



The Shabdkosh defines 'SAMANVYA' as the bringing together of diverse elements into an integrated and harmonious operation,'A Confluence of Excellence'.

One shaped our future with a steady hand, His reforms transforming our beloved land. The other painted stories brave and true, Through silver screen, perspectives fresh and new.


Though both have passed beyond our mortal sphere, Their legacy continues, crystal clear: In policies that lift the common man, In films that show us who we truly can.





Visionary Genesis (1914-1921) "In an era shadowed by impending conflict, Rotarians from Hamilton, Ontario, illuminated a path toward global concord.

Their prescient vision crystallized into a cornerstone of Rotary's constitution, heralding an enduring commitment to international harmony."

Peace- 1: "Pioneers of Peace - 1943: Chester Williams engages with high school students during an Institute of International Understanding event, exemplifying Rotary's early commitment to youth education in international relations."

Educational Renaissance (1934-1945) "The Institutes of International Understanding emerged as beacons of crosscultural dialogue, transforming nearly a thousand Rotary clubs into sanctuaries of diplomatic discourse. This educational metamorphosis culminated in Rotary's pivotal role at the United Nations' inception."

Philanthropic Evolution (1947-2002) "The Paul Harris Foundation Fellowships inaugurated an unprecedented era of peace through scholarship.


