Under the leadership of DG Rtn. Dr Ravinder Gugnani, Rotary Club of Delhi South hosted the Clubfoot Seminar on 2nd August 2025 at Sir Ganga Ram Hospital, New Delhi,.

In partnership with Rotary Club of Delhi South and GRIPMER, SGRH, this seminar united Rotarians and medical leaders to address Clubfoot with compassion and action.

This one-of-a-kind seminar was structured to serve both the Rotary community and the medical fraternity:

The Morning Session was for Rotarians, focusing on the burden of Clubfoot in India, the effectiveness of the Ponseti method, and Rotary's role in providing timely care.

The Afternoon Session was a Hands-on training for 70 orthopedic postgraduate students from Delhi in Ponseti casting techniques.

The event drew over 50 Rotarians and 70 medical postgraduates, creating a dynamic and impactful atmosphere.

Led by a distinguished faculty including Prof. Mathew Varghese, Prof. Dr. Manish Dhawan, Dr. Atul Vaish, Dr. Vineet Arora, and Dr. Brajesh Nandan.

Honoured guests included Padma Shri Prof. Dr. D.S. Rana, Padma Bhushan Prof. Dr. B.K. Rao, and Rotary 3011 District Governor Rtn. Dr. Ravinder Gugnani and our President Kaval Verma.

After 22 surgeries performed at Sir Ganga Ram Hospital, she regained functional mobility. Today, she holds a BA in English Honours, a PG in Social Work, and is beginning her PhD. She works efficiently using voice-to-text tools despite her physical challenges. District Governor Rtn. Dr. Ravinder Gugnani, moved by her story, spontaneously announced donation of a laptop from Rotary to support her academic journey.

Another inspiring case was Simon, a Clubfoot-treated child who now competes at the junior national level in sports, proving how proper care transforms potential.

Let us pledge – as Rotarians and orthopedic surgeons – to transform lives, restore mobility, and return dignity to every physically challenged child," said Prof. Dr. Manish Dhawan in his closing remarks.

In July 2025, a doctor from AIIMS reached out to PP Rtn Anil K Agarwal for urgent support to SAVE A LIFE.

Patient: Mrs. Vandana Jain

Age: 48 years

Profession: Teacher in a private school, Saharanpur, U.P.

Background: A single mother (her husband passed away during Covid), she is supporting two college-going sons.

In July, Vandana ji had suffered a Brain Haemorrhage and was rushed to AIIMS for treatment. Doctors recommended urgent neurosurgery, with an estimated cost of ₹8 lakhs.

The family was in deep distress and unable to arrange the required funds. But thanks to the generous contributions of PP Rtn Anil K Agarwal and RCDS donors, the amount was raised in time, enabling the surgery to go ahead.

Throughout this critical period, PP Rtn Anil K Agarwal stayed in close contact with her son Tanish to monitor her progress.

On August 1, 2025, doctors declared Vandana ji out of danger, and she was discharged to return to Saharanpur. On August 4, 2025, she travelled back home with her son Tanish.







Just two weeks later, on August 16, her sons celebrated her birthday—a moment that may not have been possible without timely intervention and collective compassion.

# GREEN ACTIONS WE CAN DO INDIVIDUALLY TOWARDS HAVING BLUE SKIES IN FUTURE

#### 1. INTRODUCTION:

India ranked as the 5th most polluted country in the world with Byrnihat in Meghalaya being the most polluted city globally with high pollution levels due to rapid industrialization and unregulated emissions. Despite some improvements, Delhi remains the most polluted capital and India's cities continue to exceed WHO PM 2.5 guidelines which recommend only five Microgram Per Cubic Meter whereas India's PM2.5 concentration in 2024 averaged 50.6 micrograms per cubic meter. Air Pollution in Delhi worsened with the annual average PM2.5 rising from 102.4 Micrograms Per Cubic Meter in 2023 to 108.3 Micrograms Per Cubic Meter in 2024.

The Indian cities in the world's top 20 most polluted cities are Byrnihat, Delhi, Punjab's Mullanpur, Faridabad, Loni, Gurugram, Ganganagar, Greater Noida, Bhiwadi, Mujaffarnagar, Hanumangarh and Noida. Overall 35 percent of the Indian cities reported annual PM2.5 level exceeding 10 times the WHO Limit of 5 micrograms per cubic meter. Delhi grapples with high air pollution year round and pollution worsens in winter when unfavorable meteorological conditions coupled with paddy straw burning, vehicular emissions, fire crackers, dust from unpaved roads, etc make the air quality extremely hazardous going past 400 Micrograms Per Cubic Meter.

## 2. HEALTH IMPACTS OF DELHI'S HIGH AIR POLLUTION LEVELS:

22 Lakh children in Delhi have irreversible lung damage due to the poor quality of the air. In addition research shows that pollution can lower children's and adults immune system and increase the risk of Asthma, lungs damage, cancer, epilepsy, diabetes and even diseases like multiple sclerosis.

## 3. WHAT CAN WE DO INDIVIDUALLY TO HELP REDUCE AIR POLLUTION:

The actions we all can take as Rotarians and responsible citizens are listed on the website www.greenpledges. com. It is a list 10 points out of which the five most important points are as follows:

- Will minimize use of my personal vehicles by car pooling with friends. family and colleagues whenever possible by approaching them while going to office or common destinations forgetting my ego in the interest of reducing negative impacts on the air environment.
- 2. Will walk short distance of upto 1 mile and not use any motorized vehicle for the same.
- 3. Will install solar panels at my residence, office, factory, buildings and commercial establishment which will help to reduce electricity bills while helping the air environment. This can easily be done very

- conveniently at the residence and office buildings and should be done on high priority in the National Interest.
- Will avoid sweeping dust in the house, driveways, etc and use wet cloth/ wet mob instead of Jhadu the typical broom of dry sticks and bristles used for sweeping.
- 5. Will use CNG vehicles or electric vehicles instead of petrol and diesel vehicle. CNG can easily be installed on all petrol cards and should be preferred by replacing existing diesel cars with CNG Vehicles. As Rotarians & responsible citizens we can afford expensive non CNG vehicles but in the interest of the Air Quality environment in our cities we need to review this and replace Diesel Vehicles with CNG vehicles & install CNG kits in the petrol vehicles.

#### **CONCLUSION:**

We are living in Delhi and Indian Cities at great risk to our health due to high Air Pollution levels and need to act on priority to help reduce Air Pollution in Delhi by the 5 point action plan mentioned above and by taking the greenpledge at www.greenpledges.com. We need to act on a war fitting individually as Rotarians and responsible citizens to help in having blue skies for our present and future generations.
