

TRIBUTE TO OUR VERY OWN JAGMOHAN JI





Jag Mohan, a brilliant star, born on 25 June 1937 to the loving Kaushalya and Gyan Chand Gupta, was a beacon of intelligence and hard work. His academic journey was marked by excellence, and while completing his B.Sc., he received an offer from Calcutta to pursue chemical engineering. However, fate had other plans, and after just a month, a call from the prestigious Dufferin came his way. In 1955, he embarked on his maritime career with Dufferin. After seven years of dedication, he became a Chief Officer, and in 1968, he proudly achieved the rank of Captain. He married Indu Mahajan in 1966.

These pages are merely a glimpse into the life of a truly remarkable individual and a Rotarian, Mr Jagmohan. Nonetheless, the endeavour is to share in brief his life story, his personality and all the elements that made him the Man he was!

Jag Mohan, a brilliant star, born on 25 June 1937 to the loving Kaushalya and Gyan Chand Gupta, was a beacon of intelligence and hard work. His academic journey was marked by excellence, and while





completing his B.Sc., he received an offer from Calcutta to pursue chemical engineering. However, fate had other plans, and after just a month, a call from the prestigious Dufferin came his way. In 1955, he embarked on his maritime career with Dufferin. After seven years of dedication, he became a Chief Officer, and in 1968, he proudly achieved the rank of Captain. He married Indu Mahajan in 1966.

Unfortunately, during a voyage to Constanța, Romania, Captain Jag Mohan faced a significant challenge. Due to an incorrect map, his ship, MS VishvaShanti, ran aground in freezing conditions, with temperatures plummeting below 0°C. In a daring act, the third officer, Mr. Gockley, swam to the shore to secure a rope, enabling the rest of the crew and officers to cross to safety. Out of 59 people, only one elderly person tragically did not survive. Captain Jag Mohan lost his master's certificate after this incident, but rather than becoming despondent, he took it as a challenge. Determined, he went back for training, passed the necessary exams, and regained his Master's Certificate. Though heartbroken by the ordeal, he resumed his maritime career, initially as a Chief Officer, before eventually reclaiming his captaincy.

His son, Pavan was born on June 10, 1969. Unfortunately his wife fell very sick and he wanted to be there for his family. So, he gave up his career at sea and restarted his career ashore. It was tough for the for the sailor to start a life ashore, but he always believed in 'family first', and thus, took up the challenge.

He joined the Canadian High Commission, and soon after transitioned for 5 years to the Clark's Group, where he rose to the position of Managing Director.

Following this, he took on the role of MD at Indrama Company, where he worked for a couple of years, building extensive connections with airlines, hotels, and travel agencies. His network led him to become Vice President of Scholl Club, an organization catering to these industries. However, destiny had other plans. He then joined Span Resorts, where he served as President for five years.

Eventually, he chose to step down and the adventurer returned to the sea for five years, wherein he sailed as a Captain, before eventually giving up his life at sea. Rtn. Jagmohan was as a member of Delhi South for over 45 years and the President for two terms: 1984-85 and twenty years later, 2004-5. Both the terms saw him equally successful in implementing many projects and rallying together members through his affable and charming personality. He is survived by his wife Indu, son Pavan, daughter-in-law Ruchi, grandson Abhijai and granddaughter Anahita.


A HEARTWARMING TRIBUTE BY ABHIJAI TO HIS BELOVED DADU

This tribute is to honor, remember and celebrate my Dadu. And yes, I say celebrate, because if there's one thing Dadu always did, it was bringing a smile to our faces. And whether you knew him as a family member, a friend, or simply as a kind soul, I'm sure you'll agree-Dadu lived a life worth celebrating. Dadu's life, his aura, and the way himself carried he were remarkable. There was something about him-a certain grace, a quiet power-that you felt being in his presence.

There are a few things about Dadu that will forever live in us:

felt like he had superpowers.

He believed in starting the day right, with order and discipline, and this attitude stayed with him his entire life. Dadu didn't just talk about values-he lived them!



First, discipline I have to admit, as Second, his peaceful demeanor: a kid, I didn't always understand Dadu's calmness was something I why Dadu was so disciplined. admired deeply. I can't remember Every morning, without fail, he a single moment when he raised would wake up at 4 AM, do his his voice or lost his temper. He had yoga, go for his walk, and then this incredible ability to stay meticulously clean his room. And composed, no matter what was there I was, struggling to even get going on around him. I used to out of bed on time for school. It wonder how he did it, but now I realize it was his way of showing us strength. Не never burdened anyone with his problems, and whenever asked he would say - 'all is in the well' and that become something we now use in our vocabulary.

And third for all his discipline, Dadu had this brilliant sense of humor. He could make us laugh with just a glance or a perfectly timed comment. I remember when he would see me or Anahita praying, and he'd say, "Why are you disturbing God?" He had this way of making life feel lighter, reminding us not to everything too seriously. when life got tough for him, his humor never wavered. That taught me something too-that no matter how heavy things may get, there's always room for a bit of lightness, for a smile or a laugh.

One of the things that always amazed me was just intelligent Dadu was. I honestly regard him as one of the smartest people I've ever met. Whether it was fixing the smallest screw in house or solving bigger problems, he always knew exactly what to do. He practically ran our household. He was the backbone of our family, and if anything went wrong, we knew whom to go to -Dadu. We depended on him for so much, and he was always there, taking care of things. Despite his calm and generous nature, Dadu did have one funny quirk-he was very paranoid about security.

He once installed a door lock so complicated, that not even we could figure it out. It's a miracle the door ever opened! But that was Dadu—always thinking ahead, always making sure everything was in order.

Growing up, Dadu was always there for us. Whether it was driving us to the bus stop when we were running late or waiting to pick us up in the evenings; he made sure we were taken care of. We spent every evening after school with him—having snacks, watching TV— and these were some of the best moments of my childhood.

Dadu, you have left us with so much more than memories. You've given us the greatest gift of all—your example. We will miss you deeply, but your spirit will stay with us forever.

REMEMBERING JAGMOHAN

We bade farewell to a very dear Rotarian Jagmohan on September 25, who I was privileged to call a dear friend. Jagmohan presided over the affairs of RCDS twice, in 1984-85 as a popular choice and twenty years later in 2004-05, when he was persuaded to volunteer as President in the absence of a willing candidate!! Succession ladder had broken down and the ever dependable Jagmohan was the man to go to bail the club out. Those were trite times as ennui had set in the ranks of a depleted membership of RCDS. Jagmohan led the club with distinction and his warm demeanour and charm added to the aura of excellence. He will be forever remembered by his large legion of admirers. RIP dear friend.

INDERJEET SINGH

Jagmohan (or Jags, as we fondly called him) was a truly very popular Rotarian, who held the distinction of being the first to be nominated to serve twice, as Club President- 1984-85 & then again 2004-05. He was a very close friend to us both, for over five decades. His warmth & friendship, over the years, made us feel like part of his extended family. He was a disciplined and a committed Rotarian, with very strong convictions- & he stood by them firmly. He stood out not only as our best turned out Rotarian; but was also one of the few who was never seen without his Rotary pin. In fact, he was overjoyed to receive & wear with pride a spl Rotary pin (from overseas) that I once got for him. Not only did Jags have a great year as a Club President, but he was instrumental in persuading the RCDS Board of Directors (as a respected PP) to sponsor my name for Distt Governor; and that too at a time when a Distt Governor, at less than 40 years' age; was absolutely unheard of. In fact, he (& many times also his gracious wife- Indu Mahajan) accompanied us to distant Rotary clubs (in remote parts of our Distt) & to many important Distt events; to canvas support for me. He was truly a precious gift to our RCDS. Nalini & I fondly recall that the day we were declared elected (against very formidable odds), their happiness knew no bounds. We had made no preparations (since nobody expected us to actually win the election), Indu & he sprung into action & put together & organised



Dr. Mathew Varghese delivered a brilliant summary of the medical intervention, using just one word: "Ponseti" — a non-surgical method with the highest success rate. He shared insights that even doctors in the US struggle to match this success due to their reliance on surgical procedures. He emphasized the importance of parental counselling and the proper use of braces, which ensures no recurrence of the deformity.






DISTRICT PEACE SEMINAR




















The compere, Rtn Kriti Makhija was truly magical in conducting and compering the program. She had taken minute details of each person and all the cultural events and performed flawlessly

BLOOD DONATION DRIVE







Rtn Basu met Dr VM Katoch, former DG ICMR and former Health Secy and a well known expert on research and leprosy, Dr Utpal Sengupta, Senior most Researcher at the TLMTI Stanley Browne Laboratory, Brent Morgan, Director TLM International, Dr Priya John, CEO CMAI, Dr Narasimha Rao, President International Leprosy Association (ILA) among others.
