024

Our stay in Srinagar, the capital city of Kashmir, was filled with excitement and discovery. We admired the Indian flags and tricolours decorating Lal Chowk, enjoyed the Dal Lake and its floating markets, took shikara rides, and visited the Shankaracharya Temple, which involved climbing 250 steps. Shopping, staying at the Radisson Hotel, and dining at local dhabbas further immersed us in the Kashmiri experience.

The well-organized press conference saw our dynamic DG, Chetan Desai, addressing questions with impressive composure and confidence. # Heritage Walk at Kanheri Caves... a walk through 2500 years of our history.

On a crisp rain free morning of August 18th, 2024, the Rotary Club of Borivili, as the lead club, orchestrated a resplendent heritage walk at the majestic Kanheri Caves. This event, a notable District initiative, was a captivating blend of history, culture, and community engagement, aimed at celebrating and preserving our rich heritage.

The day's proceedings commenced with opening remarks by PP K.V. Premraj, setting the tone for an inspiring journey into India's historical treasure trove. With insightful reflections, he emphasized the immense cultural heritage our country harbours and revealed the District 'Sanskriti' team would continue to spotlight these invaluable gems. Premraj urged the gathering to immerse themselves in the profound history of the Kanheri Caves, a legacy stretching back over 2,500 years.

President Harish Chandarana warmly welcomed the esteemed guests, expressing RC Borivili's enthusiasm in actively participating in such enriching cultural experiences. The First Lady, Sonal Chandarana, provided steadfast support throughout the initiative.

Past District Governor, Bansi Dhurandar, who serves as the Advisor to the District Sanskriti Avenue, lent his invaluable support to this vibrant project. Reflecting on his tenure as District Governor, he recounted his previous endeavours in similar ventures, underscoring the continuity and importance of such initiatives. He was fulsome in his praise of this initiative.

District Governor Chetan Desai conveyed his delight at the choice of Kanheri Caves as the inaugural major Sanskriti project. Recalling his tenure as Club President of Borivli in 2008, he highlighted the significant contributions made towards the preservation of Kanheri Caves, including efforts to clean and make the site plastic-free. Talking about the depth of antiquity at our disposal he mentioned about Gilbert Hill, Andheri. This ancient monolithic structure dating back to 66 million years offers us a blend of history and geology. This is one of the 3 such wonders of the world. Chetan exhorted us to be proud of having such structure in our midst and cherish it. His enthusiastic exhortation encouraged participants to embrace their heritage and imbibe the timeless wisdom handed down through generations.

The spotlight of the day was on the erudite Indologist, Navin Mhatre, who delivered an enlightening talk on the Kanheri Caves. His expertise guided the participants through the intricate history and archaeological significance of the site. The exploration focused on caves numbered 1 through 35, revealing a series of architectural marvels carved out of solid rock. The caves, renowned for their stupas and viharas, showcased beautiful sculptures and an ingenious water supply system with multiple storage tanks, epitomizing ancient engineering prowess.

President Harish Chandarana and first lady Sonal Chandarana's backing was crucial for the success of the




project.

## Eco Friendly house hold tips : Chemical free floor cleaner

Conventional floor cleaners usually contain harsh chemicals which compromise our health and environment. Hence, the products we choose for our homes, matter tremendously. This article is about sustainable living, using ecofriendly means.

What can we use to keep our homes clean, free from insects, and, at the same time, is eco-friendly?

Neem is a natural herb, used widely in Ayurveda, for the above purpose. Dry neem or fresh neem leaves can be used to clean the floor. Dry or fresh neem leaves can also be reused at least three or four times. Following are the simple steps for usage of Neem leaves :

#### Floor Cleaner 1

- Boil fresh (or dry) neem leaves and add sea salt.
- Strain it & use the solution as a floor cleaner.

Floor Cleaner 2

- Boil lemon grass leaves with neem leaves and sea salt.
- Strain it and use the solution as a floor cleaner.

#### Floor Cleaner 3

- Boil lemon grass, neem leaves and edible camphor.

- Strain it and use the solution as a floor cleaner. Benefits of Neem floor cleaner: -

- It keeps insects & flies away.
- It cleans drainage and does not pollute water.
- It keeps cockroaches away
- Pest control services could be minimized with regular use of this eco friendly floor cleaner.


