# DISTRICT GOVERNOR'S SPEECH.....

#### Good Evening, Fellow Rotarians and Honored Guests



It's a privilege to be here this evening, and I want to begin by recognizing the phenomenal work accomplished by our outgoing President and Secretary for the year 2023-24. I don't think I need to repeat all the wonderful things that have already been presented, but I would like to take a moment to offer a standing ovation to President Pramod Agarwal and Secretary Sarvpreet for their incredible dedication and leadership. Let's give them a round of applause!

In 2023-2024, Immediate Past President (IPP) Pramod truly became the brand ambassador of Rotary, even more so than his role with P&G. His contributions to Rotary, particularly within our district, have been nothing short of remarkable. He's already been recognized with the best trophy at the district Thanksgiving, and it's clear to all of us that his impact goes far beyond accolades. Under his leadership, Rotary Club of Delhi South reached new heights.

Rotary Club Delhi South is one of the oldest clubs in the district, but it's also one of the best. As we reflect on the past year, we are reminded that promises are just words—what truly matters is performance. Rotary Club Delhi South, under President Pramod Agarwal's leadership, created milestones not only for our club but for the entire district. Rohit led from the front, particularly with the Rotary Foundation, where we created a legacy of Presidents for 2023–24 by establishing an endowment. Twenty-five Presidents each donated \$1,000 to this endowment, which will support future district projects. IPP Pramod was one of the first to contribute, also becoming a major donor.

Our focus last year was to foster repeat commitment rather than just one-time contributions. We launched the Colier Society, where members commit to donating \$1,000 annually, which can be a greater challenge than becoming a major donor. I am proud to say that we grew this society from 25 members to 125, with six members from Rotary Club of Delhi South. A round of applause for these six dedicated members!

In terms of fundraising, our district crossed a historic milestone of \$2 million, a first in District 3011's history. Rotary Club of Delhi South contributed nearly \$50,000 to this total—a sizable and impactful contribution. We also saw significant increases in our Polio Fund contributions, with Rotary Club of Delhi South being one of the top two clubs to lead this charge. The work toward eradicating polio is not yet complete, and your continued commitment means a great deal.

# TLMTI SKILL TRAINING CENTRE

The Rotary Club of Delhi South has been working on setting up a Skill Training Centre in collaboration with the Leprosy Mission Trust India (TLMTI) at the TLMTI - Diana Princess of Wales Health Education and Media Centre in Sector 62, Noida.

This is an extremely prestigious collaboration between a 150+ year old TLMTI and a 100+ old Rotary Organization.

The ₹40 lakh project was supported by generous contributions from AIMIL Ltd., and members of the Rotary Club of Delhi Regency, next, with a small input from the Delhi South Rotary Service Foundation. The Centre has been functional from the beginning of July 2024 and is running IT and Cosmetology classes. The Centre's new executives have managed to recruit around 40 students, out of which a significant number are children of Leprosy treated patients from the Tahirpur leprosy colonies.













On **July 23, 2024**, we arranged a grand ceremony to dedicate the **Rotary-TLMTI Skill Training Centre** to the society. We had a guest, His Excellency Iraj Elahi, who is the Ambassador of Iran to India. He has a PhD in Futurology Management, the Supreme National Defense University, Iran, 2010, and is a Master of Economics, Imam Sadiq University of Iran in 1991. His Excellency came to the Rotary Club of Delhi South and spoke on various matters.

First, he spoke about the great relationship that India and Iran have based on the trade which takes place. Mainly, India exports rice, pharma, and machines, and in turn imports chemical and dry fruits. There also is a great bonding between the two as being one of the oldest civilizations. Iran believes in strategic independence like India and is currently going through heavy sanctions imposed international community. Iran has made great strides in clean energy because of the pollution which exists in Tehran due to cheap availability of gasoline.



There is pollution and they are trying to go more and more towards battery vehicles. Iran also plays a role in which it looks after refugees. Currently, from Afghanistan, it has got 5 million refugees whom they are providing boarding and lodging. Iran has a common border between 15 countries. India has invested in Chabar Port which can handle an annual cargo of 2.1 million tons. It is a deep sea port and it connects to Central Asia, the North-South Corridor, Russia, and Europe. So, this opens a great trading route for India and Iran has provided a 10-year contract for this. There was also discussion on trading on local currencies and His Excellency said that more and more efforts are being made to trade in local currencies or in the barter system. Both countries, India and Iran, are members of the Shanghai Cooperation and BRICS.

The meeting was followed by cocktails and drinks. Rtn. Rajiv Gujral had very thoughtfully added some Iranian dishes to the spread. The evening had a record attendance – a great start to the new beginnings!







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

The journey on NH 67 from Hubli to Hampi was smooth and scenic, covering 165 kilometers in about three hours. Our driver pointed out sights, including Gadag, where we saw windmills generating 300 MW of clean energy. The view was both beautiful and environmentally rewarding.


**Tip 2**: Carry water and snacks for the scenic drive, as there are no decent places to buy them. Toilets at Toll Plazas are available but not tested.

The Royal Enclosure, which was centre of the Hampi had buildings belonging to the Vijayanagar Kingdom and include – Queen's Bath, Elephant Stable to house the elephants of the visiting nobles, a step well, the Lotus Mahal and many others.

Virupaksha Temple is the 7th century Shiva temple in Hampi, Central Karnataka. Lord Virupaksha or Pampapathi is the main deity in Virupaksha Temple. ,The inverted shadow of the main tower falls on a wall inside the temple. The temple elephant gave his blessings to us.

The other imposing and beautiful structures at Hampi were the Kadalekalu Ganesha 4.5 mtrs tall, Lakshi Narsimha Statue which is about 6.7 mtrs high and the Siva Temple which has a 3 mtr high Shiv Linga with the base always underwater.

**Day 4**, we checked out and headed for Hublu Airport. We were delighted that we could make this trip which had etched some everlasting and beautiful memories in our minds for the rest of our lives.
