

Catching a Dream - 22 YEARS AROUND THE WORLD



The Zapp family—Herman, Candelaria, —embarked on an extraordinary journey in 2000, setting out from Argentina in a **1928 Graham-Paige automobile**.

What began as a six-month backpacking trip to Alaska evolved into a 22-year global adventure that spanned five continents and over 225,000 miles (362,000 km).

Throughout their travels, they visited 102 countries and welcomed four children into the world in various countries: Tehue in Argentina, Paloma in Canada, Wallaby in Australia, and Pampa in the United States. The family's vehicle, affectionately named "Macondo Cambalache," was a vintage car that they customized to accommodate their growing family. They added an extra row of seats, a rooftop tent, and a small kitchen at the back. Despite its age, the car proved to be reliable, requiring only eight sets of tires over the course of the journey and minimal engine work.

During their travels, the Zapps faced various challenges, including navigating the Amazon River in a makeshift raft and dealing with health issues like malaria. However, they also experienced profound moments of connection with people around the world, often staying with local families and immersing themselves in diverse cultures. They estimate having spent around 4,000 nights in the homes of strangers who became friends.

In March 2022, the Zapp family returned to Buenos Aires, completing their remarkable journey. Reflecting on their adventure, Herman noted, "What will come now? Thousands of changes, thousands of options," expressing a sense of fulfillment and anticipation for the future. Candelaria shared that the most significant discovery of their travels was the kindness and generosity of people they met along the way.

Their story has inspired many and was documented in their **book** *Catching a Dream*, which has sold approximately 100,000 copies and remains a testament to their adventurous spirit and the universal desire to connect with others.
