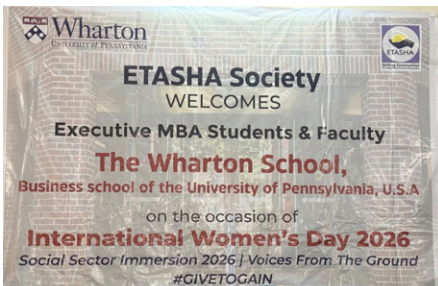

WORLD WATER DAY SEMINAR – A CALL TO ACTION

On 20th March 2026, under the leadership of District Governor Rtn. Dr. Ravinder Gugnani, a powerful World Water Day Seminar was held at PHD House, reinforcing the vital message:

“Jal hai toh Kal hai... aur agar jal nahi, toh kal nahi.”

The seminar featured two remarkable water warriors. **Dr. Rajender Singh, the Waterman of India**, shared how over 15,800 check dams and community participation have revived rivers, recharged wells, and transformed rural livelihoods. **Padma Shri Uma**

Shankar (Umakanth) Pandey highlighted how grassroots efforts in Bundelkhand converted 3,600 dacoits into Water Warriors, making the region agriculturally prosperous and driving water awareness across 1 lakh villages.

Rotary's continued commitment was evident with the announcement of 3 new check dams, building on a legacy that began in 2007 and includes 285+ water conservation structures in partnership with PHDRDF.

A key takeaway was clear—water is not scarce, but mismanaged. While

check dams help, every drop must be conserved through better ground-level management, community ownership, and awareness.

PP Rtn Rajiv Gujral said the takeaway from this Water seminar today was that the awareness is the beginning and action is the answer. Two crusaders hailing from backward villages had brought about transformative change in water conservation for millions & increased the prosperity in thousands of villages . We need to identify such motivated individuals & provide resources to them to reach out in the hinterland to undertake water conservation projects . Awareness & action is required at individual , community & Industry level to save this critical resource .

The seminar was an eye-opener, reminding us that awareness must lead to action. As Rotarians, we must lead from the front to conserve this precious resource—because our future depends on it.

On 28th March 2026, the Rotary Club of Delhi South came together for a Speaker Meeting held at Jaypee Vasant Continental Hotel.

The meeting commenced with the ceremonial collaring of President Rtn. Kaval Verma by Rtn. Ila Jain. The gesture was greeted with warm applause.

All members and guests joined in singing the National Anthem with patriotic fervor. PP Rtn. Som Dua then led the recitation of the Rotary Four-Way Test, reaffirming Rotary's guiding principles of truth, fairness, goodwill, and mutual benefit.

members and guest, with special acknowledgement to the guest speaker: Dr. Chitra Setya, MD, Senior Consultant & Head of Department OBGY, Apollo Hospital. On request of President, Rtn. Dr. Vaneeta Kapur read the introduction of the speaker Dr. Chitra Setya.

Guest speaker, Dr. Chitra Setya, thanked the club members for the invitation and was warmly welcomed with applause. A delightful Speaker Meeting and fellowship get-together was held on Sunday, 29th March 2026, at the Jaypee Intercontinental Hotel, Vasant Vihar, bringing together members for an evening filled with warmth, camaraderie, and lively

interaction. A highly informative session on lifestyle medicine highlighted the growing importance of preventive healthcare in today's fast-paced world. The presentation emphasized that lifestyle medicine focuses on treating individuals holistically rather than merely addressing symptoms, promoting long-term behavioural changes through a balanced approach to nutrition, physical activity, stress management, sleep, and social well-being. It was noted that nearly 80% of chronic diseases are linked to lifestyle factors, with India witnessing a sharp rise in conditions such as diabetes, hypertension, obesity,



and cardiovascular diseases due to sedentary habits, poor diet, and increasing stress levels. The session underlined the six pillars of lifestyle medicine—healthy nutrition, regular exercise, adequate sleep, stress reduction, strong social connections, and avoidance of tobacco and alcohol—as essential for disease prevention and overall well-being. Emphasis was placed on adopting a whole-food, plant-predominant diet, engaging in regular physical activity, and maintaining a consistent sleep routine to improve quality of life. The importance of quitting

harmful habits like smoking and excessive alcohol consumption was also discussed, along with practical strategies to manage cravings and build healthier routines. The session concluded with a strong message that small, consistent lifestyle changes can significantly reduce healthcare burdens and lead to a healthier, more fulfilling life, reinforcing the need to prioritise wellness in everyday living. PPRtn Deepak Kapoor, fondly referred to as the Club's "Shakespeare," was at his usual best, captivating the audience with his apt and impromptu

poetry while delivering the vote of thanks to the speaker. His eloquence and wit added a special charm to the occasion. President Rtn Kaval Verma, along with dedicated team, ensured that every aspect of the event was executed with perfection, reflecting excellence in planning and hospitality. Adding to the seamless experience, Rtn Shailen efficiently managed the bar, ensuring prompt and smooth service that kept the spirits high among members.
