

SCREENING CAMPS FOR RESIDENTS OF LEPROSY COLONIES







When the State Leprosy Officer Dr Shintoo Doomra, informed us that the Delhi State was conducting Screening Camps for residents of Leprosy Colonies in Tahirpur, Shahdara.



District on 16th, 17th and 18th December 2024 and requested to provide the personnel for Customized Footwear assessment during the camps we rose up to the occasion As part of our camps which we conduct 4 to 6 time monthly, to provide succor to the Leprosy patients, we provide them footwear, self care kits and provide them physiotherapy.

The State Leprosy Officer's request was for custom made shoes for the patients who had lost the digits of their feet, who had amputations on their feet and could not wear the normal shoes provided for leprosy patients. We therefore sent our shoe technicians to work along with the Delhi government team for measuring the sizes of the feet and to subsequently provide them shoes.

DISEASE PREVENTION AND TREATMENT

On 7th Dec. 24, Sankalp Foundation and RC Delhi South, organised an Awareness Talk on Cervical Cancer Vaccination, at the Koolie Camp. This is a large slum area between Munirka and Vasant Vihar, with a population of a few thousands, living in this slum.

Ms. Anupriya and Vandana Bhalla met up with the Sarpanch and the ladies of this camp, first. Vandana Bhalla gave an Awareness Talk to the 70 to 80 ladies present there.

The ladies openly discussed and cleared all their doubts and inibhitions, on Cervical Cancer, and the prevention of it. The talk was quite a success, as they all understood the importance of this Vaccination.

Later, even the 70 and 80 year olds wanted us to vaccinate them, against Cervical cancer. Unfortunately the age to be vaccinated is between 9 and 26 years only. They all took Consent Forms home and were keen to get their children and grandchildren, boys and girls, vaccinated by us, on 29th December, when the Vaccination Camp was to be conducted, in the Community Hall of Munirka Enclave.

Cervical Cancer Vaccination camp was held in Sai Dham Faridabad, on the 20th December 2024. It was organised by President Virender Mehta Faridabad NIT, RC Delhi South and Motilal ji of SaiDham. SOM DUA JI's JOURNEY OF ENTREPRENEURSHIP

My Mentoring journey began in the 1990s with Rotary Career Guidance Camps in schools like BVN, DPS, and Blue Bells. It evolved into Mentoring for Empowerment and Entrepreneurship through my involvement with BYST in 2002. This led to my certification as a Mentor by City & Guild, London in 2008.

In 2016, I became Chairman of BYST Faridabad, focusing on Entrepreneurship. In 2017, I joined the National Mentors Panel and chaired the Training Committee for Mission Mentoring India, training mentors across India.

In 2023, as Chairman of BYST Faridabad's Strategy Committee, I work on Entrepreneurship Capacity Building, influenced by challenges like innovations, digitalization, and global disruptions. UN's SDGs and GOI's Mission Viksit Bharat @2047 significantly impact entrepreneurship.

Our aim is to encourage young people to pursue Entrepreneurship for Inclusive Growth and Sustainability, with a focus on Green, Rural, and Social Entrepreneurship to address SDGs & ESG challenges.


Our daughter Aditi, based in San Francisco, suggested an alternative: flying to Alaska and exploring by land.
