
a traditional and festive touch to the gathering.

# Project Report: HUMF

**R**otary Club of Umbergaon organised the HUMF Project on 16th January 2026 at Ahirwas Anganwadi with the objective of improving maternal nutrition and supporting high-risk pregnancies in the community.

The project focused on identifying pregnant women who were underweight and categorized as high risk. In coordination with Anganwadi workers and healthcare staff, 14 such beneficiaries were identified. Each of them was provided with specially prepared ration kits containing essential nutritious food items to support a balanced diet during pregnancy.

In addition to the distribution of ration kits, awareness was created about the importance of proper nutrition, regular health check-ups, and prenatal care. Rotarians interacted with the beneficiaries and encouraged them to follow healthy dietary and hygiene practices for safer pregnancies and better maternal and child health outcomes.

The project was successfully executed with active participation from Rotary members and Anganwadi staff. The initiative had a positive impact on the beneficiaries and demonstrated Rotary Club of Umbergaon's continued commitment to maternal and child welfare and community development.





# Project Report: Ray of Hope (ROH)

**R**otary Club of Umbergaon organised the Ray of Hope (ROH) project on 16th January 2026 with the aim of addressing child malnutrition and promoting better health among underprivileged children. The project was conducted at two Anganwadi centres — Dehari and Ahirwas.

A total of 64 malnourished children were identified and benefited through this initiative, including 49 moderately malnourished and 15 severely malnourished children. The project focused on improving their nutritional intake and creating awareness about proper nutrition and health practices.

Rotary members coordinated with Anganwadi workers to identify the children in need and ensured effective implementation of the project. Nutritional support and essential supplements were distributed to the beneficiaries. Guidance was also provided to caregivers regarding balanced diets, hygiene, and child care practices to support long-term improvement in the children's health.

The project was successfully executed with active participation from Rotarians, Anganwadi staff, and community members. This initiative reinforced Rotary Club of Umbergaon's commitment to community service and its ongoing efforts to combat child malnutrition and support holistic child development.
