### Rtn. Dr. Amita Mohindru (Distt. 3012)

Dr. Amita Mohindru was born in Delhi and raised in the cosmopolitan city of Mumbai in an affluent industrialist family. Her family's business interests span chemicals and auto ancillary sectors, with a notable presence in Indian politics. Her Tayaji was a Freedom Fighter and MP in the 4th Lok Sabha from Dausa, Rajasthan. In his honor, a prominent road named "Charanjeet Rai Marg" is located in Mumbai's business hub near the Bombay Stock Exchange.

Amita completed her education at the prestigious Villa Theresa School and Dawar College of Commerce. She holds a **PhD from Cambridge University** in Canada.

**She joined the Rotary Club of Delhi City in 2018 and became the first female President of the Club in 2019-2020**, a historic achievement since the club's charter in 1979. During her tenure, she received numerous accolades, including **Best President, Best District Club, and Maximum Donation to the Cancer Foundation**, among others.

Amita has held several key positions at the Rotary District level, such as **Assistant Governor, District Conference Chair, Vice President of The Rotary Cancer Foundation, and District Director Administration (Delhi)**. She and her husband, Anil, became **members of Rotary's Arch Klumph Society by donating US\$250,000 to The Rotary Foundation** during her presidential year.

A dedicated philanthropist, Amita is committed to helping the underprivileged through both her time and financial contributions. She believes in action-based commitments and prioritizes results over mere promises. An avid traveler, she appreciates nature in its pristine form.

Amita is married to Anil, a former Merchant Navy Captain and Past President of the Rotary Club of Delhi City in the centennial year 2004-05. Together, since 1989, they have managed a group of logistics companies, **Emu Lines and Three Aces Global**, which have received top logistics awards since 2002. In 2008, Amita launched her own successful brand, "ADORNING," known for personalized wedding and packaging solutions.

She has two children, Siddharth and Nidha. Siddharth, married to Kangna, is a Past President of the Rotary Club of Delhi Regals and a member of the Arch Klumph Society. They have two sons, Saahir and Kiyansh, both Paul Harris Fellows. Siddharth is involved in the family logistics business alongside his uncle, Sanjeev Mohindru, who is also a member of the Arch Klumph Society and a Past President of the Rotary Club of Delhi Ashoka. Amita is a compassionate Rotarian with futuristic beliefs and actions, and she made history by becoming the First woman to be elected as District Governor in Districts 3012 and 3011 for 2025-26 with 95% of the vote.

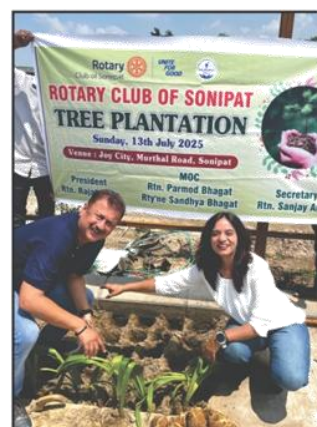

The Group Study Exchange (GSE) Program run by Rotary International from 1965 to 2013 was a Cultural and Vocational Exchange Initiative. It sent teams of 4 to 6 young professionals (aged 25 to 40, non-Rotarians) and a Rotary leader between paired Rotary District in different countries for 4 to 6 weeks. Participants engaged in vocational visits, cultural activities and Rotary meetings staying with host families to foster cross-cultural understanding and professional development. Funded partly by The Rotary Foundation, the program aimed to promote Goodwill, peace and leadership skills but was discontinued in 2013 due to financial, administrative and strategic shifts.

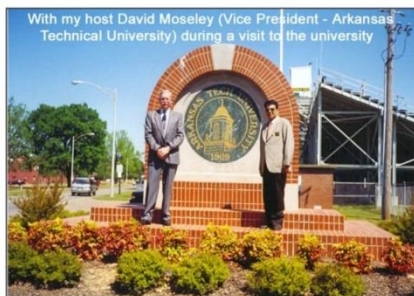
I too got an opportunity to lead a GSE Team to District 6170 of Arkansas, USA in 1993 for Non-Rotary young professionals selected from our District 3010 accompanied me and stayed with different families there in different cities in Arkansas.
