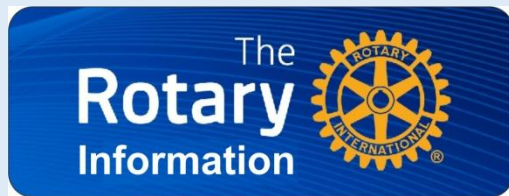

## ROTARY INFORMATION CORNER



### More updates on Amendments proposed and adopted in 2024 Council of Resolutions: -

1. To request the RI Board to consider recommending that presidents-elect complete the Club President Basics learning plan prior to attending PETS.
2. To request the RI Board to consider creating a status of 'club in formation' during the period preceding a new club's charter.
3. To request the RI Board to consider recommending that each district establish a District Council on Legislation committee.
4. To request the RI Board to consider implementing enhancements to the training for assistant governors.
5. To request the Trustees to consider modifying the (DDF) SHARE allocation ratio for district grants from 50:50 to 60:40.
6. To request the Trustees to consider allowing unused district grant funds to be used in funding the district grant of the subsequent year.
7. To request the Trustees to consider allowing district grants to support activities for up to three years instead of one.
8. To request the Trustees to consider reinstating the 100 percent match formerly offered by the World Fund for District Designated Funds used in global grants.
9. To request the Trustees to consider allocating recognition points for donations made to TRF's Endowment Fund.
10. To request the Trustees to consider establishing a Polio Plus Society.

### PROJECT NEED

Rotary District 3012 proudly announces the launch of "Atam Nirbhar," a transformative project aimed at empowering individuals in need with the gift of mobility. This initiative embodies Rotary's core principle of "Service Above Self" by providing prosthetic limbs to those who require them most.

We have taken up this challenge to reignite the will to live, to work, to fulfil their livelihoods of all those who are today in one way or the other – handicapped or are living with missing limb/s. We shall fill this void in their lives by providing them with specially tailored limbs, as per their need considering level of mobility required, their age etc.

We shall empower these people to not just walk or work – but to run and perform.

***The cost of each limb is Rs 7500/-. Donation will be done to Rotary Foundation. Interested people can contact Pres. Rtn. Dr. Gaurav Dembla.***

### PROJECT OFFERINGS

As a Rotary District 3012 project - we shall provide artificial limbs / prosthetics to needy. This will :

- ❖ Enhance the quality of life for individuals with disabilities by equipping them with prosthetic limbs. Foster independence and self-reliance amongst beneficiaries.
- ❖ Promote social inclusion and create opportunities for participation in daily activities.
- ❖ By restoring mobility, Atam Nirbhar will not only empower these individuals but will also strengthen our communities. Imagine a child returning to school, a parent regaining the ability to work, or an individual enjoying a newfound sense of freedom.

These are the stories we aim to create through this impactful project. We aim to serve minimum 1000 beneficiaries through this project. Jeevan Asha Hospital and Rehabilitation Centre shall be our partners in service in this project.

### PROCESS FLOW OF LIMB FITMENT UNDER THIS PROJECT

Under this project, we have taken a conscience decision of not just providing a limb but to ensure that the limbs adjust to the body's natural gait. This is done by post limb fitment therapy which can last from 3 to 20 days.

We shall follow the six steps procedure:

1. Patient Assessment
2. Casting
3. Pouring and Modification
4. Socket Fabrication and Alignment
5. Assembling and Alignment
6. Gait Training

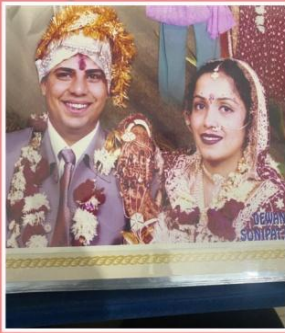
